

## Sherston Senior Club

On 13 August, Sherston Senior Club had a Mystery Trip. This was over the Severn Bridge and through the Wye Valley to Gloucester. We stopped at Gloucester Quay Shopping Centre for a welcome cup of tea and cake and then had a browse around. Some even went to the docks and visited the cathedral. It was a very enjoyable afternoon with lots of information from Colin the coach driver.

On 27 August, speaker Nigel Venning told us about changes in Asia in the last 25 years. This covered the Scale of Asia, the Power of Asia, the old and the new, and different cultures and their habits. Nigel was a very good speaker and explained how Asian peoples were on the up. The urban population of Asia Pacific is set to be the largest growing population by 2050, with Africa coming second, Latin America third, Europe fourth and North America with the least growth. In the Power of Asia, Asia was the envy of Europe in the 17th century. The world is about to turn full circle, Asian economies will be larger than the rest of the world combined in 2020 for the first time since the 19th century. He touched on education and the future and the massive challenges of an ageing population and low birth rates. Nigel also discussed the different peoples of North Asia, China, Japan, Korea, (South), SE Asia, Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Singapore, Malaysia and Indonesia, South Asia, India, Bangladesh, Pakistan, their cuisines, buildings and cultural heritage. It was such an interesting talk that our members had a lot of questions and did not want it to end.

On 10 September, Hortico gave a talk on the Science of Growing Plants, and, on 24 September, it was our Harvest Auction where funds were raised for the Sisters of the Church in Bristol who do such good work for the homeless and needy. More on both of these this next time.

## Surviving Winter

I understand that the summer may not have lived up to its name this year, but we are now facing the winter season, like it or not! Winter is a tough time and keeping warm is essential to help maintain good health. Every year, 300 people in Wiltshire die of cold or cold-related illnesses, and hundreds more struggle to keep warm. With this in mind, Wiltshire Community Foundation organise a scheme called Surviving Winter. They basically re-distribute donations and 'unwanted' winter fuel payments, which are given as part of the State Pension Scheme to those in need. Last year the scheme helped over 30 households in the Malmesbury area alone to keep warm over the colder months.

How can you help?

The scheme relies on donations from individuals into the fund. If you feel it is something that you would like to do, please get in touch with me or the Foundation on 01380 729284 or check the website www.wiltshirecf.org.uk. If you are a tax payer, Gift Aid can be added to your donation, boosting the value that the Foundation can disperse at no cost to yourself! You could be saving a life this winter!

Are you worried about the cost of keeping warm this winter?

Could you benefit from a grant from this scheme? As I write this, the criteria for applications have not been confirmed, but if you are in receipt of Universal Credit or Pension Credit and have a disability which you receive PIP, Disability Living Allowance or Attendance Allowance, get in touch with me so that we can check if you may be entitled to apply for a grant. The process is very simple and I will do the forms with you.

One recipient explained: 'The grant really helped me as it was my first winter on one income following the death of my husband and I was worried about bills and staying warm.'

Please do get in touch if you feel you can help or if you need help. Remember, all conversations are in confidence.

As ever, I am around for general help and support on a wide variety of issues, including transport, mobility, safety around the home and reducing the feeling of loneliness. Give me a call on 07557 922020 and leave a message. I will get back to you as soon as possible.

Paula has given up an academic career to become a volunteer with CLIC Sargent. You may remember that the name of Sir Malcolm Sargent became involved with children with cancer when in 1968 a charity was formed in lasting memory of him by Dame Sylvia Darley OBE. In 1976 the late Bob Woodward began the Cancer and Leukaemia in Childhood (CLIC) charity in the West Country in memory of his son Robert and, in 2005, the two charities merged to create CLIC Sargent. This is the leading charity for children with cancer in the country. There are just 19 specialist centres in the UK that help young cancer sufferers and their families but this often entails travelling long distances. There is no government funding so fundraising is essential.

In early October, Sherston WI members will be celebrating the Institute's 79th birthday with a meal at the Horse Guards pub in Brokenborough.

After that, meetings revert to the afternoon over the winter, when they meet in the British School Room at 2.30pm.

## WEA Course on The Aeneid

We are delighted to confirm that Tim Hammond will be back in the British School Room, Sherston, on Friday 8 November to present a course on Virgil's Aeneid for the WEA.

This course is an introduction to Virgil's Aeneid, his epic poem about the mythical Aeneas, the refugee from Troy who founds Rome. The course is suitable for anyone with an interest in literature and history. Written during the reign of the emperor Augustus, it has been translated many times and served subsequently as the basis for countless works of Western art. Each session will take the form of a survey of a part of the poem's content (its story, characters, themes, etc) and its context, the relationship of the work to the world around it, historical events, key ideas and other works of art. The course will put the poem in its Roman context but will also be concerned about how the poem has been understood in different times and places down to the present day.

The course will run at the British School Room from 10.00am to 12.15pm on six Fridays between 8 November and 13 December. The cost of the course is £60. ## Science in action with Year 4

'Our role as buddies is to look after them and be role models. We make sure they're not worried or scared and just look after them.' Henrietta, Year 5





Undefeated by the weather and full of pancakes and bacon, it was back out again on Sunday to complete the round of activities.


Everyone went home tired, but dried out, and saying it was one of the best camps we had ever done.






