We did it

With more twists and turns than an alpine road, the famous five cyclists from Sherston (and Pinkney) achieved their aim of cycling to Gien and being back in time for Boules Day along with the Gien boules team. You are probably all aware of the frantic running around which took place a week before the scheduled departure when Hector Walker, the Tour's driver, discovered that the documents needed to cross the border between England and France were not the same as those needed to cross between England and Scotland! This threatened to cancel or seriously affect the tour as it was essential that the riders had a support vehicle to carry all of the items needed to assist them with the challenge and return them back in time for Boules Day.

Fortunately, the Sherston Jungle Drums, or email lists, including the Cliffhanger, swung into action and within 30 minutes of the call going out, the village had rounded on its prey, the unsuspecting James Pyle. Within that 30 minutes James was hounded by 4 emails and calls from villagers, including his wife, telling him to get out of the village. (....for a week and help the team. Ed.) James duly obliged and the Tour was back on track.

The cyclists departed at 8.00am on Monday 11 July in sunshine to the cheers of family and well wishers – some of whom seemed rather keen they were leaving for a week. The first day went well and 100 miles to Portsmouth were covered without too much pain and the ESP skills of James were already evident with him picking exactly the spot where the cyclists were starting to struggle and in need of refreshment, as the place to park and lay out each cyclist's carefully prepared dietary needs. Gels and sports drinks for most, half of scrumpy for Jon Adye.

But on the second day, the first in France, things took another turn for the worse, with driving rain, headwinds and the after effects of a dodgy Chimichanga too much for Nick Holland. Fortunately medical assistance was close at hand in the form of Dr J Pettit and even closer at hand that night as he was sharing the same room,

so was able to give a full diagnosis to the rest of the group first thing in the morning. Fortunately Holland is made of stern stuff and was able to fight off the bug and return to the saddle, which must have been doubly uncomfortably, on the third day.

The team arrived in Gien at lunchtime on Thursday 14 July, having completed the 320 miles in 3 ½ days and the town of Gien had laid on a street party and massive fireworks display in their honour. The group assume that Monsieur Sarkozy must have heard of their exploits as he declared the day a public holiday in their honour, although the cyclists were a little perplexed as to why if all of this had been laid on for them, no one came up and congratulated them on their achievements. It must have been the well-known reserved nature of the French.

They were given a warm welcome by Geoff and Diana Mellion who own a restaurant and bar in Gien, and insisted that Ricard was the best known recovery drink for cyclists.

If the reception they received in Gien was amazing, words cannot describe the reception which greeted them as they arrived back in Sherston on Friday night with family and friends lining the street for a ticker tape reception.

With saddle sores now recovering, the cyclists are out and about collecting pledges and are hoping to have raised in excess of £1,500 which will all go into the Boules and Carnival pot. So if you have pledged please make sure you make an effort to pay up and if you did not pledge it is not too late to donate so please stop one of us over the next few weeks.

Finally thanks to families and friends for assisting us with this trip but most of all to James for stepping in and showing real Sherston Community Spirit.

Sherston School rated 'Good' and 'Outstanding' by Ofsted

Pupils, staff, governors and parents at Sherston C of E Primary School have been celebrating the results of the latest Ofsted inspection.

Ofsted rated the school as 'Good' overall, with some areas rated 'Outstanding'.

The school, which currently has 193 pupils, was praised by the inspectors for providing 'good care and guidance for all pupils' and for preparing pupils well for the future.

The inspectors liked the fact that pupil attainment is high and the results that the children achieve at the end of Year 6 are 'outstanding' in comparison to other primary schools.

The quality of provision, outcomes, leadership and management of the Early Years Foundation Stage were rated as 'outstanding', which means that Reception class pupils at the school are given an excellent start to their school career. The inspectors found that 'behaviour is good', pupils are 'taught how to keep healthy and safe' and they

'make a good contribution to the school and local community'. Teaching was found to be good overall and sometimes outstanding, but the report notes that progress is inconsistent across the school, as pupils 'do not have enough time to practice skills or to finish planned tasks' in some lessons.

