# SOS – Tolsey Surgery breaking news . . . Integrated Care Board now supporting new surgery plan!





We received the following update from James Gray (MP) following his meeting on 31 October with a senior executive from the Integrated Care Board (ICB):

'The ICB have listened to us and will now look forward to working with us on our preferred new surgery plan.'

This is a fantastic result and was achieved following a concerted effort by the Parish Council, Wiltshire Council, GPs, MPs and you, the community. Thank you.

Individual thanks must go to Tanya Burgess (Chair, Sherston Parish Council), Martin Smith (Wiltshire Councillor for the Sherston Division) who fronted and drove the campaign and James Gray (MP) who offered his support very early in the campaign, ultimately meeting with senior executives from the ICB to achieve this outcome.

James Gray will issue a full statement shortly.

### What's next?

We still have a long way to go and must not take our

'eyes off the prize'. Please, please continue to sign the petition we launched; we will still be presenting it to the ICB. You can find the petition in both the Co-op and the Tolsey Surgery and also online here:

# SOS – Tolsey Surgery Update: Background to front page news





Following combined efforts involving GPs, Sherston Parish Council, Wiltshire Council, local MPs, residents and patients writing letters, emails, talking to local newspapers and local radio interviews, the Integrated Care Board (ICB) issued a statement last month fully retracting the recommendation – extract below:

### Statement by BaNES and North East Somerset, Swindon and Wiltshire (BSW) ICB

Following the email sending the PCN Services and Estates Toolkit Output documents to PCNs across BSW between 11-12th September, the ICB would like to apologise for any concerns or distress caused by the content of these documents to our GPs and GP Practice staff and our local residents.

The Toolkit was developed as part of a national programme aiming to provide a broad overview of primary care needs across diverse regions, and at this stage the documents were draft and intended as a starting point for local discussion and refinement within the

PCNs. However, we appreciate that this is not how the documents were received or interpreted in some areas, and that they have since been circulated widely.

For these reasons, the ICB are now fully retracting the Output document in full until a time when further work and review has been completed.

This was obviously great news for Sherston. However, following a public meeting held in the village hall on Thursday 5 October (attended by more than 250 people), it was agreed that we would continue with our campaign until such time as we had definitive support from the Integrated Care Board for the new surgery build.

Following the retraction, we formed a Campaign Committee to drive a series of ongoing actions to ensure that we continued to raise awareness of possible plans to close the surgery as part of a nationwide drive to reduce costs by 30%. More importantly, we needed to make sure that the value and importance of retaining the surgery in Sherston was understood by ALL decision-makers, and in real terms what the loss would mean to the local community and surrounding care networks.

### What else happened?

- The Campaign Committee held its first meeting on Friday 13 October a number of actions were taken forward by members.
- A petition was made available for all to sign at the Tolsey Surgery, Co-op and online. (As mentioned, this is still available to sign please do!)
- Resolutions were passed by the following parish councils supporting the retention of the surgery in Sherston – Sherston, Malmesbury Town, Luckington, Didmarton and Sherston, St Paul Malmesbury without.
- James Gray MP met with the CEO of the ICB on Tuesday 31 October.

On Saturday 11 November, join in with a barn dance with the Packhorse Band in the village hall. Great for all ages and families too.


Over the weekend of 11 and 12 November in the British School Room we look forward to seeing a return of the Peg Village, an art installation by local children.

# Public talk: Local water quality





Friday 17 November, 7.30pm, British School Room

I'm sure you have seen the headlines: 'Water Firms Illegally Spilled Sewage on Dry Days'; 'Raw Sewage Dumped into England's Rivers 375,000 times Last Year'; 'DEFRA Plan to Punish Sewage Polluters Exposed as "Pantomime" and so on. But what's the situation locally? Is the Sherston Avon in a poor state, on the up, deteriorating? How do we compare to other places? Sherston has a new sewer – will this improve things? Are there threats other than sewage? Is it safe to paddle? How have we got into this situation? And how can we make things better?

To answer these and other questions, we need to look at where we get our water from and what we do with our wastes. How we have tackled these problems over the ages makes a fascinating story, and gives some clues as to what we might do in future. We can make a difference: but we need to understand what is possible – and decide what is affordable. One thing is for certain: we cannot continue as we are.

