Sherston Old School

On 25 August the SOSCIC directors and the project architect had a very encouraging meeting with the building contractors, Chappell and Dix.

They were pleased to see that considerable progress had been made since mid-July, when work had started. The interior of the building had been stripped out and a new floor had already been installed. Work had started on the roof and on constructing the new internal walls and partitions.

The contract with Chappell and Dix provides for completion of the first phase by the first week in November (subject to the prompt manufacture and delivery of the required replacement windows and new heating system), at which point Paul and Gail should hopefully be able to start fitting out the new post office and general store in time for a December opening.

Plans are under way for a grand Sherston Fete to be held in the village hall in early November, part of a programme of fundraising events. All being well, it should also be a celebration, marking the completion of the first phase of the Old School project.



But where?

A week or so after Boules and Carnival, the 'It's Ours' sign was taken down from the old school building. It was to be added to with announcements at various stages of the works.

Unfortunately SOSCIC are unable to locate the sign. If anyone knows where it is, can they please return it to one of the board members or leave it behind the fence at the front of the building. The Parish Council invested £95 in the banner so its return and continued use would make the most of their investment.

Not just the clocks changing

When the clocks go back in October there will be two changes to the service pattern for the Parish Church in Sherston.

Many people love the traditional language and rhythm of the Book of Common Prayer. For some time, Holy Cross church has included Evensong as part of the service pattern but has not recently offered a Prayer Book communion service. Starting on 20 November, this will change. For a trial period of six months the evening communion at 6.00pm on the third Sunday of the month will use the Book of Common Prayer, with the same readings as the morning service. Sherston Parochial Church Council hopes that this will widen the range of worship we offer and appeal to a wider constituency.

Also, the time of the early morning service will change on 6 November from 8.00am to 8.15am, again for a trial period of six months. This is to allow more time for the volunteers to set up for the service, and more travel time for the clergy when the weather is harsh. It may also make it easier for some people to attend the service.





101 is coming to Wiltshire

From 19 September as part of the National roll out, communities across Wiltshire will be able to dial 101, a new national non-emergency telephone number for the police service. Our current non emergency number 0845 408 7000 will be phased out.

While 999 is a well recognised number to report emergencies, the 2010 British Crime Survey found that only 54 per cent of the public knew which telephone number to call if they wanted to speak to their local police about policing, non urgent crime and anti-social behaviour issues.

Why is 101 being introduced?

- Easy way to speak directly with their local police to report and discuss all non urgent police-related issues.
- It is being introduced as part of the Government's wider work to improve access to the police, ease pressure on 999 and help the police efficiently and effectively tackle crime and disorder.
- Will not change the way we respond to nonurgent calls.

How does 101 work?

- 101 will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- The system will determine the caller's location and connect them to the relevant police force. If a caller is on a boundary between two or more forces or if the incident took place away from the callers location, a recorded message will give them a choice of which force to be connected to.

When should callers use to 101?

 To report less urgent crime or disorder and to contact the police with a general enquiry or to speak to a local officer.

Will it be more expensive for the public to contact the police on 101?

• With 101 it has been nationally agreed that a flat rate of 15p will be charged whether a member of public is calling from a landline or mobile, irrespective of how long their call lasts.

What will happen to the current 0845 4087000 number?

 The 0845 number will be phased out over the next six months.

We should like to complete as soon as possible as the Brewery Company has kindly agreed to waive any question of interest on the balance. There will be some slight apportionments to make in respect of tithe and property tax but we will adjust these later.

Upon the completion of the purchase we propose to give you a donation of £2 towards the Committee's funds.

We will deal with the question of the two easements in respect of light as soon as the purchase is completed: until then we have no lucus standi.

Yours faithfully,

The Sherston Recreation Ground Committee was set up to help with continuing fundraising both to pay back the loan and to raise money for the upkeep of the land and surrounding walls. Two Minute Books where found in the Parish Chest. It would appear that this committee took its job very seriously as at the 1935 AGM held in the Rifle Range it was noted that during the past year it had met 23 times. With 3 General Meetings, that made an average of one a fortnight.

The secretary commenced his report. 21 March 1935

The chief work of the year had been the purchase of the Pennymeade, and the thanks of the village were due to Mrs Compton for her generous loan of £100 free of interest for two years. The Committee had taken care of the interest of the village by having one of the clauses in the agreement altered.