The Head Teacher, Nick Bowditch is justifiably proud of the school's achievements. He said: 'The whole school community should be pleased with the outcome of our inspection. It's the result of a great deal of hard work by everyone. It is now important that we focus on our priorities and continue to move the school forward.' Richard Hulme, Chair of the Governors said: 'I am delighted with the Ofsted result. This is appropriate recognition for a lot of hard work by our Head Teacher, all the staff and the Governing Body in the last 3½ years. I am particularly pleased that Ofsted deemed that both our overall pupil attainment and our provision in the Early Years Foundation Stage was outstanding. We will now focus on maintaining the excellent progress that the school has recently made.'

These Ofsted findings indicate that there have been significant improvements in all areas at the school since the last inspection in December 2008. As the report notes 'Since the previous inspection, the quality of teaching and the curriculum have improved and, as a result, so have pupils' achievement and attainment'. The staff and governors are keen to build on this success and the Ofsted inspectors agree that the school has 'good capacity for sustained improvement.'

My colleague PCSO Durry Maule and I have continued to try to patrol Sherston and other villages as much as possible this year.

We complement this with advertised quarterly street meetings throughout the year, the most recent of which was on Tuesday 24 May in the High Street from 2.30 to 3.30pm. Another is planned for some time after the summer holidays but will be advertised in advance.

It seems that a matter of great local interest is the ongoing misuse of the Fosseway at Easton Grey at the river crossing where a site of historical interest seems to have turned into a playground for a minority of off road type enthusiasts. Although this is outside the Parish, Sherston council has written a letter of support to a multi-agency meeting which I attended at County Hall in March and at last various organisations are pulling together to end this destruction. This means for the next three months as agreed on 28 June at the Malmesbury and Villages Community Area Partnership (MVCAP) meeting I have to prioritise my resources in preventing further antisocial behaviour there. I am pleased to say that by the time you read this all measures will be in place freeing me up to do more patrolling in and around the village.

Also by the time you read this the Boules weekend will have come and gone and hopefully it was as enjoyable as ever for all. There was a small Police presence for at least part of the day on the Saturday but this was only to ensure the free movement of traffic around the event which presented a few minor issues in previous years.

Finally, I have been asked by the Parish council to bring to your attention that ramblers and dog walkers are having issues with a local landowner allowing their dog onto the public right of way and intimidating those passing by. An investigation is ongoing and it may be that you or your family have had similar problems. If you have, please get in touch as I would like to clarify on what scale this problem is for the community.

Al-fresco lessons get the thumbs-up from Sherston's Oak Class

Reception children at Sherston Primary School are already making the most of their bespoke outdoor canopy, which was officially opened this week.

The canopy is effectively an 'outdoor classroom' allowing the children to enjoy planned and unplanned activities outdoors, protected from the sun (and rain) in a safe space.

The canopy was built by Wiltshire-based company Different by Design, and consists of an oak structure, a sandpit, a raised stage area and a large Perspex painting panel. It wasn't a cheap project. Costing nearly £7,000 around half the cost came from the school's capital fund, with the remainder donated by Friends of Sherston School. The money raised came from a variety of fun fundraising activities, such as a sponsored cycle ride round Castle Combe Race Track, a Christmas Fair and a funky 70s disco at the village hall.

The stage area provides an ideal imagination space to stimulate the little performers, who love to put on shows for the rest of the class.

'Our new canopy will be a great benefit to all the children coming through Reception,' said Debby Liddle, Oak Class teacher. 'It's well known that access to this kind of teaching area improves children's concentration and attention.'

The Perspex art panel too has proved extremely popular with all the children. Headteacher Nick Bowditch said: 'It has been really pleasing to see children, who would perhaps not normally sit down and voluntarily draw, engrossed in producing amazing art work with dry wipe pens and paints whilst standing up!'

All in all, a real asset to Sherston School. The teaching staff and children all love it.



Raising the crowns


The two walnut trees at the Court Street entrance to the Recreation Ground have had an overdue pruning. The 10m trees have grown considerably in recent years and are overhanging the road as well as impeding access to the ground. More importantly, small children are using them as a potentially dangerous climbing frame. The Parish Council had been given the go-ahead to raise the crowns to a safe height by Wiltshire Council.