I hope you can join me in the British School Room, Cliff Road, at 7.30pm on Friday 17 November for a talk hosted by Sustainable Sherston. Tickets £5 on the door, doors open 7.00pm. Refreshments available. There will be a discussion afterwards for those who wish.

# Sherston living churchyard





Holy Cross churchyard is a living churchyard in more than one sense: it is an open churchyard, meaning that burials still take place there, and it belongs to the Church of England's Living Churchyard and Cemeteries Project (LCCP), which encourages the management of these areas with sympathy for wildlife. This work continues with the support of the county Wildlife Trusts. For many local people, the churchyard is an important guardian of family memories. It is a rare day that does not see several of them visiting and maintaining graves and possibly using one of the benches there to sit and reflect in peace and quiet. Ensuring that the churchyard is a sanctuary for wild flowers, birds and other wildlife can continue alongside its primary use as a place of rest and memories. Although we live surrounded by countryside, the churchyard is still one of the biggest green spaces inside the village, easily accessible and freely available to everyone.

Work to make our local churchyard an environmentally friendly area has been going on for about 15 years. We already know that there are areas of ancient grassland where orchids grew this summer, a veteran yew tree - which is 400-900 years old - and old limestone walls with important colonies of ferns

# Charity shops: Why should we be using them?

Sustainable Sherston welcomes this article from local A level student Lottie Ravenhill. Lottie has been encouraged to shop more sustainably, including making use of charity shops, after realising the impact that fast fashion has on the environment and learning more about the unethical manufacturing and production processes involved.

It's no news that fast fashion poses a detrimental effect on the world and many aspects of life, including the environment, pollution and sustainability. However, many people are unaware of the importance of shopping sustainably to protect the environment. One of the easiest methods of tackling this is right on our doorstep and is often overlooked: charity shops! I'm writing this article in the hope that it will enlighten people as to the vast benefits of charity shops and to persuade more people to choose them over and above high street and online shopping.

Everyone knows that fast fashion can have a negative impact, but I think it's often made out to be less of a problem than it actually is. Most people, whether they are conscious of the global crisis surrounding this topic or not, will still go to the average fast fashion shop or online website disregarding the impact that buying even just one item can have. To put it into perspective, fast fashion produces half a million tonnes of micro plastics a year; 20% of global waste water comes from textile dyeing; and more than US\$500 billion is lost every year due to the lack of recycling and clothing utilisation (https://earth.org/fast-fashion-statistics/). In addition to the shocking figures on the environmental impact fast fashion has, further incentives not to indulge in this culture, include the abundance of child labour and ill treatment of workers. Many workers in fast fashion factories are paid far below the minimum wage, for example US\$1.58 per hour which is far below the average legal wage. They are forced to work for endless hours in conditions that are often unsafe and unsanitary, and many young workers are subject to abuse (www.panaprium.com/blogs/i/fast-fashionworkers-conditions). So surely these facts serve as incentives to shop elsewhere?

Following my points throughout this article, I hope more people can be persuaded to shop in charity shops which, as a disclaimer, is not to say you shouldn't shop anywhere else. However, choosing alternatives to the regular shops can have a massive impact on the environment and improve sustainability.

# Sherston Parish Council

There was an issue recently relating to a vehicle driving maliciously onto the football field causing damage. This resulted in the football club locking the gates for a few days, preventing access to the sports field at short notice. Historically, as a parish council, we have been quite relaxed about our approach to parking on the sports field. However, this incident, albeit hopefully a one-off, prompted a discussion about whether or not we should continue to allow, or restrict, parking.

The outcome of the discussion was that, rather than impose restrictions, which may involve expense, putting up signage and possible barriers, a softer approach was preferred. As a result of which, if you are using any of the facilities on the sports field, we would ask you not to drive across the field, e.g. to access the tennis courts. Please park your vehicle just inside the entrance and walk across to the amenities you are looking to use.

With your support, it is hoped that we can preserve the integrity of the sports field and avoid the need to impose any 'hard' restrictions moving forwards.