The Committee had asked Major Bampfylde and Major Menzies to be Trustees for the ground and these gentlemen had consented. On Messrs Clarke and Smith (Solicitors) stating that two trustees were hardly sufficient, the Committee had added the names of Messrs Stevens and Warren to the number of trustees.

Efforts at raising money had been the Fete which had brought in £17, and a Whist Drive and Dance which had produced between £2 and £3 in spite of a thunderstorm.

When the present secretary had accepted office two years before it had been on the condition that should a Fete be agreed upon, a special secretary should be appointed for it. For the last Fete the Committee had offered Mr Parkinson 10% of the profits, amounting to the equivalent of 35/- which he refused. The village was indebted to him for his generous action.

Rev. Povey then pointed out that although the Annual Meeting was now in progress, money was wanted at once. He proposed that subscriptions be asked for 1935. Mr Barnes seconded and this was also carried.

Mr A Goulding reminded the meeting that Mr Snell had offered to repair the walls of the Pennymeade, and Mr Sherwood offered to help him. Details of work to be done were to be left to the Committee.

Mr Stevens expressed the thanks of the Committee to Mr Sherwood for his work on the walls and the Committee agreed to all his suggestions for further work. It was agreed to order 10 cwt of cement and 5 tons of grit as soon as it was necessary.

Mr Stevens offered to see Mr Harold Jobbins regarding the mending of the gate into Green Lane.

The secretary informed the meeting that as the stock of stone at the dump was exhausted he had written to the Clerk to the County Council asking if the Council would grant the Committee permission to dig stone from a quarry in a field rented by Mr S Dickenson near Mr S Berry's farm. An official from the Council had inspected the quarry, received Mr Dickenson's sanction to the stone being taken and had been shown the work in progress and had promised to report to the competent Committee who were meeting on 27 September.

The Committee agreed to let Mr H Evans graze his horse in the Pennymeade each evening after dark on condition that when permission was received to haul the stone, enough had to be hauled to ensure that Mr Sherwood's work should receive no more check.

Mr Goulding was deputed to convey this message and also to say that the Committee would take no responsibility for the horse.

The chairman then informed the Committee of an idea discussed between himself and the secretary of erecting a stone commemorating the voluntary work put into the walls. Mr Barnes thought that the ages of the workers should be included and Mr Stevens offered to ascertain their feelings on the matter. Mr Wilson said that he had a likely stone and Mr Underwood offered to inspect it.

The stone plaque is still to be seen in the wall beside the small gate, but is now in need of some restoration work.

Police News

Having been your local officer for quite a while now I thought I would slightly change these articles I write to reflect what is going on in our communities. It is based on my own experiences of working in this area for the past 18 years and in this 'Big Society' or whatever we have, perhaps it's time to engage on more of an individual level so I will definitely welcome any feedback.

Being a Police Officer is a great job, but it can be frustrating when you're asked to address problems that have proved impossible over many years. One of these is parking around our schools and other locations where children and vehicles come together on a regular basis for a short time.

I am regularly asked by Governors and councils if I can look into parking problems at their local school. Many in our communities are affected by this, whether parents, neighbours or passing motorists.

What I can't do is ban parents driving their children to school.

What I could do but haven't is try to stop parking outside schools where it causes issues to passing traffic and residents. If I do this then at best it transfers the problem to other nearby roads/residents and in the real world my limited resources (which consist of PCSO Durry Maule and me) would be even stretched further trying to enforce it.

What I have done is write in this and other local magazines asking for feedback on what you the reader think I should be doing. To date I have had only one reply: it suggested this is not a Police matter.

What I am asking is please can we all be tolerant

and work together. If you are a parent and you really cannot walk your child to school then please give yourself a little more time to park considerately and drive away at the earliest opportunity to clear the area. This will make it that little bit easier for other motorists who in turn will be more sympathetic in their driving around the school.

If you have any views on this, please let me know via malmesburynpt@wiltshire.pnn.police.uk.This is a relatively new email address changed slightly from the old one. We still try to reply to all emails within 24 hours.

On different matters, from a police perspective at least the Boules event went very well with no reports of antisocial behaviour and traffic flow maintained around the event. I am still investigating reports of walkers in the area being harassed by uncontrolled dogs and I would welcome any new witnesses coming forward. Finally, street briefings will recommence in October. The next meeting is on Tuesday 18 October on Sherston High Street by the Post Office at 2.30pm - 3.30pm. Please come along and have your say.




Mangold Hurl

As the 2011 season draws to a close, it's time to reflect on some of the highlights.


