# Sherston Parish Council Annual Report 2023



#### Introduction

It's the time of the year to take stock, to celebrate the highs and reflect on the lows, as well as taking the time to thank the significant number of individuals and organisations who devote their time and effort to help make our village the one we are all so proud of.



#### **Financials**

- Budget
- **2022-23** £89,664
- **2023-24** £97,450
- Precept increased by just over 10% 2023-24 equates to £10.55p.a. on a Band D house. We continue to try to make up a deficit in accruals for future maintenance of village assets to future proof budget

- Grants and Donations received £12,860
  - Electric Vehicle Points £11,960
  - Area Board Grant for Jubilee £900
- Grants and Donations made £16,086
  - Village Hall £15,000
  - Jubilee £486.00
  - Blooming Sherston £600

### Highlights – what have we been up to/supporting?

- Maintenance part-time maintenance person contracted
- Speeding gates delivered awaiting installation from Wiltshire Council. Speed monitoring devices installed around the village
- Asset Register revised version of comprehensive Asset Register produced
- Village Hall Extension grant awarded
- Blooming Sherston improve overall look and feel of the village
- Tennis Courts fir trees felled to preserve the surface of the courts. Courts now generally open to public due to closure of Tennis Club.
- Recreation Ground various items of play equipment replaced

Footpath Group - revitalising Grove Wood. 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase of 8 year coppicing plan complete. Trees planted in various locations by Sustainable Sherston & 2<sup>nd</sup> set of steps renovated. Accessible gates replaced stiles on the majority of PROW

#### Lowlights - what didn't go so well?

- Recreation Ground Charitable Trust liasing with the Charity Commision to respond to a complaint raised by a resident in relation to the status of the Trust and how it has been managed
- Neighbourhood Plan progress of the development on Sopworth Road has been slower than expected. Further delays are now expected as a result of the Developers withdrawing their latest application pending a resubmission
- Pre-School Closure this news, received 5 weeks before
   Easter was disappointing to all concerned. Neither
   ourselves or Wiltshire Council have been able to attract a
   new provider as a result of market conditions. Work
   underway to drive a recreational use for the building
- Vandalism increased reports of issues across the village.
   Local police patrols instigated

- New Doctors Surgery NHS/ICB
  (Integrated Careboard) funding process proving
  problematic for GP's resulting significant delays in the
  application process
- Speeding whilst a highlight, generally, we have struggled to move forward at the pace we would like as we are constricted by leadtimes from Wiltshire Council
- Attracting New Councillors we continue to struggle to attract new councillors to fill vacancies.
- Cliffhanger not making best use of or engaging effectively with the Cliffhanger team
- Resident engagement we continue to struggle with engaging our residents for input and help

#### Goals for this year

#### **TOP 5 PRIORITIES**

- Communication increase transparency and flow of information to residents
- Pre-School Building find a recreational use for the pre-school building on the Rec
- Doctors Surgery influence and encourage the NHS to approve and support proposals for the new GP surgery
- Neighbourhood Plan work with Developers, Surgery and Wiltshire Council to obtain planning permission
- Speeding install gates at various entrances to the village (and planters). Circulate results of speed monitoring around village and layout plans to address if appropriate

- Refurbish steps into the Recreation Ground
- Pre-School work with the school to provide pre-school facilities on the school site
- Boules Pitches Install pitches on the Recreation Ground
- Allotments transfer of this asset from Wiltshire Council to Sherston Parish Council to ensure asset is protected and retain as a village community allotment.
- Ways of Working review and update our 'ways of working' to increase effectiveness and efficiency
- Cliffhanger relaunch
- Grove Wood Coppicing Phase 3
- Footpath/Highways improvements
- Volunteers establish a bank of volunteers to help with various initiatives around the village
- Electric Vehicle charging points in the High Street conclude proposal to install.
