# Road closures

Sherston will see a spate of road closures for essential works during the next month or so both in the village and nearby.

From 10 April for 4 weeks the road (C1) from Norton to Hullavington will be closed at the river bridge for repairs just before the railway bridge. A diversion will be in place from the Fosse Way to Grittleton and Hullavington and vice versa. The closure will cause extra mileage and time for local drivers accessing the M4 at junction 17. It is expected that the closure will be lifted for a few days at the time of the Badminton Horse Trials – 3 to 7 May.

Brook Hill including part of the High Street at the top of the hill will be closed from April 23rd for resurfacing work which is scheduled to take 2 days. There will be no access to and from Luckington during this time and a diversion will be in place from Acton Turville to The Gibb to Grittleton and then the Fosse Way to Sherston and vice versa.

On 2 May Sandpits Lane between Holmfield and Carriers Close will be closed for a day for manhole cover repairs by Wessex Water.

Noble Street and Tanners Hill are due to be closed from 8 May for 3 weeks whilst Bristol Water renews the water mains.



After a considerable time dealing with the bureaucracy of obtaining a licence to plant a tree in the highway verge, the new tree at Manor Close is finally in the ground. It is a prunus amanogawa, which is a flowering cherry with a columnar shape.

Thanks are due to Noel Banks for planting the tree – which was no easy task as underneath the grass lurked a vast amount of rubble, no doubt left over from the building of Strongs Close. Local resident Susan Mandel has kindly volunteered to water the tree during its first year.

# Hedge laid







Thanks to the efforts of members of a Cotswold Conservation Board training course, the hedge running alongside the football pitch at Knockdown Park (aka the sports field) has had a serious makeover this spring. Some 11 people attended the weekend course in traditional hedge-laying, with some coming from as far afield as Hertfordshire and Surrey. Whilst the majority of the hedge was laid in two days, our local Cotswold Warden, Noel Banks, and his team of volunteers kindly completed the task.


to use on the day. Look out for details on how to book a table, closer to the event.

Eight years ago, Whitehall started a scheme to encourage Wiltshire children to get gardening at school. 'We thought we should try to encourage local schools. Chaplains are employed by the NHS trust and supported by the Church of England. When a parishioner goes into hospital we would be very grateful to be told, so that they can be prayed for, and so that the hospital chaplains can be put in contact with them if a visit is desired. Equally, when someone returns home or to a local convalescent home, it would be helpful to know please, so that the local Ministry Team can carry on the pastoral care.

# Grittleton **Baptist** Chapel open afternoon

Halfway along the main street in Grittleton, on the opposite side to the Neeld Arms, is a pair of green iron gates, which are usually locked. The gates lead to a grass track, and at the bottom is Grittleton Strict and Particular Baptist Chapel. The Chapel was last used for worship in 1982, since when it has been looked after by a group of the Trustees of the Baptist Congregation now based in West Kington. At the end of last year, it was taken on by The Historic Chapels Trust, which looks after about 20 chapels spread across the country.

The Chapel will be open from 2.00pm to 5.00pm on the afternoon of Sunday 22 April. At 4.00pm Matthew Butler, a resident of Acton Turville and an archaeologist at the University of Bristol, will give a short talk on the history of the Chapel. Matthew will be on hand all afternoon to point out some of the main features and to answer questions.

Grittleton Chapel is a real gem: a time capsule, and one of the finest surviving nonconformist places of worship in the south of England. Built in 1721, box pews and galleries were installed and, apart from one reordering about 200 years ago, it has remained unaltered ever since. A burial ground with gravestones lies alongside the Chapel.





# Sherston Living Churchyard 2012

Life is starting to come back to the churchyard after the winter and it was great to see the primroses in the wooded area flowering even in January. They have now been joined by snowdrops and the leaves of the bluebells are starting to poke up through the soil.

In view of this resurgence of natural life, you may have been surprised that there has not been any human activity yet this spring. Unfortunately, as many of you may have heard, I have been ill and still have to undergo several months of chemotherapy. This means that I shall not be able to organise monthly working parties in the churchyard as in previous years. You may still see me there when I feel up to it. There is now good scientific evidence that contact with the natural world is good for body, mind and spirit, and I certainly find it so and I believe that being there will help my recovery.

The churchyard will still show the results of the work of previous years, especially the areas of grassland plants which flowered so beautifully last year and attracted so many insects. These included a marbled white butterfly, one which I have not seen before anywhere and which was drawn by the knapweed flowers planted in the grass.

# Living Churchyard - Bird Survey

Over the past year you may have spotted someone lurking in the churchyard with a clipboard and binoculars, usually in the early morning... the bird survey is almost complete and the churchyard supports a wide variety of birds. You are probably all aware of the jackdaws that roost in the copper beech, but the tower is also a roost for a large flock of starlings, which are a 'red-listed' species in the UK, meaning that their numbers have declined dramatically over the past 25 years.

