Sherston School celebrates National Lottery funding



Sherston Primary School is thrilled to announce that it has been awarded a Lottery Grant of nearly £10,000 for an Outdoor Classroom and Sheltered Community Space. The awarded funding, which the school applied for earlier this year, will be used to build an all-weather five-metre gazebo structure on the school field. Not only will this serve as an outdoor classroom, but also as a venue that local community groups can apply to use outside school hours. In addition to the National Lottery funding, the project will be supported by the Friends of Sherston School (FSS). The FSS raised a massive £1,065 contribution towards planning fees and installation through donations to the 'Fab Family Show' event, an annual performance written and performed by parents which was delivered virtually for the first time during lockdown. Thank you to everyone who donated.

Full planning permission was secured on 30 September and building is due to start this month. Even before COVID-19, the school was fully focused on the importance of outdoor learning and creating outdoor social and recreational settings. Now, with the challenges of COVID-19, the need for safe outside social spaces has become even more important so this building comes at just the right time.

Community groups that have expressed an interest in leasing this space outside school hours are the Carers Support Group run by Sherston Surgery, Sherston Senior Club, Sherston Choir, Sherston Brownies, Baby Toddler and Pre-school Group, Forest School and Pumpkins Preschool.

'We're delighted that The National Lottery Community Fund has recognised the importance of this building as a teaching, learning and community space,' says Head Teacher, Mrs Leyden. 'This gazebo will improve a space that matters very much to the community and this would not have been possible without this funding. The school would like to thank all the community groups involved and the Friends of Sherston School for supporting this initiative.'

Once the outdoor classroom is built and COVID-19 restrictions have been lifted, Sherston Community groups will be able to apply to use the space outside school hours. Please contact the school if you would like more information.

Sherston Community Choir: Singing like nobody is listening!

Like many other organisations, Sherston Community choir (SHoCC) has had to adapt rapidly to the coronavirus situation. Early on in the pandemic, choral singing was identified as a particular risk, with people sitting near to each other and singing potentially creating more aerosol. Several choirs abroad had severe outbreaks, and sadly some deaths.

A couple of weeks into lockdown, we did as many others did and turned to Zoom. Thanks to the hard work of Trudi, our musical director, Brian Cook, accompanist, and Alan Heatherington who has produced may of our arrangements and backing tracks, we found a way of making it work, all singing along in the comfort of our own homes with nobody else listening, except the occasional family member.

We had hoped to start 'live' rehearsals in September, and had been planning accordingly, but the introduction of 'The Rule of Six' and the logistics of making the room safe with adequate spacing mean that regretfully we have delayed start until at least January.

In the meantime, we are having a monthly Zoom singalong to songs we know well. Just as we had a virtual



Tracklements raises money to support Sherston School

During late August and September, the community of Sherston busily collected crabapples for Tracklements to turn into English Crabapple Jelly.

Sherston School's pupils and their families, as well as Sherston's Scouts, Cubs, Beavers, Guides and Brownies, were all encouraged to get out and about to collect these 'wild' apples that are found in hedgerows and nestled amongst other trees.

Thanks to this year's warm weather, more than 1,000kg of crabapples were picked and transformed into delicious jars of jelly which are available to buy now.

For every kilogram of apples picked and for every jar sold nationwide, Tracklements donate money to the community and, recently, their Managing Director, Guy Tullberg, presented a cheque to Sherston Primary School for £782.50 for last year's project.

Afterwards, Mr Tullberg said, 'We're immensely proud to have helped raise this money for Sherston School. The project has been running for 20 years and helps demonstrate to the schoolchildren the



provenance of their food by teaching them about the great British tradition of making preserves.'

Mrs Sue Leyden, the school's headteacher said, 'Not only has the school benefited from this project, but the children and their families have had great fun exploring the local countryside hunting for crabapples, as well as learning about a local industry.'



Sherston WI is 80 years old



It was in 1940 that a preliminary meeting was held in the front room of the vicarage for the purpose of forming a Women's Institute in the village. The first meeting was held on Thursday 3 October in the Rifle Range (Village Hall) at 2.30pm with Mrs Thomas as the first President. There were 42 members and 12 on the committee. Mrs West was elected Secretary, Mrs Jobbins Treasurer and Mrs Vining and Mrs R Rice were elected Vice Presidents. (Are there relations of these ladies living in Sherston now?) Anyone could join the WI at 16 and our longest-serving member, Shirley Freeth joined at 17 - originally joining Charlton WI where her mother was President and coming to Sherston having married her farmer husband, David.

The first few talks taken from the early programmes were on subjects such as wartime cookery, loose covers, folk dancing, fruit bottling and smocking and dressmaking hints. These were the early years of the Second World War.

Over the years our members have taken part in many

carnivals, summer shows, produce shows, table top sales, etc and there are photographs in the scrapbooks to recall the 'good old days'!

We had organised a celebration lunch for this year but due to the various Covid-19 restrictions this was cancelled and pencilled in for 2021. However, each member was given a 'Meeting in a Bag' - the bags were all made by a committee member and filled with various small items, including a pre-decimal coin quiz and a packet of sunflower seeds ready for a competition next summer.

