Imagine if a dog could detect an illness well before one had any idea there was a problem and reduce the need for intrusive, unpleasant and expensive diagnostic tests? This is what the WI learnt about from the talk with slides given by Danielle Mills at our November meeting. For over 10 years now, Medical Detection Dogs has been training dogs to do just that - to save lives using their amazing sense of smell. Using the power of their nose, these assistance dogs can be trained to detect even the faintest changes in the smell of their human partner. The dogs (mainly labradors, retrievers and spaniels but some smaller breeds too) support people, particularly youngsters, with complex health conditions when they are in danger of having a potentially life-threatening medical emergency so they can take the necessary action and prevent hospital admission. (Dogs are now being trained to detect Covid-19.) Read more about these incredible dogs on www.medicaldetectiondogs.org.uk

# Sherston Senior Club

Our 'Show and Tell' afternoon went very well. We had stories about an escape from Russia with only a marble egg and the clothes the nanny stood up in; the last pewterer in Bristol with samples of his work; and a replica Sten gun as used in the film with Virginia Mckenna playing Violette Szarbo, the World War Two heroine

We also heard about life in Hankerton before and during the war: how a Chinese cloisonné vase was made; a seal with initial D found in a charity shop for one shilling and sixpence; a Davy lamp as used in the mines in the Forest of Dean; a silk elephant from Bangkok; a poem re old age; an order of music programme presented to the Prince and Princess of Wales on their visit to Wrexham in 1903 (we were privileged to see the Princess's personal copy); and finally, and, finally, a tiny teddy who had a new set of fur from Mrs Vining's fur coat!

Our next meeting speaker was Tricia Lawrence whose talk was 'Where there's land, there is hope'. This was about the help that Send a Cow has been able to give to Africa. In the following countries, Burundi, Ethiopia, Kenya, Rwanda Uganda and Zambia, thousands of rural communities have been helped to become independent and raise their own food. Initially, this was started by a group of farmers in Somerset by sending a cow in calf. When BSE struck this was no longer viable so donations were used to buy cattle in Africa and so it continues today.

A mild, cloudy November day saw nearly 800 people congregate in Church Street for Sherston's Remembrance Service while the bells of Holy Cross Church rang half-muffled. We welcomed back soldiers from 90 Sqn 9 Regt RLC and service personnel from the RAF and other Army Corps. It was especially good to greet 70 members of the Sherston uniformed youth organisations who marched, on their own this year, from the Scout Hut.

The Reverend Susan Harvey opened the service and spoke about the Armed Forces' commitment to our national way of life at home and abroad. Prayers were said and the wreaths were laid, while the Sherston Community Choir sang 'Be Still my Soul' unaccompanied. Following the two minutes' silence, Group Captain Nick Gatenby RAF delivered the Exhortation and Lieutenant Colonel George Clarke T D recited the names of the men of Easton Grey from the Great War. Martha Smee read the names of Sherston fallen in all conflicts. As usual the Kohima Epitaph was delivered by a junior soldier, Private Daniel Abankwa, from Buckley Barracks.

Prayers, readings and hymns followed where Susan Harvey was assisted by Revd Andrew Williams-Tarling (Congregational Church) and Revd Janet Evans (Methodist Church). During the singing of 'Oh God our Help in Ages Past', £1,032 was collected for the Poppy Fund. The service was concluded by a fulsome rendering of the National Anthem by those attending.



'Ambition, as if you are not ambitious you will not achieve your goals. Curiosity, as if you are not curious you are not discovering new things.' Maddie


'Respect, as you need to respect everything — not just people but nature and objects. For example, you need to respect other people's belongings.' Freya

# Make your Christmas tree count this Christmas, make it a Refutree!

A Bristol charity supporting displaced people has launched its annual 'Refutree' campaign – where you can buy top-quality Christmas trees, delivered to your door, and 100% of the profits goes to helping people who have arrived in Bristol to start a new life, often with literally just the clothes on their back.

The charity is Aid Box Community (ABC) and over the last few years it has grown to be the largest independent retailer of Christmas trees in Bristol - not least because it only supplies top-quality Nordman Fir, (low drop) trees at great prices but also (to butcher a phrase) because a Refutree is not just for Christmas, as it allows ABC to give hope and love and support for the whole year.

Which is just as well because, as you can imagine, the influx of people fleeing for their lives has put a strain on all the people trying to help, and that, combined with the impact of the pandemic putting a halt on normal fundraising, means your Christmas tree can make a really big difference this year.
