Sherston Arts Festival overview: Friday 5 to Sunday 14 November

After a really difficult period during the Covid crisis, when so many cultural events were cancelled, we are delighted to be able to offer this year's Festival. The virus may still be with us, and some people will still be nervous about attending, but we will endeavour to make events as safe as possible.

Preview evening; come to Holy Cross Church on Friday 5 November at 7.30pm to get a first glimpse of the Art Exhibition, with over 100 pictures in all media by both professional and amateur artists. It costs £5 on the door, including a glass of wine or a soft drink. The exhibition is then open every day from 10.00am to 5.00pm, except on Sunday 7 November when it opens at 11.00am and on Sunday 14 November when it opens at 12.00noon. Flower displays by members of the church flower group will decorate the church.



120 years of the Blues by Tim Hughes; Saturday 6 November at 7.30pm in the British School Room, Cliff Road. Combining presentation and performance, Tim outlines the emergence of the blues from the Deep South, through Chicago and the British blues boom to the modern day. Covering artists as diverse as Ma Rainey, Bessie Smith, Blind Blake, Robert Johnson, Muddy Waters, Elmore James, BB King, Ry Cooder and many others. Including performances by Tim, using traditional bottleneck and finger-picking guitar styles, of Walking Blues, That'll Never Happen No More, Red Rooster, Baby Please Don't Go and Paris Texas. This event is designed to be of interest to anyone who would like to find out more about the blues that have been so influential to the development of popular music over the last century. The Grimm Sisters by Scratchworks Theatre Company; Sunday 7 November at 2.30pm in the Village Hall. A slightly scary story for families with children over 6 (but great fun for all ages!) Brought to us by Rural Arts Touring.

Flu vaccinations

Due to the space restrictions in the Tolsey we are taking over the Village Hall again for our second flu vaccination clinic on Saturday 6 November, our first took place on Saturday 16 October.

These clinics are for over 65 year olds, and under 65 at risk patients. You will be notified by text if you are eligible.

Patients will no doubt be aware of the national delay in flu vaccine supplies to Primary Care and, as a result of this, we currently do not yet have enough vaccine for the 50 to 65 age group. We would kindly suggest that if you are in that cohort you consider taking up the opportunity to have a flu vaccination at various outlets including most pharmacies.


Covid Booster Vaccinations

We have been allocated a clinic on Saturday 13 November. The NHS will be supplying us with the Pfizer vaccine only, which means that we will have to vaccinate our eligible patients at Malmesbury Primary Care Centre. There is still a 15 minute wait time after each vaccine, which we cannot accommodate in our current building. We are grateful to our local colleagues for, once again, letting us use their facilities.

All patients will be contacted according to the risk groups and ensuring it is six months since their previous vaccine.

We appreciate that some eligible patients may not wish to wait and so can make an online booking elsewhere using the Covid National Booking service. All members of the Tolsey recently used this service and found it to be very efficient.



School Days - news from Sherston Primary School



It was a busy fun-filled Autumn term for the pupils of Sherston School. From raising awareness about climate change and celebrating Black History, to challenging themselves on the sports field and becoming experts in all things chocolatey. Over to them to share what they've been learning and experiencing...a big thank you to everyone for their contributions.

Y6 Climate Change Assembly

'In October Y6 did an assembly on climate change and global warming because these are incredibly important subjects right now as they are affecting lots more people and animals. It was for the whole school, teachers and the parents and carers of children in Sycamore Class. We were all really excited as this was the first class assembly for Sherston Primary in nearly two years!'

'Mr Stewart (the Year 6 teacher) let us get on with writing our scripts on our own, so we all had quite a big responsibility in each of our groups. There were lots of jokes at the start of the assembly and some of the jokes were: I don't know what the problem is, I don't have a carbon footprint, I drive everywhere!' and What did carbon dioxide say to the ozone layer? I've got you covered! The three boys who were telling the jokes went on a learning journey and realised that climate change is no joke.'

'Their journey started with some drama where pupils acted out true stories of real people affected by climate change, like Olivia who can't afford house insurance because of forest fires, Elhaji who had to move to the city because the droughts destroyed his farm and Granny and Lauren who had to escape the floods. They

found out what climate change and global warming is and what we can all do to help.'

'Our assembly ended with a prayer and a song written by some of the pupils and performed on ukuleles. The song helps people remember how they can help the environment, for example, by walking to school, sharing lifts and eating less meat. Finally we set the whole school the challenge to earn a green Blue Peter badge before the end of November!'

COVID-19 vaccinations for 12 to 15-year-olds now available outside of school

Parents across Bath and North East Somerset, Swindon and Wiltshire can now arrange for their child to receive a coronavirus vaccine outside of school.

Previously, vaccinations for 12 to 15-year-olds had only been available in school through Virgin Care's immunisation services team.

However, parents can now use the online National Booking Service to arrange to have their child vaccinated at Bath Racecourse, Salisbury City Hall, and online booking for the Steam Museum in Swindon expected to be available by now.

