It is now hoped that the project can swiftly move on to the next stage which is the legal completion of all the necessary documentation for the purchase itself and all related transactions.

Since the first MoonWalk in 1998 this unique challenge has brought together over 195,000 women and men who have the united goal of raising money and awareness for vital breast cancer causes.

The MoonWalk London is organised by health charity Walk the Walk Worldwide; this, their flagship event, raised in excess of £5.4 million in 2010 alone, bringing the total to over £50 million in just 13 years.

#### Police News

My colleague PCSO Durry Maule and I are continuing to try to patrol Sherston and other villages as much as possible this year after it was agreed at the Malmesbury and Villages Community Area Partnership meeting in January that high visibility patrolling should be our priority.

We are endeavouring to complement this with advertised quarterly street meetings throughout the year (the last one was on Wednesday 9 February in the High Street and the next will be advertised soon).

Additionally we work to deter antisocial behaviour and detect crime. Leading up to Christmas there were complaints of bad parking outside the school and nearby streets. Mr Bowditch and his team kindly allowed me to address parents about this in a letter sent home with the children around Christmas time, and I have since received no further official complaint.

I also included a consultation sheet asking what local issues we should be concentrating on other than parking. The response was poor, and the only reply about parking was that it's not a problem the Police should be dealing with. Please contact us to let us know what you think.

I am also investigating a spate of antisocial behaviour occurring between Sherston and Pinkney along the main road where property is being damaged. This behaviour is not only disruptive for those who live in the area but also uses up valuable Police time and resources to investigate.



## TREEtalk

**APRIL 2011**

## **Grove Wood**

If you go down to the wood today you're in for a big surprise! There is a splendid path going up to the top, along and down the other side thanks to the Community Payback Team. Where the wood has been cleared there are wild flowers springing up due to increased light. There is lots of bluebell foliage appearing at the top edge by the path, the lesser celandine, wood anemone and sweet violets are blooming. The dog's mercury, which is much in evidence, should reduce as it likes deep shade allowing more light-loving plants to emerge. The wild native daffodils planted last autumn are blooming; the snowdrops by the river are now past their best.

Final clearing down by the river is now completed for this season. The team has been digging holes in readiness for the Sherston School children to plant the trees they have been growing at school in the 'Tree for Life' project. Snowdrop plants very kindly donated by Pinkney Park have been planted along the riverbank. Native bulbs that were planted in pots last autumn are ready to plant out; any volunteers to do this will be very welcome. Contact below.

## Waste change

Changes to Wiltshire's waste collection service were given the go-ahead by Wiltshire Council on 22 February 2011. Everyone in Wiltshire will now receive exactly the same service, which will include kerbside recycling for more materials including plastic bottles and cardboard.

During October and November 2011 all households will start to receive a fortnightly collection of plastic bottles and cardboard, in addition to the existing fortnightly black box collection for paper, cans, glass, foil, clothes and shoes.

From February to March 2012 the county-wide garden waste collection service will be introduced for all those who request it and fortnightly collections of all other household waste in the north and south of the county, in line with the east and west where fortnightly collections are already in place.

The new bins for cardboard and plastic bottles collections will be distributed from September, to those households which currently don't have them. All changes to the waste and recycling collection services are set to be completed in the spring of 2012.

This county-wide decision meets the needs of many local people (adults and young people) who identified in the Malmesbury & the Villages Community Plan 2009-2013 that they wanted to see

The award is being made and designed by Glass Designer Helen Scarrett who was a friend of both Lisa and Paul. This award demonstrates Lisa's love, pride and respect for a very great man, who she thinks was probably the best mayor that Malmesbury never had.

Paul's commitment was not only to Malmesbury but to the surrounding villages and Lisa is asking that everyone nominates a local group that works to benefit the community, perhaps those without publicity or status. Paul understood that it is these groups that underpin the whole of the community and should be recognised and Lisa agrees.

## Wiltshire Air Ambulance



#### Windflowers

You've still time in early April to see the beautiful sheets of white windflowers in Grove Wood. *Anemone nemorosa* or wood anemones are one of a number of indicator plants of ancient woodlands due to their slow colonisation. The amount of wood anemones in Grove Wood may then be evidence that the wood has been in existence over a very long period.

Greek mythology says that Anemos, the gods of the winds, send their namesakes the anemones on the earliest days of spring as the heralds of their coming only opening when the wind blows hence the name windflower. The myths also relate that the anemone sprang from the tears of Aphrodite as she wandered through woodland mourning the death of her love, Adonis. In folklore the anemone is believed to bring luck and protection against evil. The flower was said to foretell rain by closing its petals, and fairies were believed to sleep beneath the petals during the night after they closed at sunset.

## Pancake Paradise



## Steam nearly reaches Sherston

The Three Cathedrals Express passed under the Fosse Way between Sherston and Alderton on St David's Day (1 March) this year. The carriages were being pulled by engine 44932 which is a London Midland & Scottish Railways (LMS) Black Five built at Horwich works in 1945 and restored last year. What a shame the Badminton request stop is no longer in use!

PS - Did you know that the Department of Transport has identified the Fosse Way as a suitable alternative relief road to the M5 and it is to be upgraded to motorway status over the next 5 years?

As an existing road, with pre-Norman interests, it is exempt from the newly instigated national policy statements on infrastructure and the upgrading can go ahead using the little known, but effective road and railway locomotion Act of 1872, as revised under emergency legislation of 1944 Ref: 1/4/11, in order to allow for upgrading of important routes essential for national security. This was last used in Wiltshire to allow for the upgrading of the road from the A4 across to Neston and Garsdon. The legislations is suitable because most of the road avoids places with more than 500 inhabitants, and the bypass around Cirencester is already in place. The Fosse Way is ideally suited for the upgrade as it naturally provides the shortest distance between Exeter and Bath in the Southwest and Leicester and Lincoln in the Northeast. The upgrade between Leicester and Newark has already been completed to dual carriageway status.





Hi! I'm Helen, and I've been involved in Guiding on and off since 1959.


