Community Speed Watch for Sherston

Some years ago, there was a Community Speed Watch (CSW) scheme in Sherston. However, the group lost enthusiasm, due to the lack of interest from the police in the data that was collected. Now, after lots of pressure on the new Police and Crime Commissioner from your local Wiltshire Councillor and others, the police have been persuaded to take the issue of speeding through our communities more seriously. This includes resourcing more Traffic Management Officers and supporting CSW schemes. There is going to be a relaunch of the CSW schemes across Wiltshire from 1 June; if I can get some volunteers to help out with this, I would like to set one up in Sherston. As a volunteer, it will involve an hour or two of online training and then an hour or two every now and then tracking the speed of traffic at key points in the village. Lorry Watch for Sherston

There have been a number of complaints from residents about the excessive size and number of lorries using the weight-restricted roads in Sherston, such as Sandpits Lane, Green Lane and Noble Street. These roads are limited to vehicles under 7.5 tonnes. There is something we can do about this, as a community. We can set up a Lorry Watch scheme, which requires a number of volunteers to report sightings of vehicles they suspect of infringing a weight limit to Wiltshire Police, who then identify the vehicle's operator and issue a warning. If vehicles receive multiple warnings, Trading Standards investigates and may instigate prosecutions. So, we need a few volunteers willing to spend an hour every so often watching for lorries, and a coordinator to liaise with Wiltshire Police. Christian Aid Week: 15-21 May – Hungry for Justice Door-to-door collection

People from the parishes of the Gauzebrook Group, including Holy Cross Sherston, will once again be collecting door to door during Christian Aid Week (CAW). Last year, as a group, we raised over £3,000 and it is this level of generosity from our communities that encourages us to keep going each year

It seems there are more calls than ever for us to help people all over the world whose lives are being disrupted by events outside their control. Only a few months ago, starvation caused by political changes and drought was being reported in Afghanistan. Currently, the war in Ukraine is in the news daily and has such an immediate impact because it seems so close to us. In the experience of people in Ukraine, we can see events that could be happening to us, but Christian Aid is asking that we do not forget other places that have long suffered from poverty and where difficulties are being compounded by the climate crisis. If you are a subsistence farmer, relying on what you grow for what you eat, a year without rain is a disaster. Zimbabwe, the focus of this year's CAW fundraising, is suffering from ever-decreasing rainfall and drought is leading to widespread hunger.

When you see the red CAW envelope come through your door, please think about what you can do to help. Your collector may call back to collect the envelope or you may be asked to return it to a drop-off point such as a home address. In Sherston, envelopes can be put in the collection box in church and will be passed on from there.

By the time you receive this, there may well already be signs that our long-awaited project to rebuild our front extension is about to start. This has been many years in the pipeline, planning and fundraising and now we have 'all our ducks in a row' and we are ready to start.

The project will take quite a few months, and we apologise heartily to anyone who has plans disrupted. We will keep disruption to a minimum and will keep all our hirers informed along the way. Many of the bookings for clubs and classes will still be able to go ahead as the main hall, small hall, kitchen and field will be useable for most of the time. Access will be through the kitchen and small hall and access to the field mainly from Noble Street. Please keep clear of the building works for your own safety.

Although we have raised sufficient funds for the building work to start, we are still hoping for more donations to be made, in order to pay for those extra expenses and finishing touches! There have been a number of donations recently made from businesses and individuals, some of them anonymous, so thank you very much to all.

The Village Hall AGM was on 6 April. There had been no AGM since 2019. Minutes of the meeting are on the website www.sherston.net/villagehall Much of the discussion was about the building project and all the officers stood for re-election again, although we welcomed a new Drama Group chairperson Katie Skeffington.

During April there have been two talks given to help raise funds for the Village Hall.

Queen Elizabeth I as seen by historians, artists and film-makers was a fascinating talk given by Roger Ashley in the British School Room on 8 April. Alongside the familiar depiction of Elizabeth in all her finery, there were some unusual illustrations and many little-known facts. We thank Roger for his expert knowledge in providing a very entertaining evening.

On Sunday 3 April, at the Church of the Holy Cross, Richard Stancombe gave a very interesting and well-attended insight into how Sherston has become the village that we have today.

A hilltop settlement, bypassed by the Romans, and even today major roads and the M4 and M5, our charm lies with the 13th century layout that a certain Mathew Bezill laid out to make money. Thirty-seven burgage plots were laid out around a market space, with permission to hold markets and feast days, historical events and developments continued to take place, leaving us the village that you see today.

Richard's extensive research on Sherston and his own house, suggests further work is needed. The fact is that every house has a story to tell. This knowledge is unique to our village and should be explored and preserved.

Thanks go to Richard for giving his time and energy in preparing and delivering his fascinating talk. Those who attended also enjoyed homemade cakes and tea. Donations were split between the church and the village hall extension project.


Sign up now for children's tennis coaching!

Sherston Velo: Belgium trip

Belgium is one of the spiritual heartlands of bicycle racing, and riding the cobbled climbs and lanes of Flanders has long been seen as a rite of passage for many cyclists.

Following a two-year gap, the Sherston Velo Cycling Club annual spring trip saw 10 riders from the club tackle rides based on the route of the iconic Ronde van Vlaanderen (Tour of Flanders) bicycle race. You can't ride far in the rolling hills on the border between Flanders and Wallonia without encountering some of the cobbled lanes that criss-cross the rural landscape, and the riders were soon tackling some of the climbs made famous by the professional races, from the long drag of the Oude Kwaremont and the twisting, narrow Molenberg to the fearsome gradients of the Koppenberg and the Paterburg.

Tired but happy after a long day in the saddle, the group made its way back to the hotel to rehydrate with some of the delicious local beers and to admire the bikes of the Cofidis professional cycling team, who were sharing the same hotel. There was also an opportunity to visit the Centrum Ronde van Vlaanderen museum, which commemorates the race and features exhibits, including racing bicycles and equipment from the past 100 years of the event.

Sherston Velo Cycling Club is always open to new members, regardless of experience, age or ability.

There is a range of rides every week, with the main club rides on weekend mornings catering for all levels of experience and fitness, including families.

As well as road rides, the club organises MTB and gravel rides, virtual rides using the Zwift and RGT online apps, social events, rider safety and bike maintenance training and riding trips to famous cycling destinations in the UK and overseas.

The club is affiliated to British Cycling and has committed to abiding by its code of conduct and policies.



Alfred Williams was born in South Marston, Wilts, in 1877. He wrote poetry about the people and the area in which he lived, in publications such as A Wiltshire Village, and Round About the Upper Thames. When ill-health forced him to leave his job on the railway, Alfred began cycling around the Cotswolds and Upper Thames to compile an anthology of the songs of local people. In this presentation, Martin Graebe will talk about Alfred Williams' life and work with particular reference to his folk songs. The talk will be illustrated with photographs and performances of some of the songs discovered by Williams.