Out-of-school vaccinations were introduced to coincide with the start of the half-term holidays, and to supplement what is already happening in schools, and will continue to be available throughout November.

Children unable to make it to one of the three sites offering vaccines for 12 to 15-year-olds will still be able to get vaccinated at school.

A gloriously muddy challenge for the whole family, set around gorgeous woodland just north of Bristol, Muddy Madness is fun for all ages. The 5k is great for everyone aged seven and up, and the 2k is brilliant for families with children under seven (who must have a grown-up doing the course with them).

Friendly marshals will be on hand to help you tackle the obstacles and cheer you on, and you'll get a warm ABC welcome at the end, and there will be hot drinks and tasty snacks to buy too!

As we said ABC's services provide a lifeline for refugees and asylum seekers who arrive in Bristol with very few belongings having left their entire lives behind, and they're now helping an increasing number of Afghani families who have fled the crisis in their homeland.

Their services, which provide essential supplies, practical support, new connections and a warm welcome are needed more than ever. And this is one of the first fundraising events we've been able to invite our wonderful supporters (that's you!) to take part in since the pandemic began.

Tracklements raises money to support local children



During the month of September, the community of Sherston was busy collecting crabapples for nearby condiment maker, Tracklements, to turn into English Crabapple Jelly. For the third year running, the primary school's pupils and their families, as well as the village's Brownies, Guides, Beavers, Cubs and Scouts, have all been encouraged to get out and about to collect these 'wild' apples from crabapple trees that can be found in hedgerows and nestled amongst other trees.

Tracklements is now busy transforming the 360kg of crabapples that were picked into delicious jars of jelly which will be available to buy immediately. For every kilogram of apples picked and for every jar sold nationwide, Tracklements donates money to the community, and this year they have paid Sherston's youth groups £1,153.80 for last year's project.

Guy Tullberg, Tracklement's Managing Director said: 'We're immensely proud to have helped raise this money for Sherston School. The project has been running for 20 years and helps demonstrate to the school children the provenance of their food by teaching them about the great British tradition of making preserves.'

Mrs Sue Leyden, the school's headteacher said: 'Not only has the school benefitted from this project but the children and their families have had great fun exploring the local countryside hunting for crabapples.'



'Magellan Circumnavigation was pure joy, not least because it marked the return of theatre and musical story-telling to Lighthouse. What's more this two man show - the first theatre production to grace the Lighthouse stage in more than six months - was beautifully performed.

Conceived and written by Poole folk singersongwriter Bob Whitley, it told in words and song the extraordinary tale of Ferdinand Magellan's 16th century mission to find a passage through the South American continent and circumnavigate the world.

And what a tale it was. With Bob on guitar and mandolas accompanied bybrilliant cellist-vocalist Lee Mackenzie, we heard how Magellan and his men took to the high seas determined to prove that the world was round. Not easy at a time when many people believed the earth was flat and that if you sailed too far you'd drop straight off the edge of the sea.

Sitting on a simply dressed stage, Bob and Lee



performing in costume, delivered a thoughtful and perfectly nuanced performance of carefully crafted songs evoking the fear, excitement and desperately gruelling lives of the sailors and the hopes and heartaches of the loves they had left behind.'





My five-charity marathon

On Sunday 3 October, I ran the London Marathon for not one, not two, but FIVE amazing charities. All five have helped us significantly after our son George was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia in March last year (see September's Cliffhanger for more about our journey). So, what are the five charities?

Firstly, Children with Cancer UK for which I have run the London Marathon on two previous occasions (before George's diagnosis). The funds raised will continue to allow vital research to be undertaken to ensure all people affected by leukaemia have the best chance of a full recovery.

Secondly, Clic Sargent for continued day-to-day support, from information and guidance to clinical care and specialist play during treatment, as well as providing accommodation when George has had to stay over in hospital.

Thirdly, Molly's Olly's who made George's wish to own his own drum kit come true by sourcing one for him earlier this year. Whilst George has always shown a passion and significant talent with regards to playing the drums, they have also been incredibly useful in allowing his frustrations to be relieved!

Fourthly, Forever Friends of the RUH, with funds raised being spent specifically on the children's ward helping to improve the facilities in the hospital both for children and their parents. Toys need to be constantly replaced as they are heavily utilised, and having better facilities for the parents makes the stays just a little less daunting.

Lastly, the Rainbow Trust which provides family-centred care for children and young people with a life-threatening or terminal illness. The services it provides are aimed at empowering parents to regain control over their lives, with help tailored to what each family needs, be it emotional or practical. In our situation, the Rainbow Trust has kindly spent time playing and engaging with George and his siblings, Amelia and Hugo, on a weekly basis.

We have seen first-hand the difference every pound and penny makes so please, whatever you can afford will be so appreciated. Thank you!! A huge thank you to everyone who has kindly donated already; we never dreamt we would raise so much money!
