The future of the old war memorial

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is considering the possibility of moving the old war memorial from the lychgate to another position, possibly inside the church. The reason for this is its deterioration. Despite being repaired not that long ago, penetrating damp is lifting the inscription from the memorial and soon parts of it will be illegible. It does not seem likely that it will be able to remain in its current position without regular repair to damage caused by damp. This then raises questions of organising and paying for such work as it appears that no group actually bears responsibility for the memorial.

The PCC would like to hear from anyone who wishes to put forward a view on this issue. Do you know of any group that is responsible for the memorial? Should the war memorial be moved? If so, where should it be placed? Or should it be repaired again and left in situ? If so, how can it be maintained in the long term?



Sherston Old School

COMMUNITY INTEREST COMPAN'

Congratulations to Paul and Gail for a successful first month in the new Post Office Stores. Now that Phase One is over, it's a good time to reflect on how far we've come and look at what we still have to do to complete the conversion of Sherston Old School during 2012. Let's begin at the beginning:

Why was SOSCIC (Sherston Old School Community Interest Company) set up?

After the new primary school opened in 2005, Sherston Old School became redundant. There was one application to develop the site for commercial purposes but it fell through. To avoid the building being converted to residential use (an application roundly condemned by residents), the Parish Council intervened to purchase a 999-year lease on the premises from the Diocese of Bristol. It then looked for a method by which everyone in the community could become directly involved. The intention was to form a team of people with appropriate professional knowledge to run the project and bring it to a successful conclusion on the PC's – and the community's -behalf.

The Sherston Old School Community Interest Company (SOSCIC) was set up in 2010. It is not a charity because the aims of our CIC, to 'convert the building for commercial use', does not qualify as a charitable objective for registration with the Charities Commission. It has been the task of the SOSCIC

board of volunteers to achieve these aims, at the same time preserving the character of the High Street and providing increased employment opportunities and services

What is the legal basis of SOSCIC and what happens to any profits?

SOSCIC is a Community Interest Company (CIC) registered at Companies House and limited by guarantee. It has a legal requirement to file accounts and accord with Company Law. One of the particular features of a CIC is an 'asset lock', designed to make sure that no individual member is allowed to make any money out of the company; any assets and possible future profits have to be used in the service of the community

Membership of the company is available to all members of the community subject only to them being prepared to pay £1 if the company fails. Membership includes the right to attend and vote at general meetings of SOSCIC and, at those meetings, to appoint and remove members of the Board of SOSCIC. (In short, all the usual powers associated with a limited company). SOSCIC members are thus directly involved in the progress of the project and have a stake in its success. Thanks to an on-going membership drive, there are currently over 270 members of SOSCIC, making it probably the largest community interest company in the UK.

How are we going to achieve financial targets this year?

The actual objectives for 2012 are to complete Phase Two, making all of the building capable of being let, and to find tenants for these remaining areas. If we can do all of this, the entire project can look forward to a self-sustainable future. The capital cost is estimated at £175,000 and we have been so successful with fundraising this year that we are currently just £68,000 short of our target.

How do we raise the shortfall?

We plan to raise the remaining funds by means of a comprehensive and varied programme of fundraising. Our hardworking committee has put together a schedule for 2012 that includes special events, grant applications and personal appeals to individual residents for donations. A special results board in the foyer of the post office will give an accurate account of how successful these attempts are and how close we are getting to our targets. With your help and support, we shall pull it off and the prize will be a self-financing village asset for current and future generations of residents to enjoy.




PROPS Christmas bash

WEA Courses in Sherston

We have just completed one of our most successful Sherston courses ever, with over 40 enrolled for four weeks looking at contrasting plays of the 20th century. Now we look forward to something quite different under the title 'History in the making or do historians make up history?' Tutor Richard Henderson has been running his popular history courses in Sherston for many years and is guaranteed to produce a thought-provoking and informative series, starting on Friday 20 January.

Be prepared for such questions as:

- Why are we so fascinated by the past?
- How much does our perception of the past influence the way we think about the present?
- Can we really discover what happened in the past or do we construct stories about the past which merely reflect our understanding of the present?

The course will look at the way different societies have approached their recording and interpretation of their past. We will examine:

- the role of some of the earliest myths known to us,
- some theories of history, and
- the way recent history has been subject to conflicting interpretations.

No detailed knowledge of any period of history is required for this course – just an enquiring mind and a sense of curiosity.

