Sherston WI July meeting

Our July meeting proved to be a rare summer's evening with warmth and plenty of sunshine.

This was a bonus as our speaker was Mel Hopkins from Breninwen Alpacas. He brought five of his young alpacas, almost a year old, to show us. We went outside to the village hall car park to view them, marvelling at the range of colours, from cream to dark brown. There are 22 natural colours, including black. The alpacas had recently been shorn so we were able to see their cute faces and touch their soft curly fleeces.

Back inside the hall, Mel showed us slides of more of his 25-strong herd. He told us they were basically gentle creatures who are efficient grazers, hardy and low maintenance. Alpacas are great protective mothers and will see off predators such as foxes.

We were then shown examples of the type of things that can be made from the fleeces: gloves ,hats and larger garments. The wool is extremely soft and can be dyed to whatever colour you want.

It was a first for Sherston WI to have live creatures brought by our speaker, and it was a very enjoyable experience.

After refreshments, we had a little business to discuss. Final details were given for the visit to Avebury Manor on 12 July. A visit to the BBC in Bristol is planned for 26 September. We are also hoping to have another jewellery workshop sometime in the autumn.

The next meeting will be on 2 August when Jenny Lane will be our speaker with the title 'Take a letter Miss Jones'. The competition is a favourite pen or pencil.

Appeal for unwanted domestic white goods

Established in 2003, Refurbiz is a white goods recycling charity that has helped more than 8,000 low-income families in Wiltshire by providing around 12,000 quality, reconditioned, white goods at prices they can afford.

However, with people hanging on to their old models and machines for longer, Refurbiz is increasingly in need of unwanted free-standing electric cookers, washing machines, dryers and refrigerators. The charity simply can't meet the demand for them and, if the economy continues to be slow and more people find themselves in difficulties, the demand is only going to go higher.

Refurbiz screens the goods, restore those that can be repaired and then passes them onto those in need. Typically, the cost of a washing machine or cooker comes to about £85 with a three-month warranty – vastly lower than buying new goods from the stores.

Any appliances that are beyond repair are stripped down to reusable components and finally any bits left over are sent to the Hills Waste Materials Recovery Facility, near Calne, for onward, licensed recycling, avoiding any waste electrical items going into landfill.

So, if you are replacing any white goods, particularly electric cookers and working fridges, then phone Refurbiz on 01380 720200 who will then come out and remove them free of charge (although, as a charity, donations to cover fuel costs etc are always welcome!).

Similarly, if you know any person or family in need of a low cost washing machine, dryer, cooker or fridge, please tell them about us. Many of our items are displayed on the charity's Facebook page.

New number for Link


Link provides a voluntary car service for people in the Sherston area to take those in need to hospital, the chiropodist, GPs' surgeries and to visit sick friends and relatives.

Clutter, gardens and repairs

There always seem to be jobs to do in and around the house, whether it's tidying the garden, house maintenance or de-cluttering. I have just spent months sorting out 20 years of clutter from my study. What do we do with all that unwanted stuff we accumulate?

Is your garden getting unmanageable? This wet summer really isn't helping us to keep on top of the lush growth of grass, plants and WEEDS. House maintenance outside is also virtually impossible in this current weather.

If you have difficulty managing these tasks in normal circumstances then the weather won't be helping at all.

Finding trustworthy and reliable tradespeople to help with these tasks isn't always straightforward:

- 1. Where do you look? (There are hundreds in phone directories but who are they?)
- 2. Are they reliable? Who recommended them?
- 3. Are they trustworthy?

You might like to consider:

- 1. Using tradespeople who come recommended by family, friends or a local group.
- 2. Asking them to provide references or evidence of previous jobs they have completed.
- 3. Making sure you have a business or home address to contact them, not just a mobile phone number.
- 4. Avoiding responding to people who casually offer services at your doorstep.

If you're de-cluttering your home or replacing large items of furniture, then what can you do with it? It won't necessarily fit into your recycling bins.

- 1. 'Freecycle' is a free online service where you can give away your unwanted items. You can also obtain items for free once you are a member. The items are collected by the recipient so you don't need to deliver them.
- 2. There are a number of independent agencies that can carry out repairs to the home inside and out. They will remove large items of furniture from your home for a small charge.
- 3. Wiltshire Council will remove large furniture items from your doorstep (pre-booking required) for a fee (reduced if you are on means-tested benefits).
- 4. 'Waste Not Want Not' will collect large items of furniture that can be resold in their Chippenham shop (no charge).
- 5. Dorothy House and British Heart Foundation have a free collection service for most furniture and electrical good which they will sell in their high street shops.

