# Sherston Life book launch and exhibition





## Maintaining your trees, bushes and shrubs



Did you know that it is your responsibility to ensure that highways and public rights of way are kept clear if you have trees, bushes or shrubs overhanging them? I certainly didn't! Of even more of a surprise was when I learnt that the Council can approach you directly to ask that you 'cut back' any foliage causing an obstruction and, on rare occasions, if this does not happen, the Council has the ability to undertake the works and bill you directly for the costs.

This is where the Parish Council may be able to help a little! If you are in this situation and are struggling to engage a contractor to undertake any works, we will shortly have a Parish Council maintenance person who could possibly help out, although this would be at a small cost. Please do contact clerk@sherston.pc.org if you would like to discuss any requirements.

# The Tolsey Surgery Dispensary – An important update



The last two years have had an unprecedented negative effect upon the ability of dispensing practices to efficiently provide medication to their patients. Challenges resulting from the pandemic, Brexit and countrywide issues with supply chains have led to many patients choosing to source their medications from elsewhere. The Tolsey, like many rural practices, relies upon the dispensary to generate the income that pays for staff wages and enables us to have a GP surgery in such a small community. We are now facing a situation where our very existence is potentially at threat.

We want to provide the best possible service for our patients. We know that our service has not always been to the standard we expect of ourselves during this difficult time. We understand why sometimes our patients have been upset when some of their medications have arrived but others are out of stock nationwide or have been delayed. The pandemic has been a testing time for so many people and undoubtedly has had a negative effect upon everyone's wellbeing. We have long been proud of the fact that, unlike other surgeries, our staff have always been treated with respect and friendliness by their local community. Unfortunately, over the last few months we have seen a change, and our staff have been exposed to increasing amounts of verbal abuse and aggression. It has had a negative impact on staff morale and we have lost three members of staff as a result. The loss of staff has resulted in further delays in ensuring all the prescriptions are ready to collect. Recruiting new staff has also been challenging during the pandemic.

#### What are we doing to try and improve the situation?

- Our staff continue to work very hard every day to try to help our patients. We recently changed our supplier to Alliance Healthcare. It is one of the nation's biggest suppliers and supply to Boots the chemist. We are hoping that this will result in a more predictable availability of stock.
- We are looking to appoint a new dedicated Dispensary Manager.
- We are also actively recruiting to try to further strengthen our dispensing team.
- Our dispensers have been coming in at weekends to try to catch up and prepare any delayed prescriptions.
- We have started a home-delivery service for patients with no transport or family in the area and are unable to collect prescriptions. Although in its infancy, this is something that we would look to expand in the future if possible and practical.

#### What can our patients do?

Put simply, we rely on all our dispensing patients to get their prescriptions from us. We appreciate that this is not always possible as many working people struggle to get to the surgery when we are open. However, did you know that you can ask someone else to collect a prescription for you?

We are very grateful for those patients who have stood by us during this difficult time. We also hope that those who might have gone elsewhere would consider giving us another try. We need the dispensary to run successfully to keep the surgery doors open.

## Sherston Footpath Group Update



We have been a little quiet in recent months which is fairly typical for this time of year, as we are heavily reliant on our local farming community who have all been hard at work harvesting and getting ready for the winter. That said, work has not stopped. We have continued to undertake small bits of maintenance where we can, ie cutting back brambles, replacing the odd sign, with a lot of time having been taken up logging in excess of 25 issues with footpaths on the MyWilts Council site. Don't forget you can also do this yourselves by logging onto the MyWilts site either on the internet at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/ mywilts-online-reporting or using the MyWilts App.

In the background, our main focus has been on forward planning for when resources are available to help with the bigger pieces of work. So, what can you expect to see in the coming months?

As part of our plan to regenerate Grove Wood, the Cotswolds Wardens have kindly offered to replace the steps at the Stretchline end of Grove Wood, pretty much in the same way as we did last year at the Luckington end. As well as this, they will be shoring up the path where it is falling away at the top of the woods.

In January, we will be looking to undertake the second phase of coppicing in Grove Wood (four phases are planned in total). This coppicing will allow light to flood into the floor of the wood allowing the underlying flora and fauna to flourish, as well as providing wildlife corridors for some of its smaller inhabitants.

We will be replacing two 'heritage' wooden footpath signs which have deteriorated in recent years to the point they are illegible – one at the bottom of Brook Hill and one on the way down to Forlorn Bridge.

We will be working with Wiltshire Council to shore up the lower footpath along the river, which in some places is collapsing into the river itself.

#### What can you do to help?

Whilst it seems a small ask, it really would help if, when you are walking on the public rights of way, you could report any issues you observe with surfaces, stiles, signage and general access to Wiltshire Council. This would massively take the pressure off our small team, and help us keep on top of maintaining our footpath network - cheekily ... if when you are out and about, you do see the odd bramble or branch obstructing your path, why not lop it off!

Where we would love some help would be four or five volunteers to help with the planned coppicing activity in January – not actually undertaking the coppicing itself, more helping with clearing the cuttings and building the wildlife corridors, which really just means stacking up the cuttings. You would be amazed at what can be achieved in three or four hours. If you are keen to help, please contact Nigel Freeth: Nigel.Freeth@sherston.org.uk

In summary, we are really pleased with the progress we are making, although we do still have some challenges with walkers straying off the Public Rights of Way in a number of locations around the village. We are hoping that, with improved signage, this number will continue to reduce, although we do have a very small number of die-hard walkers who seem to continue knowingly to walk off the paths (trespass) and, regrettably, in recent months, we even had one incident that resulted in the police being involved after a landowner ended up on the floor, having asked a walker to return to the public footpath. Thankfully, this was a one-off. However, such incidents do make it problematic for us as we are hoping to work with local landowners at some point in the future to try to expand our footpath network.

If you are unsure of where you can/cannot walk, you can access the full footpath network on the internet via www.wiltscouncil.maps.arcgis.com. If you fancy more of an informed circular walk, we do have some wonderful circular walks available around the village which can be found either by purchasing a walks booklet from the Co-op at a cost of £10 or directly downloading from the Parish Council Website.

## Sustainable Sustaina Sherston: Thermal camera





Earlier this year, Sustainable Sherston bought a FLIR C5 thermal camera with a grant from WCC Area Board. Now that temperatures are dropping, and especially with rocketing heating costs, now is the time to survey your house to find and eliminate those draughts and cold spots. It is extremely simple to use, just like a normal digital camera, and the thermal images are extremely intuitive to interpret. Many of the areas of heat loss can be relatively simply and cheaply fixed with additional insulation, draught excluder, etc. I can also offer advice if required. A professional survey costs typically £400, but you can rent our thermal camera for just £10 for two days.


#### Celebrating Friendship Week
















#### FSS Quiz Night thank you!


