## SOS -Tolsey Surgery – What's been happening since the November update?





We last provided an update in the November Cliffhanger, when we confirmed that, following significant pressure by residents, patients, GPs, Parish and Wiltshire Councils as well as local MPs, we had successfully managed to obtain confirmation from the Integrated Care Board (ICB) that it would support our plans to build a new surgery, and NOT close our existing provision.

Since that time, Cllr Martin Smith and I have met with the Director of Primary Care NHS Bath and North East Somerset, Swindon and Wiltshire ICB, her team, and the GPs on three separate occasions. Martin has also met with the Chief Financial Officer of Wiltshire Council who has confirmed that we have his support.

As a result of these meetings:

- It has been accepted that Sherston needs to retain a surgery in the village.
- The GPs are working to revise their original business plan to better support their requirement for a surgery larger than the one we have now.
- The ICB is revising its methodology for assessing rural surgery requirements nationally (using Sherston and one other surgery as, if you like, guinea pigs). The ICB has advised that our challenge to the original proposal to close the Tolsey highlighted some failures in the ICB's


process in terms of understanding more rural surgery practice requirements – in essence the assessment process was geared more towards towns and cities, whereby people have direct access and transport links to access their local surgery provisions.


- The GPs and ICB will be holding bi-weekly meetings to ensure momentum is maintained.
- It is anticipated that the revision of the business plan together with assessment by the ICB should be completed in January. Assuming the ICB approves/supports the business plan it then needs to be approved by the NHS the timescales of this are yet to be confirmed.


In summary, progress is being made, but we still have a long way to go and do need to keep the pressure up. As such, we will be presenting the recent survey undertaken by residents and patients, the many letters we have received, including some really delightful ones from the children at Sherston Primary School, to the Director of the ICB for our region at the Area Board on 20 February.

We will provide a further update following this meeting. This update will feature in the March Cliffhanger, although we will try to pop something on our Facebook page earlier.

## Village Treasure: The British School Room/ Congregational Church

Chapel founded 1822; subsequently British School Room (BSR) founded 1844.

British school rooms were donated across the country in the early 19th century for 'the free Education of labouring, and other needy classes'.\* It is said that in the whole of London only one remains.

Sherston's BSR was erected in 1844 when an indenture dated 17 May involving Edward Boulton and the Reverend Richard Knibb gave power of ownership to the Reverend D.B. Sherry of 'Great Sherston'. This gentleman sold it on 26 April 1861 for £190 to 10 local trustee benefactors to secure it 'in perpetuity for public use and the advancement of the Christian faith'.\*

The 10 trustees in 1861, who were all linked to the free chapel in Cliff Road, were:

- The Reverend Thomas Mann of Trowbridge.
- The Reverend John Spicer Binder of Great Sherston.
- William Somerville the younger of Bitten, a 'Gentleman of Gloucester'.\*
- Handel Cossham of Pucklechurch, a 'Gentleman of Gloucester'.\*
- Henry Holborow of Great Sherston, a 'Farmer'.\*
- William Newth of Great Sherston, a 'Farmer'.\*
- Samuel Jobbins of Great Sherston, a 'Farmer'.\*
- Ebenezer Witchell of Sopworth, a 'Corn Merchant'.\*
- William Pritchard of Easton Grey, a 'Miller'.\*
- Peter Cook of Tetbury, a 'Draper'.\*
  - \*Quotes from copy of the original deeds.

(It is worth knowing that at one time Sherston was a bigger and busier marketing town than Tetbury.)

On the first page of Sherston Congregational Church's ancient 'Minutes Book' (which is safely lodged in Chippenham Archive Centre), it states that in 1822 preachers regularly came (probably on horseback from Bristol) to a house in Cliff Road which became so crowded that a hole had to be cut in the ceiling so that those upstairs could hear! The number of believers grew so rapidly that a farmer offered his barn (which was in Cliff Road) to become a Free Chapel. (It's worth knowing that the Pilgrim Fathers were Congregationalists – dissenters from the status quo, some of whom were martyred for their faith.) This barn or 'Free Chapel' was accessed from the High Street and the large entrance eventually housed a beautiful little pipe organ. The Chapel was well attended throughout both World Wars for over 100 years, until 2008. Photographs are in our display.

In November, after 15 years, Roger and I made the decision to step down from trusteeship of Sherston's BSR in the hope that new, younger trustees will pick up responsibility for this precious legacy. It is time to pass the baton on. New trustees can be appointed by vote of the Membership of Sherston Congregational Church (SCC) during 2024.

Our main remit over those years has been to painfully

- and with great difficulty - liquidise the ancient SCC assets that had accumulated over 202 years from an amazingly generous membership. These assets were all, totally, in two decaying properties - the Old Chapel and Manse in Cliff Road. Eventually, we were consequently able not only to purchase a new Manse for part-time ministry, but also to use these assets to relocate our worship to, modernise, and hire out for public use, the precious BSR/SCC, keeping the aim stated on the original deeds (which we hope to add to the display soon, plus many other proofs of all the facts given above). That aim was - and remains - 'For the Advancement of the Christian Faith'.

We wish to pay tribute to the regular users of the BSR/SCC who have become friends and supporters over more than a decade, often donating generously and taking more interest and care than necessary – thank you SO much, all of you – a special mention in particular to Heather Martin who did FAR more in the early years to keep things going than is generally known

Sadly, we suffered a very large financial loss last year so it may well be necessary to run one or two events to raise funds in 2024. If so, it would really help if there were a 'Friends of the BSR' group willing to be contacted to see if they could spare a couple of hours on any given date. We would promise not to ask too often but be very grateful for any support. The BSR/SCC has a very efficient Booking and Admin Officer, Alicja Clark, who would like it to be known there are now THREE rooms available for hire: the Hall, the Quiet Room, and the Upper Room, each with its own sink, and kettle. Alicja can be contacted on alicjaclark076@gmail.com and would be happy to show you around if you wish.

SCC services take place at 10.00am Sundays and can alternatively be attended via zoom by contacting Rev. Andrew Williams Tarling at awtcharfield@hotmail.






