#### Sherston Apple Day: Saturday 7 October



Plans for our annual Apple Day celebrations are well under way. This year, it will take place on Saturday 7 October, 10.00am-2.00pm, at the village hall. Enjoy discovering our local producers and artisans, practising your apple-juicing skills and having a cup of tea (and cake!), while the children have fun in the hall, playing apple-themed games. This will be our third Apple Day in Sherston and we hope to see you there!

Reducing our carbon footprint

Sustainable Sherston is aiming to reduce our carbon footprint by making Sherston's own apple juice made from local apples. By gathering together all surplus apples (cookers and eaters), we will juice them, bottle and pasteurise the fresh juice, label them with winning artwork produced by Sherston School pupils, and sell them on Apple Day and in the village later in October. Pasteurised Sherston Apple Juice can be kept for a year or more, meaning you can enjoy it as a cold drink or mulled with spices for a winter warmer.

By cutting out transport emissions and keeping the collection and juice production at its simplest, we can ensure that making our own apple juice takes little or no toll on the environment. In that way, it's similar to making wine (see the chart above to show the energy used /emissions produced by each part of the cycle).

Our glass bottles are intended for recycling.

Bring your own apples

This year, we will be pressing, bottling and pasteurising some of Sherston's apples before Apple Day. If you have an apple tree with ripe September apples, please bring your surplus (ideally, in good condition) in bags on Sunday 1 October and leave them to the left of the village hall, between the hall and the shed (see photo below).

If your apples need another week to ripen, please deliver them to the village hall on Friday 6 October or bring them along on the day itself. We will be demonstrating apple juicing on both our small press and our larger one (both paid for with grants from Malmesbury Area Board and Wessex Water Environment Fund).

#### Juice with us!

The more, the merrier: we will be pressing, then bottling and pasteurising the apple juice the week commencing Monday 2 October and aiming to finish on Monday 9 October. If you have an hour or two to spare, we would love you to join in. Please call Eleanor on 840369 or 07949 292741 - leave a message and your telephone number so we can contact you.

#### Bring your own bottles

We hope you will bring your own clean bottles and try the juice fresh from the press on Apple Day. Or you can buy it fully pasteurised and labelled - for your own consumption or as gifts.

## Collecting crabapples for a good cause!

This September, award-winning condiments maker Tracklements is encouraging the community to don their wellies, take a walk in the countryside and start collecting crabapples for a terrific cause.

Tracklements is partnering with Sherston Primary School, Scout and Girlguiding groupsto collect crabapples to make English Crabapple Jelly. For every kilogram of crabapples donated, 50p is given to the school and youth groups, as well as a further 25p from the sale of every jar sold nationwide. The project has been running for over 16 years and has raised over £9,000 so far.

The initiative is also a great way to teach Sherston's young people about the provenance of their food by showing them the process from tree to jar, as well as using fruit which may otherwise go to waste. Crabapples are 'wild' apples and can often be found in British hedgerows, nestled amongst other trees.

If you have any crabapples you won't be using and would like to support the children of Sherston, Tracklements would love them. ## Testing our river water



Last month, Sustainable Sherston volunteers Richard Skeffington and Martin Smith started testing the river water quality at eight locations on the Sherston Avon and Luckington Brook. The first month of data has been uploaded to a website run by the Bristol Avon River Trust (BART) as part of their 'River Blitz' testing initiative. Sustainable Sherston will continue testing every month for a sustained period, to have a better understanding of what is happening in our local rivers. The main tests are for nitrates and phosphates but observations are also being made as to the presence of wildlife both in the water and on the banks.

# Launch of new Sherston to Malmesbury cycleway



On the morning of Saturday 23 September, Sustainable Sherston, Sherston Velo and the Friends of Sherston School will be coming together to officially open the signed cycle route between Sherston and Malmesbury along the Foxley Road. Please look out for Facebook announcements to confirm timings. This route was identified as a safer alternative to using the B4040. The distance travelled using the Foxley Road is exactly the same as using the main road but with less traffic. Google Maps says the journey takes 28 minutes on a bike. With the advent of electric bikes, this route will help those who are less fit get there and back without too much trouble as well. It's worth considering cycling instead of driving to Malmesbury as a way of staying fit, saving petrol and parking costs, and reducing your carbon footprint which all helps with the climate emergency.

It's been a quiet time for Sherston Magna Cricket Club, with only one game completed due to poor weather and no fixture (as usual) on Boules Day.

The week before the match, it looked as though Sherston would have to cancel due to lack of players. However, two local villagers, Jon Walker and Dan Connor, bravely volunteered their services and were joined by Sherston under-13s coach Danny Butler. Sherston finally took the field with only 10 players to face the mighty Hinton Charterhouse.