There are all the usual birds you might expect to see in your garden – robins, dunnocks, blackbirds, tits and finches, including a bullfinch feasting happily on the blossom buds, in the last month. While greenfinch numbers have been badly affected by a virus this winter, the churchyard still has a small flock of four, along with a flock of goldfinches. If you look very carefully, you might even see Britain's smallest bird, the goldcrest, in the conifers in the churchyard and, over the summer, an endangered song thrush was using the east end roof as song post. The most dramatic visitor of the year has been a sparrowhawk hunting over the churchyard in summer, but the large family of coal tits managed to avoid this danger, successfully rearing all four chicks. The churchyard offers a varied and safe habitat for birds and, if you are prepared to watch quietly, you might see any one of the 21 different species that make the churchyard their home.

# Sherston Boules & Carnival: 7-15 July

Sherston Boules Tournament is now in its 27th year, having been started in 1986 by Rev. Hugh Thomson-Glover (Sherston's vicar at the time), Dr Colin Owen (local doctor) and Richard Maslin. It was originally held in September but now takes place on the closest Saturday to Bastille Day, 14 July. The Tournament has since grown to 128 teams, making it the UK's largest one-day boules tournament.

The Tournament was amalgamated with the existing

village Carnival. Since then, Boules & Carnival has evolved into a full week of events, including seniors teas, a skittles tournament, cricket at Pinkney Park, a children's disco, tug of war and a duck race, with other activities on Boules Day itself.

This year's Boules Tournament is again being organised by Martin Smith. Applications can be made online using the link http://sherston.net/boules-2012/ or by using a form available on the website or from the post office. The final deadline for entries is 30 April.

The main aim of Boules & Carnival is for everyone to have fun but also to raise money for local clubs and charities. Since it was established, over £210,000 has been raised. Last year £6,615 was distributed to 25 different clubs/charities, of which 19 were from Sherston, two from Luckington, two from Malmesbury and two were charities associated with people in the village. For some of these clubs, the contribution they receive is vital for them to keep going.

The running of Boules & Carnival is by an open committee (anyone can join) of people from the village and surrounding area who want to give something back. This year, our Chairman of many years, Tony Weedon, stepped down and no one has come forward to replace him in this role, so the organising is very much a joint committee effort. We are delighted that founders of the Boules Tournament will take on the ceremonial functions of this role. We are always looking for additional help. This doesn't mean you have to join the committee; there are many other ways to help, which don't involve much work but are crucial to the running of the event. As if by a magical old tradition, a gallant team of strong villagers appears at 6.30am to help set up the boules pitches and sand and then again from 5.00pm to 7.00pm to clear them away – help at these vital times would be much appreciated. Alternatively, help would be welcome at 2.00pm on Friday 13 July to help move pitch surrounds from the container by the football pitch to the High Street and for an hour

or so on Boules Day itself at the French café, the bar in the High Street or with teas in the village hall.

# High Street improvements

When the Old School project was given the green light last April the parish council began considering possible road safety improvements to the High Street to take into consideration the redevelopment particularly the relocation of the Post Office Stores. With the stores now being on the south side of the High Street there are greater numbers of pedestrians crossing the main road at its junction with Court Street including children who attend Sherston School. Highway engineers from Wiltshire Council were asked to look at the situation and to come up with some ideas. A proposal has now been drawn up that basically concentrates on providing safe protected pedestrian crossing points between the Old School and the tree on the opposite side of the road. Included is a disabled parking area outside the Old School and a replacement tree which will be protected from vehicle damage. In addition, a proper footpath is provided from Court Street to the area of the tree with that path possibly having railings to one side to avoid it being driven over by vehicles attempting to cut the corner.

In relation to High Street car parking, the parish council has not received any complaints caused by the new position of the Post Office Stores since it opened last November. The availability of parking for delivery vehicles to the rear of the Old School may well have alleviated the parking issue to some extent. The proposal for enhancing pedestrian safety in the High Street will undoubtedly have some impact on the car parking situation but it is a question of balancing that against greater road safety. Unfortunately both the present tree and nearby sign have been regularly driven into by vehicles for many years. Some may say that if a driver can't see a tree or sign whilst reversing they could easily fail to see a pedestrian, especially a child.

Before reaching any decision on the proposal the parish council wishes to hear from residents throughout the parish with their views.

There are four options within the proposal and Option A is shown overleaf in full. Options B, C and D are very much the same but with some differences in surfacing and in the intended new pathway running from the Court Street junction with the High Street to the area around the tree opposite the Old School. The areas of difference in options B, C and D are shown on page 20. It is also hoped to put these plans up on the parish council's website www.sherston.org.uk

### The estimated costs of the options are:


Option A £15,933.08 Option B £15,654.78 Option C £13,168.82 Option D £13,260.49


The major cost differences are due to whether paving is used or straightforward tarmac the latter being the cheaper. The paving option is due to the fact that the High Street is in the centre of the conservation area and paving could therefore be considered more appropriate than plain tarmac.