The committee has been holding monthly Zoom meetings and/or garden meetings, but unfortunately it has not been possible since March to gather in the village hall for our usual monthly meetings with a speaker and it is likely to be 2021 before we are safely able to do so under today's restrictions.

In the meantime, we are keeping in touch with all members with a regular newsletter and recognising birthdays.

Sherston Community Orchard

Ever thought it would be great to have a community orchard located somewhere in the village? A place to enjoy the spring blossom, the summer shade and pick the autumn fruits? Well, there's a joint proposal being worked on by Sustainable Sherston (the local environment group) and the Village Hall Committee. The committee felt that the Village Hall Field was a very much underused community asset. Apart from the very occasional SherstonFest/Big Picnic or private wedding, not much happens there, apart from a lot of grass mowing.

Working with Sustainable Sherston, the proposal is to plant a community orchard (mainly apples, pears, cherry, apricot, blackcurrant, hazel, blackthorn

for sloes, crab apples) on a small strip of the Village Hall Field; underneath will be space for wild flowers so the mowing regime will change to accommodate that. There will also be space for bench seats so that people can enjoy the view (apparently the churchyard has run out of space for commemorative seats so this could provide an alternative location). The other main reason for doing this is that we will be planting 60 new tress and about 40 shrubs in the village, which will play their part in reducing CO₂ in the atmosphere. The proposal will still allow ample space for the big, occasional events that take place there. Funding will be sought from the Area Board for the trees themselves and a group of volunteers will do the planting in the

spring.

The proposal has the backing of Sustainable Sherston, the Village Hall Committee and Sherston Parish Council. North Wiltshire Villages Flower Club

Sadly, the Flower Club has been unable to meet in person since February, and made the decision over the summer that all future events planned for 2020 would have to be cancelled. The recent resurgence of the virus and increase in restrictions has reinforced this as the right decision. Nevertheless, behind the scenes, work has continued on planning future events for 2021 and beyond, the committee has 'met', and several newsletters have been sent out to keep in touch with members. Our AGM was successfully held in September via Zoom and was followed by video demonstrations by one of our members which featured non-foam designs using seasonal flowers, berries and foliage.

We still hope to actively re-start the Club from January 2021 since a full programme of events for next year has already been arranged, incorporating several originally planned for this year. However, we are conscious that the recent tightening of restrictions may well prevent this happening so soon and could result in further cancellations of planned events. The good news however is that the club remains in a very

strong position financially and continues to have an active committee, so we will weather this storm. As soon as external factors allow us to re-start, we will.

The programme planned for 2021 is very varied and includes a good mix of workshops, demonstrations, social events and visits. Meetings would normally take place at Crudwell Village Hall, SN16 9HB, on the third Wednesday of the month, 7.00pm for 7.30pm (with some exceptions for social events/visits as outlined in our programme). We are a friendly and enthusiastic group with members from throughout the area. Visitors and potential new members are guaranteed a warm welcome at our regular meetings. We really look forward to welcoming back both our current members and any guests as soon as we can, hopefully at the meeting currently planned for Wednesday 20 January 2021 (regulations permitting).

Covid 19: Update

The current situation has changed very little here since the easement of lockdown in July. Dispensary is still open with reduced hours and social distancing: 10.00am—1.00pm and 3.00pm-6.00pm.

Ordering is undertaken as usual by repeat prescription request slip, or ordering online. You will be sent a text or have a phone call when your prescription is ready to collect.

We are delighted to have a new driver, Clare, who is delivering medications to homes where patients or their relatives/carers cannot collect from us.

We continue with total triage – any request for an appointment with a GP is dealt with by phone initially, and directed appropriately to the right service, be that a community pharmacist, community physio, nursing services or a GP.

However, we continue to see any patients urgent or routine, who need a face-to-face appointment following screening.

Please do not attend the surgery if you have any symptoms of Covid 19 – please check the NHS 111 advice line if you are unsure .

Doctorlink

There has been a national introduction of Doctorlink to try to ease pressures on general practice and minor injury/emergency care.

It is an app that you download on smartphone or computer that can check your symptoms and advise the best route of action. It is quite comprehensive and links into our clinical system, to notify us if you have used the algorithm and need a triage appointment. Sherston Old School Community Interest Company: Annual report and notification of cancellation of AGM

As many of you will be aware, the Sherston Old School Community Interest Company (SOSCIC) was formed in 2010 for the purpose of renovating and converting the Old School premises so as to provide increased employment opportunities and additional services for the community and to help preserve the character of the High Street. This was in response to the decision by the Parish Council to purchase the Old School premises when they fell vacant. This is an entirely voluntary run organisation with currently over 260 members – all of whom are residents of the village. Everyone who lives in the village is entitled to become a member of SOSCIC without the need to purchase any shares or make a financial contribution. It is managed by five directors who have responsibility for the ongoing management of the project.

The Parish Council completed the purchase of the Old School in April 2011 at which time a long lease was granted to SOSCIC. Restoration work started almost immediately and by November 2011 the first phase was ready for occupation. The first tenants being Sherston Post Office & Stores. The second phase took a further six months to complete, providing space for an additional five small businesses, and, within a relatively short period of time, was fully let.

