# Public Talk: Food, farming and nature

Six inches of soil supports us. It feeds eight billion people. Our food production depends on it, yet working our soil can contribute to biodiversity loss and even to climate change.

Ian Wilkinson, co-founder and Director of FarmED in the Cotswolds, explains how this happens and how to reverse the damage and regenerate healthy soils - for healthy food.

FarmED is a 107-acre mixed farm in Shipton-under-Wychwood, which opened its doors to the public a few years ago, to demonstrate how our soils can be improved and how we can improve our food security by creating a healthy basis for our food production.

Ian brings the latest on nature recovery and sustainable farming, as supported by the Government's Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA), with new farm payments linked to sustainable farming techniques that should look after our soil, nature recovery and biodiversity.

Everyone can improve their soil. Leaving soil

structures intact and growing a wide range of plants increases biodiversity and encourages a wider range of insects, birds and small animals to flourish.

Soil quality can be further improved by keeping 'roots in the ground' and by returning food waste as compost (and, for farmers, livestock manure) back to the land.

Ian will explain how the land can produce CO<sub>2</sub> emissions, the source of our current global warming. He will tell us how we can reverse this problem by maximising carbon storage in the soil - and how to calculate and measure the progress of this carbon capture.

By improving our soils, we can reduce the use of pesticides and chemical fertilisers, which simultaneously allows more organisms to thrive in the soil - and invites more pollinators to add to the success of our plants.

Trees are another tool to bring about improved carbon storage, as well as providing places for insects and other wildlife to live and shelter. There are ways to include trees in the farming landscape too, and combine them with crops or animal grazing.

A fertile soil allows us to grow better food crops, as well as improve the quality of the fruit and veg on our allotments and back gardens and provide us with the food security we need.

Come and find out how we can all be part of the change - to revitalise our soil.

# D-Day 80th anniversary

## 626th Engineers of the American Army

### in Sherston



In March 1944 the American Army arrived in Sherston in preparation for the D-Day landings. Their recollections were recorded in a book compiled by veterans of the 626th. Extracts will be published in the Cliffhanger each month leading up to the 80th anniversary on 6 June.

#### Part 2

On another occasion we found a wire-haired terrier wandering around who was wearing a coat bearing a Medical Corps insignia so we took him in as our company mascot and gave him the nick-name of "Medic." He was a good dog to take along on guard duty. He wouldn't bark if he heard something, just a low growling sound as a warning. We had been informed that the Germans had dropped spies by parachute on several occasions, so 'Medic' was great to have around. Village folklore abounded with ghost stories, another good reason to have our old buddy 'Medic' with us. He was one of the toughest dogs we'd ever seen. He would tangle with dogs twice his size and send them running.

We would march several miles to our motor pool area for various training sessions which included a complete indoctrination about the British people who would be our close neighbors. Captain Mussomeli wanted it made clear that this was their country and we were to abide by 1st Army rules and orders regarding our behavior while in England. The company was lectured on the English people, their customs, their currency and the most important fact, we were here to help them defeat a vicious enemy.

British soldiers and civilians had been living under a tremendous strain.

Clothing as well as food had been rationed. A quote from a U.S. War Dept. bulletin stated. 'It is always said that Americans throw more food in their garbage cans than any other country eats. We have always been a producer nation while most British food is imported even in peace times. For the last several years the British have been taught not to waste the imports that their ships bring in from abroad. British seamen die getting those convoys through and the people have been indoctrinated so thoroughly that they know gasoline and food represents the lives of many merchant sailors. If we waste food and fuel needlessly, it would seem to them that we are wasting the blood of those seamen.

It was Capt. Mussomeli's goal to see that the 626th act and look like well disciplined soldiers and

he intended to impart that image to the people of Sherston.

One of his favorite orders was to call the company to attention as we approached our hamlet making sure that every man was in step and shouting loud and clear when the 'cadence count' was given. The men marched tall and straight and not a soldier was out of step. Everyone's foot hit the pavement in unison and you knew the 'old man' was pleased.

On our way to our motor pool we would pass the church cemetery and noted that the headstones bore dates going back to the 13th century. There were a number of headstones for the Goodenough family. Tom Jensen and Bertil Anderson became acquainted with the Vining family after they had attended services at the Congregational Chapel where Mrs. Vining played the organ. Afterwards they were invited for afternoon tea and sandwiches. When Mrs. Vining left the room Jensen said, 'My God Andy these folks are so poor they have to eat grass!' When she returned she asked how they liked their watercress sandwiches. 'They are mighty fine, thank you Ma'm,' replied Jensen.

Some villagers would invite the G.I.'s to dinner, but we had to remember not to overindulge. Being good hosts they would put out almost their whole monthly food rations and as Americans we were used to eating big meals, so we had to be on our best behavior. We in turn would offer them our PX rations as a token of our appreciation.