Girdles are not a good look

Elsewhere on the Recreation Ground, one of the field maples by the Scout Hut has been damaged. Sad to say, it's not accidental. Deliberate stripping off of the bark can kill part or the whole of a tree if the woody tissues underneath are damaged, in a process known as 'girdling.' Sick and elderly struggle to reach vital services

Ill and frail people in Sherston are struggling to meet medical and other vital appointments because of a lack of volunteer drivers.

The good neighbour scheme Link now has only two drivers in the village.

Link offers lifts to GPs' surgeries, chiropodists, dentists and hospital outpatient departments. While clients are invited to make an anonymous donation, the service is aimed at the most vulnerable and is available to all regardless of means.

The most common journeys are to Malmesbury's primary care centre, Bath's Royal United Hospital and Swindon's Great Western Hospital.

Each year on average, Malmesbury and District Link makes more than 1,000 trips and helps more than 200 people. While most of these people live in Malmesbury, the next largest group of clients is in Sherston.

During the 12 months to the end of March this year, Link drivers made 142 trips from Sherston alone. They made a further 39 between then and the end of June.

But a lack of drivers means several people have been disappointed and have had to rely on expensive taxis or on friends and relatives giving up their time and earnings to help out. Throughout the area, which also includes Brinkworth, Hullavington, the Somerfords, Crudwell, Oaksey and Minety, Link had to turn down 25 requests for help between April and June alone.

'We'd greatly welcome more drivers from Sherston,' said Fee Knowles of Norton, Link's local volunteer recruitment and support officer. 'We have 25 registered drivers but only about 12 drive regularly. As a result, people are not getting the treatment they need or are having to pay enormous taxi fares of £50, £60 or more which they can ill afford.'

Anyone with time to spare can be a volunteer driver for Link for which they receive 40p per mile towards their costs. Some work once or twice a week and others once a year.

'You're expected to say No if you can't help at the time asked,' said volunteer driver Lynda Fleming of Sherston. 'We appreciate volunteers are often busy with families and other commitments so there's no pressure. But you meet a lot of new people as a Link driver and can enjoy a chat and a joke with them while doing something straightforwardly useful.'



Work has now started on the refurbishment and conversion of the Old School building.

The firm chosen by the SOSCIC board of directors to carry out the work is Chappell and Dix Ltd. The choice was a unanimous one and was the outcome of a careful selection process. Eight firms were initially contacted by SOSCIC's architect, James Slater Ltd. From these, following discussions and site visits, a short list of four emerged. They were invited to submit tenders for the work and after due consideration the SOSCIC directors made their choice.

There is every indication that Chappell and Dix are capable of delivering the project to a high standard within a very tight timetable. Provided there are no unpleasant surprises now that the building is opened up, this should allow the post office and general stores to move in before Christmas.

The firm is prepared to engage local tradesmen where appropriate. Anyone interested should contact Chappell and Dix without delay.

With the builders' board on the Old School behind them as an indication that real progress was being made, a small band of SOSCIC volunteers spent Boules Day raising awareness and recruiting more support for the project.

There has been a good response to the appeal for volunteers, but there can't be too many. Is there anyone out there who would be prepared to take on the job of membership secretary? The governors will be reviewing these arrangements in September and plan to consult with parents and the wider community (including the Wiltshire County Council and the Parish Council) in the Autumn Term in order to find a longer-term solution.

From the Parish Chest Cilla Liddington

Accounts from the Parish records showing how the Poor Law was administered in Sherston

The Poor Law Act of 1601 divided the poor into three categories: able-bodied and willing to work, able-bodied and unwilling to work, and unable to work. It also determined that in each parish the churchwardens and two or more substantial landholders should act as Overseers of the Poor and collect the poor rate. The rate was to be spent on setting poor children to work where their parents could not support them, setting able-bodied adults

to work, providing stocks of flax, wood, iron, etc. on which to set the poor to work, and for the relief of the elderly and infirm. From 1691, registers of parishioners receiving poor relief were supposed to be kept.

