

Later in the month several members will be going to one of Denman College's Open Days.





Recreation Ground

Residents may have noticed that the stone obelisk in the play area is in the process of being reduced in height. Regretfully last winter took its toll on the stonework which in turn created a safety issue. The obelisk was originally built around an old piece of playground equipment about 25 years or so ago. It is hoped that the remaining structure can be modified for use as either a seat or picnic table.

The old wire fencing along the wall adjoining Court street is due to be repaired although parish council funds do not currently allow for the extension of the metal fencing by the play area along the entire length of the wall. Repairs are also to be undertaken to the wall alongside the Vicarage.

Long summer evenings bring with them an increased use of the Recreation ground. Unfortunately this can sometimes include the drinking of alcohol and subsequent littering with empty glass bottles. On occasions these are found smashed on both the grass and around the playground equipment creating an obvious danger to children. In March we kicked off with the PROPS Bike Surger. There are fewer grinding gears and squeaky brakes around the village following the Bike servicing carried out by PROPS' own bike mechanics, Jon McGee and Andy Howe. This pair of cycle-gurus laboured long and hard, washing, tightening, lubricating and fine-tuning an array of Sherston pedal driven transport.

On the May Day Bank holiday we held our inaugural B2B Boules Tournament. Thanks to all the teams who took part in a very enjoyable competition and congratulations to The Hoose (a.k.a. Hector, Kenny and Shane) in winning the first of what we hope will become an annual event.

Also in May, we had our B2B Wine Tasting. Huge thanks to Jackie from Bona Wines for an entertaining and informed guide to the wines we would encounter en route and to Capt. and Mrs. Matthews for hosting a great evening at Pinkney Park.

The Badminton Railway Line

Sherston was considered by the South Wales Railway not once, but twice, for inclusion on its proposed new line between Cardiff and London. In November 1864, together with The Great Western, plans for route 110 were drawn up and deposited with the Clerk of the Peace in the Marlborough Court, by Messrs Hargrove, Fowler & Blunt. This first more southerly route would have led via Didmarton, dissected Sherston between Pinkney Park and Pinkney Court and continued South of Malmesbury. Then, in November 1895, a more serious second proposal for route 149 with The Midland Railway, was deposited by Messrs Downing & Hancock, for a more northerly route from Didmarton, via Sopworth, Sherston at Vancelette's Barn, Easton Grey, Shipton Moyne, North of Malmesbury to Oxford and North London.

The Badminton Line, which was finally accepted, is 30 miles long and was opened in 1903, then the most lavish and expensive of all GWR's 'cut-offs'. It crossed two other lines, the less important Dauntsey to Malmesbury line and the more significant connection between Gloucester to Bristol at Westerleigh, which can be seen today over the M4. The estimated cost in 1900 was £1.9 million, which is the equivalent today of £75.5 million. Built to connect the seven kilometre Severn tunnel, which was opened in 1886 by the GWR, this tunnel was for over 100 years the longest within the UK, until the opening of the Channel Tunnel Rail link in 1985. The Channel Tunnel cost £4.6 billion in 1985, the equivalent of £10.5 billion today, with 80% cost overruns.

Grants

The parish council has recently agreed to make a contribution of £200 to the parish church towards the cost of clearance work in the churchyard so as to make available much needed additional burial space.

A sum of £50 has been awarded to SAGA (Sherston Allotments and Gardens Association) to assist with the provision of a notice board at the allotments on Knockdown Road.

The Luckington potteries

Wilts & Cotswold Potteries Ltd.

The potteries date back to the early 17th century. At that time they were situated on the right hand side of the Bristol road, leading to Acton Turville on the Badminton side.

Pottery made here was exported to all large towns in England and Wales, mostly as garden ornaments and chimney pots.

Towards the end of the 19th century clay was becoming more difficult to find, as all supplies for miles around the pottery had been dug out. A new site for a pottery was found and building work started as the old one closed down.

By 1900 we find a new pottery built on the opposite side of the road just before Hebden Farm. It was built for a Mr James Tanner of the Manor, Luckington. A new kiln, pottery sheds, mill and stores were built.


Mr John Ford from Bristol was chief potter and foreman. It was a thriving business and employed 12 men. Goods were sent to Bristol and Bath, and furnished the gardens of large country houses in the district with garden ornaments, also bricks, ornamental vases and garden figurines and chimney pots, all safely delivered by horse and cart.

