# Sherston Neighbourhood Plan – A look into the future

As has been reported in the previous Cliffhanger, Sherston has been selected as a Front Runner in the South West to produce a Neighbourhood Plan. Provided that it eventually receives support from all the Parish, it will, when approved, form the definitive framework for any development in the village for decades to come.

Wiltshire Council has been awarded up to £20,000 by Central Government to help us produce the final document.

An initial meeting was held after Christmas and the next step is to set up a Steering Group consisting of about 15 representatives selected from various local interest groups in the village.

This group will meet in February and set the Terms of Reference for the forthcoming plan and consider its likely composition.

It will look at any change or development that it thinks will benefit the village in the future.

It is important at this first stage that any such change being considered is looked at in principle and that the issue of where anything will actually go will be addressed at a later stage.

It is intended to hold a public meeting in the spring to invite people to express a view about the key issues that concern local residents and to provide more details about the way that the Neighbourhood Plan will be handled.

An early element is the housing needs survey which has already been distributed to every household in the village.

Looking further down the line it should be noted that the proposed Neighbourhood Plan will carry no weight unless and until it has been put in front of the entire Parish in the form of a local referendum and receives at least 50% support. It has been considered by an independent inspector (who will be checking to ensure that the proposed plan is in conformity with both national and local planning policy). It is hoped that this will happen in spring 2013. We shall as a matter of course also consult our neighbouring communities.

There will be regular updates in future Cliffhanger editions but if anyone has any queries they should be addressed to the Parish Clerk, Sarah Wood on 840197.

# Health concerns associated with dog fouling

The Director of Public Health and Public Protection at NHS Wiltshire is bringing to people's attention the health risks associated with dog fouling.

The parasitic infection toxocariasis, which is caused by roundworms that live in the digestive system of dogs, provides the greatest health risk. Humans become infected by ingestion of eggs in soil contaminated by dog faeces.

Whilst toxocariasis is rare, the symptoms are unpleasant. They vary depending on where in the body the infection occurs and can include coughing, stomach pain, headaches, swollen lymph glands and eye disorders.

'Dog fouling is not just unpleasant; it can also be the cause of some serious health problems' says Maggie Rae, Director of Public Health and Public Protection. 'Young children are particularly at risk of getting toxocariasis because of their play habits.'

Toxocara worms produce eggs which are released in the faeces of infected animals and contaminate soil. Because young children often play on the ground, and many young children have a habit of eating soil, they are more likely to come into contact with the eggs.

'Dog fouling is a particular problem during the winter months as people seem less inclined to clear up after their dogs in the cold, wet and dark and the mess stays on the ground for longer, especially in frozen and icy weather.'

Practising good hygiene can help prevent toxocariasis and many other infections, and it is also important that dog owners clean up after their dog.

- washing your hands well with soap and water after handling pets or coming into contact with soil or sand;
- teaching children to always wash their hands after playing with dogs or cats, after playing outdoors, after gardening and before eating;
- washing food that may have come into contact with soil;
- not allowing children to play in areas that are covered in dog or cat faeces; and
- teaching children that it's dangerous to eat dirt or soil.

## Cotswold Conservation Board hedgelaying two day course for beginners in Sherston



Cotswold Conservation Board are holding a two day hedgelaying course for beginners in Sherston on 25 to 26 February. The course is suitable for anybody with little or no experience of hedgelaying and costs £99.

The traditional art of hedgelaying has been part of the Cotswolds landscape for centuries. Originally used for the purposes of stock control, the skill of laying a hedge was once common practice. However, due to the introduction of cheaper and less labour intensive methods of stock control, this traditional form of land management is now a much rarer skill.

There are many styles of hedgelaying throughout the UK. Here in the Cotswolds the most commonly used are the Midlands style and the Somerset style and it is these that we teach on our courses. For further

These walks are becoming very popular with more than 20 people taking part every time. Hats off to Sue for running them and to the Rattlebone for the very welcome snack at the finish.





No more burials, but 40 years later three cremation urns with name plaques:

As detailed above, 37 graves remain visible, the last being number 39 from 1942, and there are three Remembrance Plaques, the last one being number 42 from 198?. The earliest date is 1822, number 1. (The same year as displayed on the front roadside of the Chapel with the word 'Founded'). Over 90 burials are recorded in the church register since 1822, so several layers?

As it is now 70 years since a burial took place here, some of the falling headstones need to be resited. We would therefore like to create, if permitted, an attractive public, but protected, Garden of Remembrance with a left-hand wall along which the 'falling' headstones can be displayed together with this inventory.

All information and ancient books will soon be sent to the Wiltshire History Centre for Archive storage.

#### Stay out Stranger advice

If you do not recognise or are not expecting a caller, follow the 'Stay out Stranger' advice.

By following the tips below when there is an unexpected caller at the door, you can reduce your chances of becoming a victim of crime to bogus callers, such as rogue traders and doorstep sellers.