As your Good Neighbour Co-ordinator, I can give you information on any of the above to help you manage your home and garden.



Did you know ...

- Health problems can be made worse if you don't keep warm enough. If a home is too cold, people of any age with health problems are at increased risk. Breathing problems (such as asthma), heart attacks and strokes can get worse if people are too cold for too long.
- Poor insulation means heat leaks out of your roof, your walls, your windows and doors – even up an open chimney.
- With ever-rising heating bills, you need to do as much as you can to stop the heat leaking, otherwise it's like throwing money away.
- Insulation for an average home would normally cost £750 for loft insulation and £1,000 for cavity wall insulation.
- The average cost to fully insulate a solid wall three-bedroom house externally is £8,000-£10,000 and internally is £6,000-£8,000.

The pond dipping board, which now hangs from the fence surrounding the pond, was designed by Paul and Alice Ormiston. Children also have laminated sheets to help with identifications near the water's edge. Thanks are due to Paul and Alice and to Nick Holland for printing onto the all-weather plastic board, and for giving the board to the school: thank you all.

End of year at the school's environment area

Work presses on with building a quiet space within the Sopworth Road wildlife area, known in school as the Chill-Out Zone. Becky Fisher has plans to embrace

both reflection and spiritual themes here. A very generous from the Willetts donation family has helped the school purchase some outdoor stools and benching. Donations of wild flowers and a holly tree from the village have been planted by all the Year One children in Ash Class. Willow Class has successfully planted the first stretch of a willow hedge, which will extend to include a circular tunnel next vear; twigs kindly collected from John Matthews' trees.

Classes have been making more Lara Farahar and extensive use of the outdoor classroom and the pond; better weather would have helped, but the resources and opportunities are there, whatever the weather.

Highlights at the pond have been lots of little frogs from our first 'own' spawn this year, five newts rescued from a pond in Wotton Bassett, and many beautiful damsel and dragonflies. Oak and Sycamore Classes have looked after their gardens at the front of the school, despite the

combined onslaught of rain, slugs and seeds not germinating. Sycamore grew over 70 sunflowers; together with generous donations from Foxley Road Nurseries (thank you Carol and Mike) and the village, both classes planted what should become colourful displays in a few weeks' time. Sycamore did a small amount of designing.

The bird box had two families. The first sadly died through lack of food for the chicks in the warm, dry April. The second family moved in a week later, and raised six chicks successfully. All seen on the bird cam, in the school and on the internet. We now have an underwater cam. Thanks to Peter Bishop for donating these cameras and his time setting the equipment up.

Various classes have planted an array of fruit and vegetables, including fruit trees donated by Whitehall Garden Centre and a new strawberry bed (Willow), potatoes and runner beans

(Birch), various salads which didn't like the weather (Chestnut), and other veg (Beech). Oak Class restored one of the wormeries, and found the worms fun to play with!

Next school year will see the Year Five EcoTeam apply for the Green Flag Award; that will be tops for them, with only a handful of schools in Wiltshire having achieved this status. This follows lots of hard and meticulous work with recycling (thanks to John Thompson for organising the blue bin from County), energy monitoring and more over the last few years. Work will start to connect the forest school area to the wildlife area, linking up a nature trail on the way. The outdoor classroom will see the addition of a wall art board, and the Chill-Out Zone will be completed. An environment area page on the school website will also

The trophies and prizes were presented by another co-founder of the tournament, the previous Vicar of Sherston, the Rev Hugh Thomson-Glover.





Walk on the wild side

Last of the fledglings?

The breeding season for many birds is coming to an end after a very difficult spring and early summer.

On a walk around the village in the last few days, a number of nests of chicks were about to fledge including wrens in Grove Wood where young fledglings were calling for the parents to feed them, swallow nests under the eaves of houses on the High Street with very vocal chicks and coots on the Sherston Avon at the bottom of the Cliff where the young are bright red and rust brown in colour. For most local birds these are the last fledglings this year.

Some of the breeding birds in England have already migrated with male cuckoos already back in West Africa.


Butterflies are finally around in good numbers after a very difficult start to the year. The Cliff is a particularly interesting area for butterflies as it has steep slopes which are grazed to keep the more rampant grasses short. Consequently there is a good variety of flowering plants, such as vetches, which a number of butterflies need to feed on. Next time you are walking there keep your eye's out for what's around. An easy to spot species is the marbled white (see photo) and I will be putting a variety of butterfly photos on the Sherston wildlife blog (www. sherstonwildlife.wordpress. com). To identify butterflies



Cricket




