

There's no doubt that in January the whole parish reacted superbly to the challenges caused by the worst winter weather for nearly 30 years.

There are countless stories of good deeds amongst neighbours, friends and relatives. These include reports of people checking on the elderly and disabled, collecting shopping, and offering lifts to the surgery and hospital. The Neighbourhood Watch scheme swung into action early, showing what a valuable service its volunteers provide. There's no doubt that at such times the benefits of living in a close-knit and caring community come into their own.

If it ever needed emphasising, the value of having our own local services was thoroughly underlined last month. All our local retailers did a marvellous job in keeping their doors open and their shelves well stocked – particularly Tucks and Sherston Post Office Stores, which continued to provide essential day to day foodstuffs. Praise is also due to the suppliers that battled through the snow and ice with deliveries.

The Tolsey surgery deserves special thanks for providing an absolutely first class service at a very difficult time for many, especially those who had suffered falls in the icy conditions. Could you imagine Sherston without its own surgery?

Let's not forget our local garages for so often going the extra mile in ensuring that drivers could get their vehicles started and repaired. Nor should we overlook the emergency services and Wiltshire Council staff across so many departments, including Highways with their grit lorries and snow ploughs.

The experience of the last few weeks should make us all even more determined to support and indeed enhance our local services.

Yes to slow down

The parish council has supported the recommendations in Wiltshire Council's recent comprehensive review of all 330 speed limits on A and B class roads in the county as regards the B4040 on both sides of the village. These are to reduce the current speed limit of 60 mph between Pinkney and Malmesbury and Sherston and Luckington to 50mph. In addition, support has been given to Luckington Parish Council's view that the limit on the B4040 from Luckington to the county boundary be similarly reduced to 50 mph. In the Wiltshire review this remained at 60 mph.

With a large number of speed limit alterations likely as a result of the review process, complete implementation is likely to take up to three years. A review of all C class and unclassified roads in the county is also to be undertaken, although probably not until 2011.

Gritty issues

It has become apparent during the recent icy weather that neither the Sherston to Norton road, nor the road to Grittleton from Lordswood to the Alderton junction are on the schedule for gritting by Wiltshire Council. It is felt that these are important routes for many residents and the parish council is therefore seeking their addition to the gritting regime.

The wintry conditions have also brought concerns about empty grit bins. The best way to deal with this is to make a complaint to Wiltshire Council using the CLARENCE system. The phone number is 0800 23 23 23 - from landlines within Wiltshire: or 01225 77 72 34 from mobiles and from outside Wiltshire. Alternatively email clarence@wiltshire.gov. uk or report the matter on line at http://localview.wiltshire.gov.uk/LocalView/ReportAFault.aspx. Should you have any requests for additional grit bins please contact the parish council.

Please remember that the grit provided in the bins is intended for public highways and footpaths, rather than for private driveways or paths. There have been several reports of people taking large quantities of grit away for their own use. In particular the bin at Anthony Close, where a number of residents are elderly and disabled, has been raided with individuals seen removing bags and boxfuls of grit in their vehicles. Abuse of this kind should be reported to the Police and Wiltshire Council.

Churchyard

The parochial church council has written to the parish council warning that Sherston churchyard is almost at full capacity and will be unable to accommodate many more burials.

The parish council is the civil burial authority and as such has helped maintain the churchyard by contributing to its costs. Where however the parish churchyard is declared formally full it then falls to the parish council to provide a new burial ground or cemetery. Locally Luckington churchyard was declared full some years ago and accordingly Luckington PC provides a cemetery adjoining the Sherston Road.

In these circumstances it is considered good practice for both the parochial church council and the parish council to liaise closely to provide the best long term solution for the parish. This early warning of the problem is therefore appreciated. Discussions on the timing for a new burial ground, size of site required and location will now begin. All concerned are fully aware of the importance to residents of this sensitive subject.

Parkinga solution?

The proposal by a resident, publicised in last month's Cliffhanger, for car parking to be provided on the recreation ground has brought forward many comments to the parish council both for and against. The reason behind the scheme is to alleviate parking problems in the central area of the village, particularly the High Street.

By the January meeting of the parish council, some 25 comments had been received with more arriving on the day of the meeting itself. Most were in writing, and many people had taken time and effort not only to comment on the proposal in hand but also to offer their views on the extent of the problem and to propose solutions of their own. The parish council is pleased with this level of response. which will help considerably in reaching a decision as to whether or not to take the proposal forward.

