Eco-Schools Silver Award

Sherston School EcoTeam have recently been presented with the Silver Award, and are now one step (but a large step) away from securing the prestigious Green Flag Award.

The year five team have excelled in their efforts to encourage re-cycling. Under their watchful eye, each class has been encouraged and routinely monitored on paper, card, and plastics collections. Paper re-use is encouraged throughout the school and is becoming more commonly practiced. The team reports back to school management and parents. They are hoping that a recent collection of old ink cartridges and mobile phones will net a reward of £50 from Recycool. A few months ago, they successfully lobbied Wilts Council to provide black re-cycling bins for collecting glass bottles, jars and tins from the kitchen. Well done the EcoTeam.

Only 300 schools in the country have achieved Green Flag status. New projects will be undertaken and externally assessed, including projects for monitoring and reducing energy use and provision for green energy.

Venerable visitors



A flock of Waxwings has been seen feeding on the apple tree in Sopworth Lane by the school wildlife area. Commonly seen in the North-East, they are rare visitors to the South-West. It is thought that shortage of food and heavy snow has driven the birds further south this year. They are distinctive with their crest and red tipped wings. The Sopworth Lane tree has held onto its fruit much longer this year, making it a welcome food source. And they don't seem too perturbed by noisy school children. Must be hungry!

A Redpoll was sighted on the bird feeder within the school wildlife area. Native of the Arctic Circle, they too come to the UK in search of winter food; and in large numbers. A well stocked feeding station is most likely to attract these quite tame little finches characterised by a red patch on top of the head.

2011 Census

The 'Tree for Life' saplings they planted 2 years ago in the then newly created allotment area, are now ready to take their places in the community. Some are destined for the churchyard, some for the Rec; most for Grove Wood.

Planting work will hopefully be completed in March; current children in weekday afternoons, and by ex year six (from 2009 and 2010) at weekends. Every child will take their tree from the school grounds to its destination and fix a label with his/her name. And thereafter to visit, watch over and care for their own tree, as they grow up.

My colleague PCSO Durry Maule and I are continuing to try to patrol Sherston and other villages as much as possible this year after it was agreed at the Malmesbury and Villages Community Area Partnership meeting in January that high visibility patrolling should be our priority.

We are endeavouring to complement this with advertised quarterly street meetings throughout the year. The most recent of these was on Wednesday 9 February in the High Street, and the next will be advertised soon.

Additionally we work to deter antisocial behaviour and to detect crime.

Recently there have been complaints of bad parking outside the school and nearby streets. Mr Bowditch and his team have kindly allowed me to address parents about this in a letter sent home with the children around Christmas time but the problem continues. I have no option but to respond to these complaints unless you think the police should be concentrating on issues other than parking. Please contact us to let us know what you think.

I am also investigating a spate of antisocial behaviour occurring between Sherston and Pinkney along the main road where property is being damaged. This behaviour is not only disruptive for those who live in the area but also uses up valuable police time and resources to investigate. TREEtalk

MARCH 2011

Grove Wood

Coppicing and clearing is now completed for this season. Tree and hedge planting is underway. The snowdrops planted by the river last spring have done well and more will be planted this spring. The Community Payback Team is doing a great job with the paths. Go and see! More details on the management of the wood next month. Don't forget that if you spot any notable wildlife or plants in Grove Wood to report it on sherston.net/ local-groups/trees/grove-wood/ Leave a reply to help with the botanical survey.

Tree diseases

New diseases have been brought into Britain on large 'instant' trees, packaging materials etc. mainly from Asia. Phytophthora ramorum, is an infection known as 'sudden oak death' although it is attacking Japanese larch trees. Millions have already been felled, as a result of the infection or to stop its spread. Other woody shrubs such as rhododendrons can be infected. You will have noticed the horse chestnut trees affected by the chestnut leaf miner, a moth that makes the leaves turn brown and conkers fall early. This does not kill the trees but weakens them so that if they then are affected by other diseases, such as bleeding canker, they succumb. Oak trees now face acute oak decline with thousands already affected. Forest Research, a branch of the Forestry Commission, is working on the prevention of these diseases. It will be sad if so many of our native trees go the way of the elms. The Forestry Commission is urging the public to report diseased plants and walkers to clean boots between visiting forests.

Rec repairs

Residents will have noticed that a substantial piece of dry stone wall collapsed recently on the western boundary of the recreation ground. Rebuilding is now in hand but parents are reminded to please ensure that their children do not remove stones from any of the walls. This not only weakens the walls but can also bring extremely dangerous results.

The parish council is expected to agree the repair of some the playground equipment this month having received estimates from three contractors. It is hoped that the repairs can be undertaken in good time for the Easter holiday period.

Another classroom

Work started in February on the next project for Sherston School's wildlife area. An outdoor classroom, with tiered timber seating on the mound taking shape near the pond area. There will be a stage finished in bark chips, a willow hedge suitable for sculpturing, a path and an archway leading onto the next project area; a shady chill out zone. And beyond that, will be a nature trail.








New path