The writing in this document is very faint and sometimes very difficult to decipher, but I have tried to copy it as near as I can. The other interesting point is that these meetings would have had to be held in the Parish, so where was the Crown Inn?

From the Sherston Magna Parish Book 29. October 1717.

2nd March 1720

At a parish monthly meeting then held at the Swan Inn it was agreed to as follows

- 1 That 12d per week be allowed to Mary the wife of Samuel Clarke until the next Monthly meeting her husband being gone from here and left her very poor.
- 2 That 3s be allowed to buy Sara Drew widow a garment
- 3 That 6s be allowed to buy John Palmer now kept by Ann Kingson a payre of breeches a payre of stockings and a payre of shoes
- 4 That 8s be allowed to buy Hester Malford the daughter John Malford a Mantoe (cloak) and a Pettycoat
- 5 That 8d per week be allowed Elizabeth Morsley until the next Monthly parish meeting
- 6 That those per be put to the overseers extraordinaries
- 7 That 2s 6d per week be allowed to William Palmer till the next Parish monthly meeting placed to extraordinaries

BT has to drop wholesale prices

Telecoms regulator Ofcom has told BT to cut the price it charges other broadband providers to use its network in less populated, rural areas from August. Sherston and other locations (known as 'Market 1' areas) are where BT is the only provider of wholesale broadband services.

Ofcom hopes that this will increase competition between broadband providers in these areas and force the actual price consumers pay to go down. Or if the internet services providers (ISPs) don't pass on these savings, Ofcom hopes that this will at least enable them to allocate more bandwidth to each customer and improve speeds. Either way, it should be good news for Sherston broadband customers.

Market 1 customers have generally had to put up with slower services at higher prices from many ISPs. But for Sherston broadband customers to benefit it relies on ISPs actually passing on any savings/benefits to their customers.

Doctor's Bag

SMS Messaging

The Tolsey Surgery is pleased to announce that it has recently implemented the use of SMS text messaging to remind patients about their appointments. Staff are busy collecting mobile telephone numbers from patients so that they can include more patients in this system. If you want to use this service, please ensure that the surgery has your correct details. If you do not want to be contacted in this way, you must tell the surgery that you wish to opt out, and they will mark your records accordingly. These measures are being taken in response to the DNA (Did Not Attend) rates. Every month there are a large number of missed appointments as a result of patients not turning up. In March this amounted to 67 wasted appointments. It is practice policy that patients who persistently fail to attend will be asked to leave the practice.

Book Ahead Appointments

The surgery appointment booking system allows you to book appointments up to eight weeks in advance, so it should never be a problem to plan well ahead.

Emergency Appointments

The surgery will always hold a number of appointments for emergency bookings on the day. These are for patients that feel that they need to be seen urgently. If there are no appointments left, the doctor on duty will be informed and manage patients' concerns as appropriate.

The pressure on appointments does mean that, at times, there can be a longer wait than the surgery would like to book routine appointments, but the aim is to book appointments within 2 weeks where requested.

Have you installed smoke alarms in your home and do you test the batteries?

A man rescued from his Malmesbury flat by fire fighters in the early hours of Friday 29 July is lucky to be alive.

Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service was called after the alarm was raised by a neighbour. Fire-fighters wearing breathing apparatus entered the first floor flat and found the occupant unconscious on the living room floor, while a fire raged in the kitchen. Although the flat was fitted with smoke detectors, the batteries had been removed. Had the neighbour living in the flat above not smelt smoke, the outcome could have been much worse. Four fire crews were needed to tackle the blaze. Six fire fighters wearing breathing apparatus entered the building, and two hose reel jets and a main jet were needed to extinguish the fire, which severely damaged the kitchen.

Having smoke alarms fitted in your home can save your life – but you should never remove the batteries, and you should test and maintain the units regularly to make sure they are working properly. Once a week, press the test button and hold it until the alarm sounds.

If your smoke alarm is making a beeping or chirping noise that is not a full alarm, the cause is likely to be a low battery warning.