Given the length of some of the comments, and in view of the high level of interest in the subject, the parish council agreed to adjourn any decision until its next meeting on 11 February. This will allow time for all councillors to consider the representations in detail and for any residents who have not yet commented to do so. One parking issue which needs to be resolved quickly, however, is the problem of access for emergency vehicles to Silver Street and Cliff Road and especially to the corner between them. An elderly resident with disabilities has expressed concern about this, as have others. The parish council is therefore asking both Highways and Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service to investigate the problem and if necessary propose a solution.



Precept held

The parish council has set its precept for the next financial year. This is the amount that council taxpayers contribute towards the council's costs. The amount is included in the total council tax bill which is collected by Wiltshire Council and which will be notified to taxpayers during March.

There have been very few new taxable properties in the parish over the last year, while inflation has been low or non-existent and the economy has remained weak. It has therefore been agreed that the the precept should be held at the 2009/10 level. The total figure then remains at £22,400.

The council's detailed budget for 2010/11 is still to be agreed and will have to work within the constraints of the precept remaining unchanged. While the council has a number of ongoing projects such as Grove Wood, Recreation Ground railings, Sportsfield improvements, additional allotments and the new walks booklet it is hoped that these will be assisted financially by successful grant applications to ensure their early completion. There is, however, likely to be greatly increased competition for grant funding over the next few years and it will therefore be vital to thoroughly explore all avenues of possible finance.

Keep calling

The parish council will not be taking up BT's offer to adopt the Willesley and Pinkney telephone kiosks. Under this scheme, BT would disconnect the service and the community pay £1 for the kiosk and take responsibility for its future maintenance. Parish council's view is that both kiosks provide a vital lifeline, particularly in emergencies, and should remain operated by BT. The kiosk in Sherston High Street is unaffected and will remain in service for the foreseeable future.

Allotments – land needed

With a list of 25 residents waiting for plots and with the increasing interest in 'growing your own' showing no sign of diminishing, the parish council is now actively seeking land to provide additional allotments. Ideally the land should be within easy walking distance of the centre of the village, adjoin the highway and have a water supply available. The land can either be purchased outright or taken on a long lease. If you either own or know of a piece of suitable land which might be available please contact the Clerk, Mrs Sarah Wood, at 23 Cliff Road Sherston SN16 0LN, 840351 or email the details to her at clerk@sherston.org.uk.

On the subject of bonfires, it has been agreed by the parish council to alter the present conditions for the Green Lane plots to allow only bonfires containing materials produced on the site with such fires to be attended at all times. This condition will come into effect from the end of March. An agreement on a new lease of the site to the parish council from Wiltshire Council has now been reached although not completed.

A review of allotment rents was undertaken at the January parish council meeting. Rents had remained at £5 per plot for some 25 years with an additional £3 charge for water following a supply being obtained some 15 years ago. Taking into account the likely new rent for the entire site payable to Wiltshire Council, as well as water charges, maintenance and administration costs for the forthcoming year, the parish council has agreed to increase the rent for a full plot to £18 pa. For half plots the figure is £12, with £8 for one third plots. These figures include water charges. The Sherston Allotments and Garden Association (SAGA) sought a lower level of increase on behalf of its members but council felt they were fair and reasonable compared with charges elsewhere.

Photo shoot

Residents in the conservation area of the village should not be alarmed if they find their property or small architectural details of it being photographed over the next few weeks or so. In the new walks booklet, to be published later this year, there will be a walk around the village and the parish footpath group needs some photos to illustrate it. If you do have concerns however, please contact the Clerk, Mrs Sarah Wood.

THE ANCIENT ORDER OF SHERSTON MANGOLD HURLI

With February seeing the first hopeful signs of spring, many members' thoughts turn to sowing their seed.

As to varieties of mangold, Yellow Eckendorf has long been a Sherston favourite, but last year Red Mammoth was also grown. There is no doubt that in the culinary stakes Red Mammoth is a winner with Mr William Tulberg producing an excellent soup and Mr Robert Strong some superb chips. It must be said, however, that Yellow Eckendorf was used to great effect in a lasagne by Mr Jock Walker as can be verified by those members of the Malmesbury Young Farmers Club who readily polished off many a plateful. Also, who can possibly forget Mrs Penny Forster's succulent mangold muffin at the 2009 Hurl? From a hurling viewpoint, however, Yellow Eckendorf is absolutely outstanding, producing large torpedo shaped roots with all the aerodynamics necessary for a winning hurl.