**The King's Call to Prayer.**—Prayers and intercessions have been said each evening this week since the invasion began at the Congregational Church by the Minister, the Rev. J. W. Roberts.

**Recreation Field Levelled.**—With certain mechanical appliances being available in the village, the Recreation Field has been levelled, the work being carried out by American soldiers, to whom the Committee, on behalf of the residents, are very grateful. Further improvements are in contemplation by the Committee.

# INVASION OF FRANCE

## HISTORIC WEEK

Four years after the rescue at Dunkirk of that gallant army without which as a nucleus the vast forces of liberation could not have been re-built, the Allied Nations on Tuesday morning last, returned in greater strength to the soil of France.

Early news of the invasion was given by Mr. Churchill the same evening when he announced that the operation was proceeding "in a thoroughly satisfactory manner," and that the sea passage had been made "with far less loss than had been apprehended." Allied forces, he said, had in some cases penetrated several miles inland on the northern coast of France, and fighting was taking place in Caen.

Massed landings of airborne troops were made behind the enemy's lines. The Germans spoke of these landings as being "in great depth," and also reported landings in Guernsey and Jersey.

Nearly 11,000 first-line aircraft are available for the battle, and upwards of 4,000 ships, together with several thousand smaller craft, were engaged in the operations. On Monday night more than 5,000 tons of bombs were dropped on German coastal batteries.

### "THE TIDE HAS TURNED"

General Eisenhower, the Supreme Commander, in an order of the day to his men, said: "The tide has turned! The free men of the world are marching together to victory!"

General de Gaulle, in a message to France, said: "France stands up to take her part in this offensive . . . The sun of our grandeur is appearing once again."

General de Gaulle had previously arrived in England, and had already had discussions with Mr. Churchill and Mr. Eden and with General Eisenhower.

### PROGRESS

In spite of stiffer German resistance, allied operations in Normandy were on Wednesday reported to be progressing according to plan. There were more airborne landings, and a stream of reinforcements poured in from the sea.

Some of the landing parties had linked up, and a German tank attack near Caen was repulsed.

The Germans, who claim that an attack on Caen was frustrated, announced on Wednesday night that airborne landings had taken place on the west coast of the Cherbourg peninsula and 40 miles south of Caen.

The Allied air forces have kept up continuous support for our troops and, besides fighter patrols over the beach-heads, bombers both by night and day have pounded road\* and rail routes leading to the coast.

When Mr. Mackenzie King informed the Canadian House of Commons of the allied landings in France he said it was not to be supposed that there would not be other offensives in other parts of Europe.

### FALL OF BAYEUX

On Thursday official news and correspondents' reports indicated that one of the fiercest and bloodiest battles of the war was in full swing in the towns and villages of Normandy, and on the green fields and roads flanking the coast between Havre and Cherbourg.

Highlights of the news in the communique from the Supreme Headquarters of the Allied Expeditionary Force were that our airborne forces had made contact with the seaborne troops, and that Bayeux had been captured.

The fall of Bayeux, tapestry town five miles inland on the road to Caen, was described at Allied H.Q. as "very good news," and an event "which may open up the advance from that particular point."

There had been fierce armoured fighting, but progress continued despite determined enemy resistance.

In the air our forces have maintained their great superiority despite increasing activity by the Germans. During the 24 hours ended at midnight on Wednesday, 114 enemy planes were destroyed.

An official German announcement on Thursday afternoon said that the Americans made small local gains north-east of Treveres, 10 miles west of Bayeux.


## Sustainable fashion comes to Sherston: Save the Date and Save the Planet!


## A Bunch of Amateurs!

## A Massive Thanks . . .

to those who responded to the Parish Council's plea in last month's issue for 'Community Speed Watch' volunteers to help police Tetbury Road with a view to making our village roads much safer.

A team of nine is currently undergoing police training and we hope to be fully operational this month.

The Parish Council trust that all villagers are in full support of this enterprise and give it the thumbs up and diligence it deserves!

Residents' perception that excessive speeding is prevalent on our roads remains unsubstantiated after numerous traffic surveys, the latest being at selected sites on the B4040 road at Pinkney and Brook Hill.

The 85th percentile speeds (the measurement used by police authorities) to determine speeding levels were 28.87mph and 40.5mph respectively and

both fall well below the threshold for police action/involvement.

NB. The Posted Speed Limits in each case being 30mph and 40mph.

The Parish Council would ask readers not to be despondent at this revelation because a second and more meaningful agenda (as mentioned in the December 2023 issue) is being spearheaded on their behalf by councillor Martin Smith. His view and that of many residents is that our 30mph Posted Speed is too fast for our narrow roads/lanes, particularly those that lack pavements, and a reduction to 20mph is being sought!

NB. Any such change would only be done after local consultation with residents!