- Do not open the door to anyone you don't know or are not expecting
- If someone comes to your door and you aren't expecting a caller, it is important that you check who it is by using a spy-hole or by looking through a window. Official visitors will always arrange an appointment with you beforehand – if no appointment has been made, don't open
- Don't keep large amounts of cash at home, keep purses and wallets out of sight and never keep PIN numbers with credit or debit cards
- Never agree to have work carried out by someone who is just passing, or believe such people when they claim that repairs need to be made. If you think work might need to be done

## From the

The following extracts are taken from the Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held in the village school on 11 April 1983.

The Chairman of the Parish Council, Mr John Weeks, welcomed parishioners and spoke of yet another busy year for the Parish Council. Street lighting had been a major concern, and a policy of replacing worn out time switches with more reliable photocells had been undertaken. Some progress had been made over the High Street lighting and it was hoped that the Trunk Road lighting scheme would soon be completed.

The Christmas lights had again been much appreciated but vandalism had unfortunately taken a toll on a

number of them.

Mr Weeks thanked the business people involved for their hospitality and donation of electricity for the lights. He also thanked Mr J Neal and Mr G Goulding for generously giving their time to erect them.

Following the emergencies of last winter, two electricity liaison officers had been appointed for the village and should a major emergency occur again better communications had been established with the S.E.B. A local organiser to co-ordinate the work of snow plough operators and to arrange for extra help when necessary in snowy weather had also been appointed.

The Clerk presented the Parish Councils financial statement for 1982/1983. The biggest expenditure had been street lighting, over £2,000. Repairs to the play equipment accounted for most of the Recreation Ground expenditure and £418 of the Sportsfield expenses was for mowing. Administration costs were approximately the same as last year except for an increase in the fee paid for the audit of the Parish accounts. On the credit side £251 VAT had been reclaimed and bank interest of £254 added to the account. The Allotments were self financing and so was the tree planting scheme.

Mr Eric Mandell Chairman of the Environmental Committee reported that the Committee's main

concern had been tree planting again this year, though consideration had been given to footpaths and their signposting. Trees had been planted in Anthony Close and by the wall surrounding Messrs T.H.Whites yard and grants of £35 and £60 had been received from C.P.R.E. and the County Council respectively.

Mr Ken Fabray Chairman of the Allotments Committee reported on the new system of collecting rents for the Allotments this year in order to reduce administrative costs. Four plots were at present untenanted, but in general the allotments were kept in very reasonable condition.

Over £500 had been spent on repairs to the play equipment on the Recreation Ground this year. Mr Graham Singer Chairman of the Sports field and Recreation Ground Committee reported and the Scout headquarters nearby was now nearing completion. A request for the stone plaque by the entrance steps to the Recreation Ground to be refurbished was passed to the Parish Council. It was anticipated that the use and scope of the Sports field would be extended when the proposed changing facilities were available. Agreement had been reached with the Football Club on the building, and work on this had commenced.

Mr Butler reported that £55 had been received from the Iddols and Duncan Neal Trusts, which was shared with Didmarton, and this had been distributed to old age pensioners and widows at £1 a time. The possibility of investing the trust monies to produce a higher income was being investigated. The meeting was reminded that the Trust was originally set up to provide a sack of coal at Christmas for eligible recipients.

It would seem that nothing much changes in Sherston. Twenty-nine years after this Annual Parish Meeting, the January 2012 Parish Council meeting included these items on the agenda:

Despite huge progress since 2009, our numbers are dwindling and there is too much work for too few people. What a pity if Grove Wood has to stop now when we've achieved so much. So, what are you going to do about it?

As Tree Warden, I feel a personal sense of responsibility. Maybe the monthly news in the Cliffhanger isn't inspiring enough. Possibly, more could be made of group emails to the 60+ residents who have already 'signed up'. Perhaps, it's just too much like hard work on a Sunday morning. Whatever the reasons, it seems the vast majority of villagers simply don't want to know. And that's a shame – and a real dilemma for the volunteers who are still enthusiastic and want the project to succeed. They're not doing it just for the good of their health. We see Grove Wood as a village asset and an investment to benefit present and future generations of Sherstonians.

Numbers have been on the slide since before Christmas. On the last two Sundays, only four people have turned up. In the 'heyday' of 2010, we were getting as many as 16 volunteers at a time. Progress was fast and visible to everyone. The difference between the tamed and untamed sections was spectacular: the creation of space for existing trees to breathe and new ones to flourish; the emergence of long-dormant woodland plants; the building of fences, steps, paths and hedges. We all felt a sense of pride and achievement. Dog walkers

and ramblers commented favourably but never came back to help.

There's still time to keep the momentum going until the beginning of March when work stops for the year. Just let me know if you want to get involved or simply turn up on Sunday mornings any time between 10.00am and 1.00pm (soup and bread at half-time).