For the 2010 season, a supply of Yellow Eckendorf seed will again be provided by E.W. King & Co Ltd of Kelvedon Essex (www.kingsseeds.com/index.asp), which will be available in mid March from Sherston Parva Nursery, Sherston Post Office Stores and the Rattlebone Inn. The seed is free and comes with full cultivation instructions, although a donation to Sherston 1016 funds would be appreciated. For those wishing to be adventurous by experimenting with Red Mammoth, a limited amount of seed will be available from members of the Order (usually to be found in the bar at the Rattlebone) or by emailing ebeplaced@aol. com.

It seems that the Keeper of the Lists, Mr Graham Hayman, will have a busy month ahead as no fewer than 14 applications have been made for the honour of being proclaimed the 2010 Mangold Maid. Emergency team?

While there can be no doubt that the parish coped very well with the recent winter weather there was one area which caused concern - icy pavements, particularly in the central area of the village.

It is extremely unlikely the Wiltshire Council will ever have the resources to deal with this problem for us. Could we then make a difference with some organised self help?

An idea is that the parish council maintain its own stock of grit, perhaps supplied by Wiltshire Council, which would then be spread by a team of volunteers. Given a large enough team it should be possible to clear some essential routes in the village, such as those connecting the surgery with the Post Office and Tucks. Other problem areas such as Anthony Close and North End Gardens could also be covered.

At this stage parish council is exploring the insurance and liability issues with its insurers and other advisors. If an emergency team is a possibility there is no reason why it should not be in place by next winter. Hopefully there would be no shortage of volunteers. After all, 40 or so turn up in the High street at 7.00am every Boules Day to lay all that sand.

Shiver me timbers!

Snow is still coating the landscape as I write this so all activity in Grove Wood has ground to a halt. We did manage one good session before the weather made conditions too slippery. Under the expert guidance of arborist, John Lloyd, ten volunteers cut down hazel stools and brambles, creating space and light in the neglected woodland. John meanwhile tackled the tough stuff with his chainsaw. We have salvaged lots of slim branches for pea sticks and hurdles but there is debris to clear and burn. By the time this goes to press, I hope we will have had a second volunteer session at the wood to tackle this mountain, ably fortified by Sue McKechnie's delicious, homemade soup. We will be working every Sunday morning in February between 10am and 1pm so please come along and lend a hand if only for an hour or so. Just turn up - we need the help. We will also be planting 1000 snowdrops on Saturday 27 February from 10 am and again would welcome as many volunteers as possible. Gloves, tools and hot soup supplied. As snow falls, air is trapped amongst the flakes and provides good insulation. Plants and animals make the most of this blanket as the temperature underneath doesn't usually fall below freezing.

A regional name for the snowdrop is the 'snowpiercer'. The tip of the flowering stem is covered by a special protective leaf that allows the flower to force its way through the snow.

The recent World Record attempt to plant the most number of trees by 100 people in just 60 minutes at a single location was achieved at an Irish site. Volunteers at Gransha Wood in Derry planted a whopping 26,422 trees. Makes Grove Wood look easy peasy.

You will also have the opportunity to discuss with health professionals how we might best tackle some of these issues by working together at a community level.

Winter tales

The recent cold weather has prompted two villagers to recollect previous spells of extreme weather.

Ice storm in Sherston

During 1939 war was looming on the horizon. It was my first year at school. I was 14 years of age and in July I left to begin my working life. The summer was warm and we were unprepared for what lay ahead. In December it had become icy cold with heavy frosts. We had heavy rain all one day and night, which froze as it settled.

In the morning I walked outside and witnessed a sight I had never seen before or since. The whole countryside was encased in ice, with each blade of grass in a capsule of ice about half an inch thick, making it feel as though I was walking on broken glass. The telephone wires and electric cables, which were three or four times their original thickness, were sagging near to or on the ground like giant necklaces. Large tree limbs as well as whole trees were crashing to the ground under the weight of the thick ice.