What followed was probably the highlight of the season so far. With tremendous spirit in the field, Sherston stuck to their task brilliantly and with some 'mystery' bowling from Greg Hall and Andrew Tremellen, plus Ben and Alan Dickenson (who also shared wicket-keeping duties), Hinton were sensationally bowled out for only 155 in less than 39 overs.

The three last-minute recruits were outstanding. Dan Connor was excellent in the field, Jon Walker took a blinding catch at slip and Danny Butler finished the Hinton innings with a run out. Unfortunately, Sherston's injury woes continue as Andrew Tremellen suffered a spiral finger fracture

and will miss the next few games.

In their reply, Magna came up just a bit short, being bowled out for 129. It looked at one stage as though they would secure a historic victory but, following a couple of questionable LBWs, Sherston went on to lose their last three wickets in three balls and that, as they say, was that. With a lot of talk this season about a certain hat, perhaps it was fate that the game should finish with a 'hat trick' of wickets. The bowler in question left the field with a fivewicket haul and the match ball firmly shoved in his pocket.

But where is Sherston's own special hat? Well, it has been in the possession of Mr Howell for most of the month and he seems to be enjoying wearing it. It was certainly difficult to find a more worthy owner following the match with Hinton. Will he ever get rid of it, that is the question.

I would like to begin with a word of thanks to Sherston Taters fans who took an interest and came along to our preseason friendly fixtures. I trust that you were well entertained and pleased with the team spirit, performance and the abundance of goals the lads produced for your enjoyment.

Although our first team were well beaten 3-0 by Dursley Reserves in their opening game, a wee bit of 'hairdryer treatment' from manager Adam Salt plus a few tweaks saw the lads bounce back with an 8-2 win over Tormarton, and follow up with a 7-2 win over Stratton. Despite being narrowly beaten in our final preseason game in a 3-2 defeat to Minety, I was more than happy with our team hunger and the overall commitment shown (scored 17 goals and conceded 10).

The hidden potential of our recently formed Tater Reserves team was well and truly exposed with a 15-0 win over Minety Reserves and a follow-up 4-3 win against Stratton Juniors, despite being down 3-0 at half-time. They conceded an early goal but were not deterred as this deficit stirred a wake-up call and they went on to win 8-4. Striker Jerry Phillip scored five whilst Sam 'Thunderbird' Deverson contributed when he unleashed a dynamic 40-yard



shot on target! A Jordan Brailsford goal and an own goal completed the tally (scored 27 goals and conceded 7).

Manager Jay Martin has his crew pumped up and finely tuned for their inaugural Division 5 opening game on 26 August. Bring it on!

The big day arrived and the Taters first team got off to the perfect start in Division 2 football with a thrilling game against Uley F.C. ## Cazalet and the North West Wiltshire Women's Conservative and Unionist Association



Victor Cazalet MP and the North West Wiltshire Women's Conservative and Unionist Association, Sherston Branch, August 1928

This photograph has been contributed by James King of Knockdown. He has identified his own 'Granny King' towards the left of the picture. He would be interested to know if anyone has more information or can identify individuals.

The photo is believed to have been taken at Easton Grey House (garden visible on the left) to mark the passing of the Equal Franchise Act in July 1928, which granted equal voting rights to men and women. Previously (since 1918) only women over the age of 30 had the right to vote.

Seated at the centre of the photograph, surrounded by about 180 women in cloche hats, is the 32-year-old Conservative Member of Parliament for Chippenham, Captain (later Colonel) Victor Alexander Cazalet.

In 1926, total membership of the North West Wiltshire Women's Conservative and Unionist Association (NWWWCUA) branches was 4,548. There were branches in most of the villages. In June 1926, the Sherston & Sopworth Branch had 127 members

Cazalet was in favour of the Equal Franchise Act, and supported efforts by the NWWWCUA to recruit members from the tranche of women newly allowed to vote. A committee report on 18 May 1928 reads:

'In connection with the proposed addition of some 5000 women to the [constituency] electorate ... a general election will take place some time during next year, and no effort must be spared to do our part in the return of the Conservative Government ... There is room for a great increase of membership particularly among those who will then exercise the vote for the first time.'

To say Cazalet was well-connected would be an understatement - his godmother was Queen Victoria. Descended from a French Protestant Huguenot family, he represented the Chippenham constituency from 1924 until his death in 1943. He was killed in a plane crash in Gibraltar along with the Polish General Sikorski, for whom he was the liaison officer with the British wartime government. Cazalet is buried in Gibraltar. A heraldic shield commemorating his death is one of 23 which recognise MPs who were killed during World War II, on the walls of the House of Commons Chamber.





If you have an apple tree with ripe September apples, please bring your surplus (ideally, in good condition) in bags to the VH on Sun 1 Oct




