Sherston author's new play

This month, just down the road in Corsham, for one night only, there's a chance to see the latest play by Sherston author Frank Hatt.

A number of Sherston residents made the journey to the Everyman Theatre in Cheltenham to see Frank's last play, 'The Amazing and Preposterous Constance Smedley', performed by Stroud Theatre Company. This time round he is hoping to see an even greater number of familiar faces in the audience.

The new play, 'Players and Gentlemen', will be at the Pound Arts Centre on Friday 21 September in a script-in-hand performance, again by Stroud Theatre Company.

It's a lively and entertaining piece set in the summer of 1921. Lives change and romance blossoms for the travelling players as they tour the Cotswolds, out to heal the scars of the Great War with Chekhov and cheerfulness. The gentlemen also are on the road, playing country house cricket and quaffing champagne and ale.

Stroud Theatre Company has a national reputation for innovative theatre. It received great acclaim for its recent national tour of an adaptation of George Orwell's 1984, a co-production with Northern Broadsides.

Frank Hatt's playwriting career spans five decades, having got off to a start at the Royal Court Theatre in the 1950s.

'Players and Gentlemen' is a work in progress. After the performance, the audience will be invited to discuss the play with the author, director and cast - an exciting chance to contribute to the further development of this new play on its journey to a full

touring production.

This performance is funded by Creative Ecology Wiltshire with support from Pound Arts.

Extracts taken from the Parish Magazine, September 1914

The Sunday School outing and treat

We are glad to hear that the up-to-date mode of conveyance to Weston and back was so much appreciated. At the conclusion of the mid-day meal Mr Brinkworth on behalf of the choir, thanked the Vicar for making the necessary arrangements, and made a timely appeal to the members to be regular in their appearance at choir practice. In reply, the Vicar reminded those present that their thanks were mainly due to Col Turnor, who had kindly undertaken to defray the expenses of the catering. He thanked Mr Brinkworth for his speech, and added that he had thoroughly endorsed what he had said with regard to attendance at practices, upon which the efficiency of the choir so much depended.

The choir outing

On July 30th all the choir were taken to Weston-Super-Mare for their outing. The party was taken by char-a-bane, which added much to the day's enjoyment. They left Sherston about 8.30 in the morning, and the weather being fine everyone enjoyed the drive. Passing through Acton Turville, Tormarton, Codrington and Bristol they reached Weston about 11.15. Duncan Neale (1853 – 1933), chemist, veterinary surgeon

Situated in the centre of the High Street is the Old Pharmacy. In 1845, the house was bought by Thomas Neale and his wife Charlotte (née Mills). Here, their six children were born: Alice (1848), Benjamin (1849), Catherine (1851), Duncan (1853), Raglan (1855) and Moses (1866).

Thomas began his business as a chemist. In 1895, his son Duncan began practising as a veterinary surgeon. He was mostly self-taught, having learnt most of his his skills from local farmers. This was common practice in the countryside and some were very good at their job.

Duncan would mix medicines for many animal diseases, and also had a few concoctions for humans!

Wash for freckles: Steep a broken lump of sulphur in new milk until the milk becomes sour, then use as a face wash.

Pomade for freckles: 20 grains of sulphate of zinc, one ounce of elderflower ointment. After washing the face with soap, add water and apply the pomade at night.

Cure for baldness: 1 ounce of tincture of cantharides, 1 ounce Jamaica rum, old and strong, 2 ½ ounces Prices glycerine, 15 drops oil of rosemary 9 ounces of distilled water. Moisten the skin of the head with water and rub the mixture in twice daily.

Horse embrocation: 4 ounces of flour of mustard, 1 ½ ounces liquid ammonia, 1 ounce of oil of turpentine, add enough water to bring to the consistency of cream.

Hoof liquid: 4 ounces oil of turpentine, 4 ounces tar, this application renders the hoof both softer and tougher when applied with means of a brush night and morning.



It's all change ...


You may not have noticed but the swifts have already migrated to Southern Africa (they are the small noisy black birds that fly very fast and shriek), and the swallows and house martins are getting ready to go, hanging around on telephone lines around the village. We are at the start of the autumn migration.


Over the next six to eight weeks, many of the birds that have spent the summer here and raised chicks will head off for warmer climes, while a whole new influx of birds from Scandinavia will start to arrive, such as goldfinches, linnets and blackbirds to supplement the ones resident all year. Hopefully, the little egrets will return to overwinter — not least to cheer up the resident herons that are keeping their eyes peeled (see photo).

The migration will hopefully bring some more unusual birds too, such as the influx of waxwings a couple of years ago, so watch this space.

The recent warmer weather has resulted in a flush of butterflies in gardens and around the village. On a recent walk, I found eight different species so maybe not all is lost for them this summer.



Who do you need to see? Where do you need to go?

Accessing appropriate health care

The GP surgery is usually your first port of call. If you have an illness



that is not life-threatening, contact your GP surgery first. You can still call your GP surgery outside normal surgery hours, but you will be directed to an out-of-hours service. The telephone number to call the out-of-hours service directly is 0300 111 5717. The out-of-hours period is 6.30pm to 8.30am on weekdays, and all day at weekends and bank holidays. The phone lines to the surgery are also closed between 12.30pm and 1.30pm on weekdays; if you require a doctor at this time please call 01249 454 080. Wiltshire Medical Services will answer your call and advise you.

NHS Direct

Alternatively, in the case of urgent need when the practice is closed, you can call NHS Direct (0845 4647) to speak to a triage nurse. Your needs will be assessed and advice offered or arrangements made for you to see a doctor either out of hours or when the surgery opens again.

Accident and emergency departments

Accident and emergency (A&E) departments assess and treat patients with serious injuries or illnesses. Generally, you should visit A&E or call 999 for lifethreatening emergencies, such as:

- loss of consciousness,
- acute confused state and fits that are not stopping,
- persistent, severe chest pain,
- breathing difficulties, and
- severe bleeding that cannot be stopped.

Minor injuries units

If your injury is not serious, you can get help from a minor injuries unit (MIU), rather than going to an A&E department. There are MIUs at Chippenham, Tetbury and Cirencester. This will allow A&E staff to concentrate on people with serious, life-threatening conditions and will save you a potentially long wait.

If you access an MIU or casualty service for an illness that is considered to be not suitable, you may be refused treatment and directed back to your own GP practice.

Don't forget that, in order to access our new online prescription service, you must collect your log-in details from the surgery.