James Tanner died in January 1922, followed by his foreman Mr John Ford in February 1922. Mr Tanner bequeathed the potteries to his daughter, Mrs Kate Denly of Corsham. She employed Mr Ayliffe from Acton Turville to build the present house at a cost of £400.

sister in law, the Dowager Duchess of Beaufort, Mrs E A Richards, Baron F De Tuyli, Mr J. Bagnall Bryan and Mr A.M. Harford as Directors, attempted to make the potteries a success again.

Lady Blanche Scott Douglas imported clay from Cornwall to mix with the local clay in an endeavour to produce china jugs, mugs and tableware. Unfortunately the clay was not suitable for this type of work and the end-product was unstable.

Outside the potteries on the grass verge stood a large display cabinet showing the chinaware, but sadly the pottery closed in 1945. The new kiln was never fired and eventually the house became accommodation for farm workers at Hebden



Mrs Denly's son Alfred came to live at the house and to run the business, but unfortunately lack of experience and the fact that most customers only paid their accounts yearly resulted in the business failing. Eventually Mrs Denly sold the potteries to Lady Blanche Scott Douglas.

Lady Blanche Scott Douglas lived at that time at 'Claremont' Luckington and together with her





World Music at Sherston

A musical journey across the Steppes of Asia

As part of the Boules & Carnival week of events a unique concert is being presented in the Church of the Holy Cross on Tuesday 13 July.

Michael Ormiston and Candida Valantino are touring the UK and have added this concert to their schedule.

Their performance includes Mongolian overtone singing where two notes are sung at the same time, It is a special sound made in unison with the tongue, teeth, larynx and palate. To put it simply, it is a replacement of musical instruments with all aspects of vocal organs. To hear it for the first time is a wonder. The technique of throat singing may be easy to write about- but it is almost impossible to actually try to perform. To perform the higher tune, the singer should bend (or fold) the tongue, and tap skilled sounds with the tongue point and whisper through the front teeth. At the same time the converged melody is made by making lips conical. As the

basic tune resonates, a melodic buzzing sound also reverberates.

Michael has studied Khöömii (Overtone Singing) for years visiting Mongolia 6 times learning from masters of the Mongolian tradition. He has appeared recently on the BBC's Sacred Music series and on Aled Jones' The Choir. He has performed on many soundtracks



including Planet Earth, The Golden Compass, Last of the Medicine Men. He has performed for the Dali Lama and at the Many Heavens, One Earth Celebration during the Interfaith Conference and Summit in Windsor Castle last year.



Candida is the only British woman perform Khargyraa, an undertone style of singing from Mongolia and Tuva. She uses Tibetan Singing Bowls, Gongs & Sacred Sound instruments in individual sessions and in

concerts in the UK & Europe.

We now have the promise of a number of ancient, (mostly huge) Family Bibles for our Boules Day Display. Some are over 100 years old and have personal inscriptions on the opening pages. The children at Sherston School recently showed great interest in these and kept telling us 'Grandad's got one,' so if you are willing to show yours please ring 840688.

There will also be a selection of new translations on show including the colourful 'Storyteller Bible' by Bob Hartman. The stories from this have been enacted most Mondays (for five years now) in 'Open the Book' assemblies at the Primary School which cause great hilarity at times whilst being seriously thought-provoking for students and staff alike. 'The Storyteller' is becoming one of the most used Children's Bibles nationally.

The display can be seen on Boules day between 2pm and 4.30pm in Sherston Congregational Chapel on Cliff Road, which is one of Sherston's little-known historical gems. It was founded in 1822 when a farmer generously gave his barn for conversion into a chapel. A small but magnificent organ (which is still in perfect working order and used most Sundays) was fitted into the huge entrance of the barn which by then had windows, a pulpit and a balcony. 30 years the Manse and British Schoolroom had also been given and purchased, the latter being for the 'Education of the poor', according to the deeds.

The picture above shows the balcony much loved by all children and its ancient clock with 'Sherston – JW Gantlett' printed on it because it was made locally, probably in the 19th century. Weather permitting there will be seats and a gazebo in the graveyard area where a record of the headstones and burials will be on show. Might you have an ancestor on this list?

