Bronze, silver and gold awards are available to those church communities who show that they are working to lessen their environmental impact. This is a topic at the top of many agendas at the moment, indeed people are increasingly coming to believe that action is essential for the long-term future of our world. The stewardship of God's creation has always been a concern of Christians and now particularly seems a time when we should show that we are definitely doing something about this

The PCC of Holy Cross Church has decided to join the Eco Church scheme, which starts with the fillingin of a questionnaire to assess the current situation. That has not put us off as there are a lot of small steps that we can take to start us off that will not be difficult or expensive, such as using environmentally friendly cleaning materials and picking up litter in our area. We will be encouraging our church members to consider whether they can make any changes in their lives and hope to be an example of how everyone can help to make our world a better place locally, nationally and internationally

# Luckington's Secret Spymaster

On Friday 22 November, from 5.30pm until 7.30pm at Luckington School, there will be a free talk on the life of Major-General Sir Stewart Menzies KCB, KCMG, DSO, MC.

Sir Stewart was Head of the British Secret Intelligence Service (MI6) from 1939 to 1952. As such, he was spymaster to Winston Churchill, keeper of the 'Ultra Secret' and overseer of all sorts of intelligence triumphs (and tragedies). He was also a Luckington resident and his ashes now rest beneath an unassuming marker in the churchyard. He led an incredible life and had a major role in the Allies victory in WW2, yet it was owing to the requirement to remain secret that his contribution has been understated. That said, Sir Stewart has a few claims on popular culture; being credited with Ian Flemming's inspiration for James Bond's Chief 'M', John le Carré's 'Control' and being played by Mark Strong in the Oscar-winning film 'The Imitation Game'.

The planned talk will cover some of the most defining aspects of his life and work (within the bounds of the unclassified!). Co-presenting the event will be Mr Rupert Bell, famous in his own right as an accomplished broadcaster but also one of Sir Stewart's grandsons. He will speak on his own memories of his secretive grandfather and answer questions from the floor.

All are welcome to this free event. Tickets need to be reserved online.



# Meet the new lead at Luckington Pre-School

Leanne Brown set down a tray of polished conkers on the table, each inscribed with letters and numbers. 'The children collected these on our weekly Forest School day, where we tramp around in the mud and leaves, and discover fun things together,' she said. 'We turned the spiky shells into hedgehogs, and now the nuts can be used for counting – or rolling or swapping or whatever they want!'

Every day, Leanne and her team tee up a series of these provocations in response to signals they have seen in a child's pattern of interests. The child will then have the opportunity to reignite that spark and explore further – or equally move on to something else. 'Being smaller than other pre-schools, we pride ourselves in being very child-centric. We let the children take the lead whenever possible,' she added. 'We plan in the moment, recognising that each child's learning journey is unique.'

Leanne was a parent at the school, before joining as a practitioner, so she has stood on both sides of the fence. 'It's hard to describe. There's an enchanted feel to Luckington. I count myself as extremely fortunate, because the pre-school came with a very strong local reputation and also some beautiful Montessori resources, which the children absolutely cherish. Our close ties with the big school are a real point of difference too. Not many pre-schools can offer such a smooth continuation.'

David Cook, headteacher at the primary school, believes the pre-school will go from strength to strength.





'Luckington Pre-School has been an important part of our community for many, many years,' he said. 'It is now in a new and exciting phase and we look forward to continuing to work together to ensure our children get the best start in their education.'

Leanne laid out four twigs to form a noughts-andcrosses grid. 'Our aim is to nurture each child's unique sense of curiosity, ensuring that their early years' journey is the catalyst for a life-long love of learning,' she said. 'When children develop the confidence to question and explore, they are better equipped for learning later in life. This is fundamental to how our approach works.'





Nevertheless, by mathematical analysis and modern technology (and a certain amount of good luck), the Allies devised techniques for 'breaking' Enigma ciphers, and thus read several million German messages, providing a wealth of reliable Intelligence.

After the presentation, the audience are invited to take part in a hands-on practical demonstration of one of the few surviving Enigma machines. Only about 300 are known to survive worldwide; of these, only about a dozen are in public collections in Britain.
