Lino cut cards oneday course by Christine Felce

Saturday 4 November Sherston Village Hall 10.00am to 4.00pm

Learn how to design and cut a lino square or two [10cm square] suitable for printing onto cards. The course will supply water-based printing inks, lino tools, a card pack with envelopes, a variety of label tags and specialist lino. During the course you will have the use of printing presses and you will be shown methods of printing without a press that you could use at home. You will also have the option of using letterpress stamps and lino blocks carved by Christine Felce to add to your designs.

The award recognised the hard work done by pupils and staff to achieve seven international projects in one year, including links with Australia, the Gambia and Kenya.

Victory for bus lobby

The elderly and disabled of North End Gardens have at last got their bus back.

Two years ago, when Carriers Close was being developed on Sandpits Lane, the no 41 Malmesbury to Yate bus stopped calling at North End Gardens as the road was often blocked by construction traffic.

Following the completion of Carriers Close, it was expected the service would return. When this did not happen, residents and the parish council lobbied County Hall.

Now, however, the pressure we applied has worked and the service to North End Gardens will return from 2 November.

SOSCIC:

How much do you know about us?



If you've moved to the village in the last 10 years, you may not know about the Community Interest Company (CIC) that the village owns.

What you will already know is that amongst the many advantages of living in this wonderful village is that it has its own Co-op store and Post Office, its own design and print business and various other facilities, all housed within the Victorian Old School.

The Old School building stood empty from 2005 onwards, made redundant by the opening of the current primary school on Knockdown Road. At the same time, the old Post Office Stores, which was a smaller premises on the other side of the High Street, was under threat for being inadequate. Given the twin threats of loss of yet further commercial premises at the heart of the village, and the proposed development of the Old School site for residential purposes, the village decided to buy the Old School.

A CIC was formed - because CICs are specifically designed to allow a business to operate as a social enterprise for the benefit of a defined community.

Approximately £1 million was required to fund the purchase, and to carry out the necessary restoration and conversion works to make it suitable for commercial use. Many people in the community became members of the CIC and made substantial donations directly to the project, underscoring the 95% who had voted in support of the initiative in a village-wide ballot.

The income from Sherston Old School is used to support many neighbourhood projects through the Parish Council. Most recently, Sherston Old School Community Interest Company (SOSCIC) donated £20,000 to the fund for the extension of Sherston Village Hall.

Given that there have been many changes in the village over the last 10 years, and we have some upcoming changes to the current tenancies, we are keen to bring in new members to ensure that Sherston Old School supports the needs of the village today. We would very much like some new members with younger children to ensure we are addressing all generations!

There is no cost to join as a member and there is no time commitment. It's about having as many of you as possible involved in a key community project.

You will be kept informed of any changes and asked for your input regarding possible rental opportunities. At the AGM you will have the opportunity to talk to the board members about the project and the plans for the next year.

A hat trick of a different kind...



Sadly, Ewen Kenny the 'Taters' highly successful player manager of 21/22 season decided to relinquish his role to pursue an inviting career opportunity, and two of our star players were headhunted by Malmesbury Victoria FC so with the 22/23 season looming and Division 3 beckoning, was this a case of 'one step forward, two steps back'?

Definitely not - veteran player Adam Salt took over the managerial reins, I remained in full support, the bulk of our previous season's champions were hot to trot, fresh blood was appointed to fill the boots of the departed and team stability and morale were soon on the rise.

As the new season got under way, we were under no illusion that Division 3 was a giant step up the ladder for the Taters and that there would be no easy games at this level, but our team spirit was high so 'Bring it on' was the cry!

The Taters stormed out of the blocks in our first two games and made short work of our opponents with 7-1 and 6-2 victories respectively - but then the inevitable happened. We suffered our first defeat in over a year at the hands of high-flying Stroud United, losing 4-7.



This setback coincided with a series of injuries - most notably, in September 2022 Archie Walsh sustained a sickening knee injury that sidelined him for the remainder of the season.

Morale was at an all-time low because the results were just not coming our way but perseverance, conviction and belief saw the high return. Yes, it started with an 11-1 victory over Hardwicke 3rds, closely followed by a 4-0 win over Stonehouse and slowly but surely an amazing run of form set in which saw the Taters win six of our seven remaining matches.

This saw us climb to fourth position meaning we were eligible to enter the play-offs which we duly won and, hey presto, it's Division 2 for us in 23/24! Yes, we have moved from Division 5 to Division 2 in our first two seasons which really is an awesome achievement!

Early on the morning of Friday 14 July, the Boules Committee received the weather forecast (validated by ATC contacts at RAF Brize Norton) for Boules Day the following day: 50mph winds, torrential rain and thunderstorms! With the help of our wonderful team of volunteers, we restructured the event in the interests of public safety, banning all marquees and gazebos on the High Street and relocating all food and beverage offerings to the Village Hall, with Boules Control going into the Old School building and the Festival Family Field into the British School Room.



The conditions meant the entertainers were forced to improvise by operating from the bus shelter outside The Angel – but this didn't stop Jerri Hart (aka The Crooked Crooner) and O'rael delighting the audience with their performances. Jerri kicking off his set with 'Singing in the Rain'!



For the first time (and despite the conditions), we ran a full plate competition accommodating all first-round losers – representing an additional 32 matches. Along with full Junior and Colts competitions, this made the 2023 festival the biggest ever and, despite a few challenges, we managed to finish before it got dark and, by using the new pistes on the rec, we were able to re-open the High Street shortly after 8.00pm.

Movies@Malmesbury:

New tiered seating puts movies in the picture for Malmesbury

Cinema-goers to Malmesbury Town Hall can now watch their favourite films in comfort thanks to the installation of tiered retractable seating, funded by Malmesbury Town Council.

Old dining chairs have been replaced with pocketsprung seats, at a cost of £50,000. The seating can accommodate 100 people with space at the front for wheelchair users. It's deployed at the touch of a button with setting up and stowing away taking only minutes.

An additional £40,000 has been spent replacing the unreliable projector. Half the cost for this has come from the council with the rest made up of donations, largely from local businesses and organisations.

The council funds have come from reserves but, with the extra income that the new seating is likely to generate – with more performances, including music and theatre productions, and bigger audiences – the investment will eventually pay for itself.

A steering group, led by Cllr Steve D'Arcy with volunteers from the Movies@Malmesbury project, was behind the initiative.

'People told us that the old seating was putting them off coming to see films and live-streamed events at the Town Hall,' said Cllr D'Arcy. 'In fact, some Malmesbury residents would travel to other venues, even if we had the films here first, simply because the seats were so uncomfortable. Nor could we ever show films with subtitles because the view was restricted.'

'This seating is a real gamechanger, because it's something the whole community can benefit from, and it will generate an income which we can use in Malmesbury. The retractable seating system allows the hall to continue to be used for all manner of community-based activities, but it can be transformed into a theatre, a cinema, a lecture and presentation theatre and a conference centre in a matter of minutes.'

The new seating, manufactured and installed by Wiltshire-based Audience Systems, also allows for better viewing of live streams. Malmesbury audiences have already enjoyed a performance of Verdi's Il Trovatore, live-streamed from the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden.

Movies@Malmesbury shows matinees and evening screenings at Malmesbury Town Hall, usually on Mondays and Fridays with live streamed musical concerts mid-week. For the cinema programme, screen times and to book tickets visit https://cinema.malmesbury.gov.uk/in-cinemas