For all those who make the trip down Cliff Road beyond the British Schoolroom (which is also the Congregational Church Hall and therefore maintained by the Chapel) there will be a welcoming portion of strawberries and cream for sale in the garden area, the proceeds of which will go to The Boules Fund. We hope to see you there.

THE ANCIENT ORDER OF SHERSTON MANGOLD HUP

Disaster has struck. Just before dawn on Sunday 20 June this year's mangold crop was completely decimated in an effort to foil an attack by the dreaded Pegomya hyoscyami.

In mid May the Mangold Hurling Association gave an 'All Orders 'alert after it received reports of large swarms of Pegomya hyoscyami amassing on Sedgemoor in Somerset. The Sherston Order immediately reacted with the time honoured practice of drenching the boundary of the Great Mangold Field with copious quantities of Mangold Maid water some of which had been stock piled for years in the cellars of the Rattlebone Inn for just such a purpose. Generations, and indeed gallons, of the water were used in what proved to be a vain attempt to save the crop.

When dealing with Pegomya hyoscyami or mangold fly, it is vital to stop egg laying for otherwise the larvae will hatch within three to seven days and then cause havoc amongst the crop. Drenching with Maid water has hitherto proved highly successful but on this occasion the swarm when it eventually attacked was so large that the usually excellent repellant qualities of the water simply could not cope. Additional measures in the shape of Nic Fisher and Fred Harrison armed

to the hilt with shotguns also failed to halt the swarm. However such was their blind panic on being confronted with the swarm that both started blasting off at point blank range peppering and thereby destroying the crop with shot. Pegomya hyoscyami was victorious without having to lay a single egg.

Nic and Fred had kindly volunteered to stand guard on the crop overnight. Both had been supplied with sets of matching vermilion Damart thermal underwear together with a voluminous sleeping bag. 'Vuvuzelas had nothing on the noise of the swarm' gabbled a still shocked Nic as she was promptly debriefed following the incident. Members of the Order had discovered Nic and Fred wide eyed, sweating and breathless at the scene some hours after the swarm had attacked. Both were unable to recount the full horror of what they had earlier endured and are still receiving counselling for their ordeal every evening in the Rattlebone Inn at around 6pm.

With the Sherston crop reduced to a shot peppered pulp a nationwide search is now underway to secure a sufficient quantity of mangolds for this year's Hurl.

TREEtalk

Plant trees - be-leaf in the future!

Some of the trees from Sherston School's tree nursery will be heading for Grove Wood later this year. There are alders that can be planted along the river bank and some oaks that will replace old trees nearing the end of their life in the wood. There are also some ash trees that will be valuable for future coppicing purposes. It is brilliant that this generation of village school children are being given the chance to provide new stock. They will be able to visit the wood to check on progress and see their names on the trees they initially planted as saplings. Great stuff.

As for the rest of the nursery, (after the school has met its own needs, particularly around their new wildlife pond), we are currently identifying areas in the village that would be suitable for new trees. Potential beneficiaries include the High Street (replacements for the two ailing acacias), the triangle at Manor Close, the Recreation Ground along the Green Lane edge, the Village Hall Field and the Sports Ground. Nothing has been decided and we shall be canvassing village opinion on the best sites for a range of species that include the ones already mentioned as well as birch, beech, rowan and cherry trees.

Seeking funding for Grove Wood

With work already underway on improving paths through Grove Wood, (thank you, Cotswold Wardens), it is important to find ways to save money where we can. We're looking into 'green' grants that are available to help fund the purchase of gravel and other building materials. The Community Payback team who have achieved great results on the fencing around the wood should be back to start on the riverside path in early August.

Next phase of (wood) work

Suitably re-juvenated by the summer break, our volunteers will be asked to get their sleeves rolled up from October onwards. Now that the first section is completed, we shall be starting coppicing and clearing in section two, as well as continuing bulb planting – not just snowdrops but native bluebells and violets too. Our expert John has also asked that anyone who spots something interesting growing in the wood should let us know so we can include it in our inventory, soon to appear on the Sherston website. New volunteers will be warmly welcomed and will get the chance to sign on the dotted line at our stand during Boules Day on 17 July. See you then and have a great summer holiday – TREEtalk will resume in October.