Precept

The parish council has set its budget for 2012/2013 which has resulted in a precept figure of £22,400. This will be the third year running that the precept has been that sum. In order not to increase the amount the parish council will be calling on reserve funds to complete some long standing projects as well as seeking appropriate grant finance. The precept will be collected by Wiltshire Council in April as part of residents' council tax demands.

We all know that fuel, utility, food and living costs in general are rising, and this can be very worrying if you are on a fixed or limited budget. Nobody wants to fall behind in paying household bills and sources of borrowing can be very confusing and expensive.

Budgeting: knowing how much money you have got coming and going out of your household is the first step to controlling debt. It helps to prioritise your spending, making sure the most important bills are paid first. Other suggestions include:

- looking at ways to cut down on your everyday living expenses (for example, shop around for cheaper fuel or electricity tariffs)
- considering how you might increase your income (are you getting the benefits and allowances that you are eligible for?)
- if you are thinking about borrowing or taking out a loan, finding out which is most suitable to your needs, as some forms of borrowing are very expensive and can put you further in debt.

There are a number of agencies that can give you free advice about finance and debt. You do not need to pay for debt advice.

Wiltshire Horsewatch

What is Wiltshire Horsewatch?

Wiltshire Horsewatch was set up in April 2009 by the Wiltshire Police Rural Crime Team and is the equine version of Neighbourhood Watch. The aim of the scheme is to connect with horse owners and riders with the intention of improving equine and property security by promoting the sharing of information, providing real time news via text message or e-mail alerts, plus crime prevention advice and services.

It is about horse owners working in partnership with the Police to help prevent and reduce equine/rural crime. As part of the National Horsewatch Alliance, information of criminal/suspicious activity is shared across the counties allowing a broad distribution of knowledge to be shared and acted upon.

Wiltshire Horsewatch is a non-profit making scheme with free membership.

Why Join Wiltshire Horsewatch?

Equine crime can be soul destroying and it's not just about the financial loss, there is also emotional distress...

PCSO John Bordiss (Rural Crime Team) said: 'As a horse owner myself, I am very aware of the hard work and ongoing expense horse ownership brings. 

Public Footpath to close?

Wiltshire Council has received an application under s.118 of the Highways Act 1980 from Mr. C M Meade seeking to extinguish part of footpath Sherston 14 where it leads through Ladyswood Farm.


The reasons given for the application are

- i) that the property is a stud farm breeding racehorses and the path passes between buildings housing mares and foals,
- ii) that there is danger to the public, who may be kicked or knocked down,
- iii) that the path is also a security risk for the stud as users stray off the path to have a closer look at the stock and
- iv) that there is a traffic hazard with the movement of farm machinery in this area.

A map showing the general rights of way network around the application area and a plan showing the extent of the extinguishment applied for are reproduced below.

In deciding whether to make an order, Wiltshire Council must be satisfied that the path is not needed for public use. To confirm the order the Council (or Secretary of State) must also have regard to the extent that the path is likely to be used.

Wiltshire Council suggests solar panel caution

Wiltshire Council is encouraging homeowners to consider carefully the long-term implications before agreeing to install solar panels on their homes.

Sue Wilkin, senior public protection officer at the Council said that, although solar panels could bring about savings, homeowners need to be aware of the long-term commitments. There would be a legally binding lease agreement with the company who carried out the installation. Homeowners with a mortgage must advise their mortgage companies of their intentions, because not to do so would be a breach of the terms of their mortgage.

Once agreed, the panels must stay, even when the homeowner wants to sell. Anyone wishing to purchase the property would do so subject to that lease. Leases for solar panels are not always the same. Gains to be made from the scheme are not the same with each supplier and small print should be read carefully. Some leases do not provide for repairs which then became the liability of the homeowner.

Some solar panels are self-cleaning and others require professional cleaning at regular intervals to remain effective. Some are extremely heavy and unsuitable for certain roof structures.

Sue Wilkin advised 'Schemes such as grants for insulation, solar panels or any other home improvement should be properly looked into before agreement. The companies offering the schemes are businesses, and their primary concern is to make money, and salesmen will not necessarily give people the best advice. If people are unsure, they should talk to Consumer Direct on 08454 040506. If they are thinking of solar panels, and have a mortgage they should talk to their mortgage company before signing up.

'Even though people may have legal rights to change their mind for a short time, if they signed up when the salesman called, people may still end up paying some charges if they later don't go ahead. If people succumb to the salesman's chat and are then worried, they should take advice immediately before their rights expire.'