The bird population suffered badly. Many had frozen on the trees and fallen to the ground and were now lying on their backs, legs pointing to the sky. Every night the stillness, so noticeable on frosty nights, would be broken every four of five minutes by an enormous crack like a gunshot, followed by a crunch as another large tree or branch crashed to the ground. I earned 13 shillings taking telegrams to people who had lost their phone lines. It was a couple of weeks before any sort of normality returned.

Colder

When I was a schoolboy during the war, I waited with others for a Bristol bus to take us to school at Malmesbury. It could be almost guaranteed that the roads would be covered with snow and ice for at least six weeks of the winter months. With temperatures occasionally falling to -20°, the river would freeze over, encouraging as many as 100 people to skate on Badminton Lake. Bristol suffered almost nightly bombing in those days,

sometimes shattering the bus windows. But as long as its engine ran, the bus would come, with its wooden seats giving us a cold but merry trip to school. Should the bus fail to arrive, a favourite trick was to cadge a lift on the convoys of stone lorries ferrying stone from Sherston's three quarries to the runways at Kemble, and Lvnham Wroughton airfields (Hullavington not being on route), usually at 60mph. Wiltshire 2026 response

With invaluable assistance from Sherston resident and professional planner Mike Johnson, the parish council has submitted its response on what is the first of a series of consultations by Wiltshire Council on its proposals for a new plan for Wiltshire's future to 2026.

Unsurprisingly, much of the council's discussion centred on the likely level of housing development in the parish. While it was accepted that there is room for some new houses in the village, the parish council felt that Sherston would be unable to accommodate as many as 62, which was the number originally suggested by Wiltshire Council. A maximum of 35 housing units for Sherston was thought more appropriate, with these to be provided over two phases -15 by 2015 and another 20 by 2026. It would be preferable for these developments to be on brownfield sites and /or any other sites lying within the existing settlement boundary.

It was also thought that mention needed to be made of other issues and opportunities of relevance to Sherston including –

- To identify and support a future appropriate use for the vacant Old School premises on the High Street
- The retention and improvement of existing local services especially the Surgery, Post Office and Village Hall including the provision of new services where needed
- The improvement of local public transport to be more consumer led as regards destination and frequency
- A reduction in traffic speed and in the number of non local HGVs passing through the parish
- Improvement and retention of public open space, rights of way and allotments
- The provision, in response to an identifiable need within the parish, of extra care housing on suitable brownfield sites
- An acknowledgement of the fact that Sherston has been subjected to a significant level of housing growth over the last decade in excess of 70 dwellings have been built in the last five years. The parish council would ideally wish to see a period of consolidation before further development takes place. Hence, no significant private housing development should be encouraged over the next five years
- The need to encourage new employment development in appropriate locations in and around the village


The process of producing the final Wiltshire 2026 plan will take a considerable time, during which there will be further consultation opportunities for both residents and the parish council.


First Sherston John Rattlebone Scouts Group Grand Christmas Draw

Amazing and preposterous





Chris's portfolio includes spells directing at the New Vic and Salisbury Playhouse. As an actor, he recently appeared at the Hampstead Theatre in the highly acclaimed revival of Frank McGuiness's 'Behold the Sons of Ulster Marching Towards the Somme'. Sue has recently been designing for Sir Alan Ayckbourn's Stephen Joseph Theatre in Scarborough. In the early part of the twentieth century, Constance Smedley was a celebrity: a successful artist, playwright, feminist journalist and author of numerous novels and children's books. She founded the International Lyceum Club for Women, established its clubhouse in London, and oversaw the foundation of similar Lyceum Clubs in Amsterdam, Paris, Berlin and

Florence. A century later there are Lyceum Clubs worldwide. Frank Hatt's play is based on events in the remarkable life of this woman, made all the more remarkable by the fact that from childhood she battled with a disability that paralysed her from the waist down. Her achievements were indeed amazing; her behaviour was often preposterous.





Frank Hatt's writing career began over 50 years ago with a short play at London's Royal Court Theatre. It then suffered a long interruption caused by the need to earn a living. Since he took early retirement from employment, six of Frank's recent plays have been performed professionally, mostly touring Gloucestershire and the southwest. His interest in Constance Smedley was aroused when he was presented with a large bundle of Smedley family letters that a lady had rescued from a builder's bonfire.