We are pleased to report that the Old School premises have been fully let for most of the last nine-and-a-half years. There is currently one small unit empty (formerly occupied by Balcony House Cellars) but we are actively seeking a new occupier for this unit and are hopeful that it will not remain empty for very long. The Old School premises provide employment for more than 30 people in the village.

The last 12 months have been difficult for everyone because of COVID-19 – not least for those trying to run a business.

The Midcounties Coop and Post Office has remained open throughout the pandemic and has provided the village with various essential services for which we are extremely grateful. We would like to thank Anthony and his team for all their efforts and for helping us to keep safe by having such a brilliant facility on our doorstep.

All our other occupiers had to close their businesses for a few months during the lockdown period and, as a 'not for profit' Community Interest Company, SOSCIC was able to provide some financial assistance during this period. Whilst this obviously had an impact on our finances, the SOSCIC Board felt it essential that we should do what we could to assist each of these businesses to survive and to reopen as soon as possible. In addition, to enable all of these businesses to reopen as soon as practicable, SOSCIC paid for the installation of hand sanitisers and warning signage throughout the building and introduced a daily cleaning regime for the

public areas. We are pleased to report that at this point in time all of these businesses have reopened. The cost of these actions is of course reflected in our accounts.

Having been virtually fully let since 2013, we are in the happy position to report that our finances are currently in good shape. A copy of our annual accounts (and indeed all previous years since 2011) can be seen on the www.sherston.org website.

The Board has from the outset been mindful of the need to safeguard this important community asset over the long term and hence to create a financial buffer sufficient to cover the cost of any major repairs and/or allowing for any significant vacancies. To this end, two mechanisms have been created as follows.

Firstly, SOSCIC maintains a cash buffer of around £45k to cover the need for large-scale repairs (eg to the roof). Secondly, to provide security for any significant periods when some of the units might lie vacant, the Board decided some years ago to pay accelerated rent to the Parish Council. We have for your information now paid six years of accelerated rent (totalling £72,000). This is considered by the Board to be sufficient to cover us for the foreseeable future. As a result, the Board took the decision a couple of years back to start making financial donations to the Parish Council to be used for 'local' good causes. To date, SOSCIC has donated £10,000 to the Parish Council which we are advised has been used to fund improvements to the Village Hall, the pre-school facility and the recreation ground. A further £5,000 will shortly be donated to the Parish Council. We had hoped to be able to donate more than this amount but, as noted above, some additional unexpected costs have had to be borne this financial year.

In addition to the above, the time has come for us to spend some money on refurbishing the exterior of the Old School premises – it being nearly 10 years since the work was completed. Arrangements are currently being made to repaint the exterior where necessary. This will involve placing scaffolding around the building. It is hoped that this work will be completed by April 2021 – the 10th Anniversary since the building was purchased! Some of our reserves will be used for that purpose.

I would personally like to thank my co-directors (Geoff Martin, Richard Hulme, Jonathan Gould, Huw Bowles) and our caretaker (Nic Fisher) for all of their hard work over the last year – all of which of course is entirely voluntary. Jonathan and Nic in particular have to bear the brunt of the day-to-day problems (including lightning strikes) and do it without complaint. I would also like to thank our cleaner Vicky Saucedo who stepped up immediately when the COVID-19 problem hit. She is doing a brilliant job keeping everyone safe.



SOSCIC AGM

We normally hold our Annual General Meeting once every year in November in the British School Room. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic we have decided that, on balance, it will not be safe or sensible to try and do that this year. We have decided instead to hold a closed Board Meeting on Monday 16 November at which we will discuss any matters raised by our occupiers or members following the publication of this report in the Cliffhanger and online. We would invite any of our members to contact Geoff Martin or Huw Bowles (contact details below) to ask any questions or raise any matters that they consider should be aired. We will consider any/all matters raised and will report back on all such matters in the next published Cliffhanger and online.

As noted above, SOSCIC is run by five directors – each of whom is elected for a period of four years. This year Huw Bowles is due to retire by rotation. Huw has kindly indicated that he is willing to stand for a further term.

Re-election is by ordinary resolution of the members, a process normally carried out at the AGM. This year, we propose that the Board, as members themselves, be empowered to make the decision on behalf of the members generally. Please make any comments you may have about Huw's re-election known to Geoff Martin (contact details below) before 16 November.

As mentioned above, everyone who lives in the village (the Parish) is entitled to be a member of SOSCIC. Not many people who have moved into the village since 2010 have actually joined and indeed many may not even know of our existence. Should you wish to become a member and have an influence on how the company is run then we would invite you to join by contacting our Membership Secretary Huw Bowles (contact details below).

Finally, given that it will be the 10th anniversary of the purchase of the Old School on 1 April 2021, we were wondering if anyone had any ideas how best we might celebrate the event – if we are allowed to do so under whatever COVID restrictions there are at the time. Any suggestions gratefully received.

So once again an enormous thank you to everyone who has contributed this year, it has made a treasurer's job an awful lot easier and means we can start 2021 in a strong financial position so we can begin to implement all the plans we had had for 2020.