Inspiring local children through the 'Forest School' experience

Following its successful launch at Sherston Primary School last September and at Luckington Community School in November, Forest School Club has already presented more than 60 local children with the opportunity to experience a unique educational, creative approach to outside play and learning.

This is not simply an outdoor pursuits venture, but an ethos that encourages individual's self-worth and confidence. We may not have a 'forest' in Sherston but neither is it necessary, because the Club has offered an opportunity to further utilise the school's wonderful environmental area and outside classroom, which I have now complemented with a specially created fire pit and outdoor working area.

This is not just a fair weather experience either; we are outside whatever the elements throw at us (as the Swedish saying goes, 'there is no such thing as bad weather, only bad clothing.') Well-equipped, the children love being outdoors and are usually so engrossed in activities that they don't even notice if it is raining or cold! Simply being in the open air, in a green space and interacting with nature also offers massive health benefits, both physical and mental, giving us all that 'feel-good' factor.

Whilst endeavouring to complement the children's daily learning in a traditional classroom, a friendly, witty approach to the Forest School philosophy presents activities that aim to motivate individuals through wide-ranging outdoor experiences. This allows children of all abilities to develop key skills, transferable to their everyday lives. The children are inspired to adopt

positive attitudes to challenge and adventure, to gain personal confidence and self-esteem, and to develop their social skills and appreciate the contributions and achievements of both themselves and others. Communication, problem-solving, leadership and teamwork are all greatly enhanced in a safe, stimulating and creative environment. The children's appreciation of their natural surroundings and understanding of the importance of conservation and sustainable development is also strongly encouraged.

To date, the children have been involved in numerous challenging but, importantly, achievable activities that have provided them with opportunities to make choices, use their initiative, take calculated risks, and to be imaginative and inventive. This has included using full-size tools to produce items from wood, working on craft projects using various natural materials, learning to cook safely over an open fire, close exploration of the environmental area, learning how birds survive in the winter and about camouflage, constructing bug hotels for the winter and playing exciting team-building games.

Sherston school has also been host to pupils from Luckington Community School and children aged seven to 11 have joined together for extended Forest School events during the school holidays. Further fun activities have included team problem-solving to build stable effective shelters, sculpting with willow, creating pea-shooters and kazoos from greenwood and, most popular, cooking a sausage casserole and caramelised fruit and marshmallow kebabs over the campfire.

As we start a new year, I am looking forward to more Forest School fun and activities that will continue to draw on the children's interests, imagination and further develop the skills they are learning.

Research Studies

The Tolsey Surgery is taking part in a number of research projects again this year. We think this is an important activity to be involved in as there are many benefits for both the surgery and our patients, for example:

- participants in trials have better outcomes, even those in the control arms, than similar patients not in trials;
- patients can participate in studies of new therapies for common illnesses or new ways of preventing illness in primary care that may not be routinely available; and
- as clinicians, it is educational and interesting to work closely with academic primary care colleagues from the universities and the NHS, answering clinically relevant research questions.

Some of the research projects you may be invited to take part in are:

- 3C Cough Complications Cohort study aims to find out what symptoms, measurements and characteristics can be used to predict which patients will go on to develop further complications. Doctors recruit from surgery.
- TARGET This is another study about cough complications but in children aged 3 months to 16 years. Doctors recruit from surgery.
- AIRS a study into the treatment of glue ear in children from 4 to 11 years attending school. Recruitment is by invitation.
- PRIMIT This is a study in infection control, reducing the incidence of colds and flu within households. You may be randomly selected to be invited to take part in this study. If you have not been asked, and wish to take part, please ask for details at the surgery.



THE ANCIENT ORDER OF SHERSTON MANGOLD HURLERS

Whilst Saturday 6 October 1934 is engraved in the collective memory of all in the Sherston area could Sunday 13 November 2011 become equally well known?

Word has reached me of an incident nay Altercation in Sherston which though by no means rivalling the events of 1934 at Alderton in terms of violence and subsequent court appearances shows that passions still run high between rival Orders of Mangold Hurlers.

Although details of quite what occurred on 13 November are as yet far from clear it seems certain that at around 4.22pm some senior and most respected members of the Sherston Order almost came to blows with members of a still to be identified other Order. Eye witnesses report residents and visitors alike looking on agog as the two Orders squared up to each other in Church Street over what appears to have been a disagreement concerning the parking of a number of mangold carts.

My detailed enquiries continue so as to ensure this event is fully recorded for posterity. Although the names of those Sherston members involved have been obtained the method by which that was achieved means they cannot presently be revealed for fear of my being called to appear before the ongoing Leverson enquiry.