If the proposal is to proceed the parish council will have to meet the majority of the cost. The Malmesbury Area Board of Wiltshire Council has made available a sum of £5000 as a contribution via the Community Area Transport Group. The parish council's contribution would be paid out of the present budget and from existing reserves.

The proposal now being considered is phase I. The parish council has also asked the highway engineers to look at improving the area alongside the Rattlebone Inn (phase 2) and when any proposal for phase 2 is presented, further public consultation will be undertaken. It should be noted however that phase I is the priority and it is unlikely that finance will be available for phase 2 until 2013/2014.




### **OPTION B**

Full height granite kerbs with tegula paving (no post and rail system). Tegula paving on Old School side.




### **OPTION C**

# Walk on the wild side

### Comings and goings

April is a time of change for our local wildlife. Many of the birds that overwintered here have now left – the redwings, fieldfares and many of the finches have all departed for more northerly climes – while the summer migration from southern Europe has already started, with stock doves already nesting and chiffchaff males beginning to arrive a week or so ago.

The chiffchaff, a member of the warbler family, is a delightful small brown bird, and there are a number of males singing in the bushes and trees along the Cliff. They have a two-tone song a bit like their name and, with a little patience, you can see them (see photo). There are more details on my blog at http://sherstonwildlife.wordpress.com.

During the month, we should start to see the arrival of many of our other summer birds, such as cuckoos, house martins, whitethroats, willow warblers and swifts. If we are really lucky we may even get nightingales. I will be spending some time trying to find some locally; we are right on the edge of their range, although they do occur in the Cotswold Water Park so watch this space.

Grove Wood will be bursting out in bluebells very soon. The first few are in flower and this outstanding warm spring will bring them forward. Peacock and brimstone butterflies are out and about, as are many species of insects, especially bumblebees.

Martin Barber (from Hullavington) visited Grove Wood last week and identified many of the plants growing there. Hopefully, he will come back from time to time to help us understand the effect the coppicing has had on the plant life.

The jackdaws are out in strength, filling all sorts of crevices with their nests at the moment. They seem to congregate around the church and fly up and down the High Street like squadrons of Spitfires.

# Adult social care helping people to stay safe at home


The Help to Live at Home service is progressing very well, with 639 people (out of a total of 1,500 eligible customers) receiving the new service from one of the selected Help to Live at Home providers. The transfer of customers will continue over the next few weeks.

Cabinet has now approved the development of a new call centre and response service based in Wiltshire that will link with telecare (assistive technology). This new service will be provided by Wiltshire Medical Services which currently provides the GP 'out of hours' service. The call centre is based in Chippenham but there will be a team of care staff based in the south of the county, able to respond to non-medical emergencies.

Wiltshire Medical Services will work in partnership with Medequip which will provide community equipment, telecare and other adaptations to enable people to remain in their own homes. The development of telecare in Wiltshire will extend the range of equipment available to support people to include fall alarms, heat detectors and bed movement sensors, offering customers the opportunity to remain safe and secure.

Through implementing these new services, the council believes that customers will be able to remain in their own homes for longer.

The council want to encourage people to feedback on these services. There is a dedicated telephone helpline (01225 712553) for any concerns or comments people may have about the services that are being provided. The helpline is available Monday to Friday, 9.00am to 5.00pm.



### Why is there a 48-hour wait for repeat prescriptions?

The 48-hour time period set down for repeat prescriptions is not only for reasons of safety – mistakes can be made if a job is rushed – but to allow us to complete the necessary processes required before the prescription is ready for collection. It is important to note that the 48-hour time period is for working hours, orders placed on a Friday evening will not be processed until Monday morning, and will be ready in 48 hours from then, ie Wednesday morning. We process nearly 6,000 prescriptions every month, so it is essential that we follow carefully laid-down procedures to ensure the safety of our patients.

Repeat requests can be posted in the box at the surgery, emailed or faxed. These are all checked several times a day to ensure minimum delay in processing. (We do not take repeat requests by telephone as the risk of error is too high.)



### Coming Soon: the new NHS Summary Care Record

The new NHS Summary Care Record has been introduced to help deliver better and safer care, and to give you more choice about who you share your healthcare information with.

### What is the NHS Summary Care Record?

The Summary Care Record contains basic information about:

- any allergies you may have,
- unexpected reactions to medications, and
- any prescriptions you have recently received.

The intention is to help clinicians in A&E departments and 'out of hours' health services to give you safe, timely and effective treatment. Clinicians will be allowed to access your record only if they are authorised to do so and, even then, only if you give your express permission. You will be asked if healthcare staff can look at your Summary Care Record every time they need to, unless it is an emergency (for instance, if you are unconscious). You can refuse if you think access is unnecessary.

If you would like further information, you can call the helpline number 0300 123 3020 or go to www. carerecords.nhs.uk. Letters will be going out to all patients in mid-April.




