
We would ask all readers to take note of this contribution and show your appreciation by giving serious consideration to the services and products advertised in the Cliffhanger.

Ocean adventurer inspires Guides





1st Sherston Guides were fortunate to have a very special visitor in March. Despite a busy schedule, Roz Savage MBE came to the village hall to meet our enthusiastic bunch of girls and to talk about her amazing adventures rowing single-handedly across not one but THREE oceans - the Atlantic, Pacific and the Indian Ocean. She was the first woman to achieve this.

The Guides had so many questions to ask and Roz answered them all with insight. She told us all about the highs and lows of setting herself this extraordinary challenge including blistered hands, exhaustion, and breaking her oars, which she fixed with duct tape! The year she rowed across the Atlantic was the worst ever for named storms so she had a very tough time. The wildlife she encountered included turtles, dolphins and even a massive whale shark. One day a group of flying squid landed on the deck of her boat! There was a more sobering message about raising awareness of plastic pollution and climate change and how it is affecting some of the low-lying islands she visited.

We found out that Roz was not only a Guide but in fact she was a Queen's Guide too. She believes that her Girlguiding experience shaped her own attitude to life and life's challenges.

She was very brave to row across three oceans and even when her oars, satellite phone and camping stove broke she kept going - Grace

She was so honest that she could tell us that she cried a lot - Eve

She was an inspiration because she rowed so that people would listen to her about the environment - Amelia

She challenged herself on the way even though she wanted to turn back - Val

She is incredible for having won so many Guinness World Records. Also, she was a normal person and now she's famous and such an inspiration - Ava

She didn't do it to raise money, she did it to raise awareness – Eliza


Next Meeting & AGM: Tuesday 2 April. 'Four Seasons Cotswold-Style' by Mandy Bradshaw Cuttings

The police have been notified of this series of events, which are held in accordance with the Road Traffic Act 1988 and the Cycling Races on Highways Regulations 1960.


D-Day 80th anniversary 626th Engineers of the American Army

in Sherston

In March 1944 the American Army arrived in Sherston in preparation for the D-Day landings. Their recollections were recorded in a book compiled by veterans of the 626th. Extracts will be published in the Cliffhanger each month leading up to the 80th anniversary on 6 June.

Part 3

We had to learn how to drive on the opposite side of the road. It took a little while to get used to it, but what made it tougher is that our steering wheels were mounted on the left side of our vehicles while the British had their steering column on the right hand side. The English roads are extremely narrow, especially going through some of the villages that wind through the many hills and valleys. Moving heavy equipment on their roads was a real adventure. The only way we could haul our D-7 bulldozers was to angle the blades as far as possible, even so, we scraped some buildings and other vehicles.




The Quickway crane was a real workhorse. It was mobile and dependable.

The one pictured was John Tyrrell's and Irv Kozola's. Bob Stech and Russ Dockstader had similar cranes.

Quickway truck cranes and crawler cranes also presented unique travel problems, such as low bridges and power lines and tight turns through small villages.

Usually one operator would climb out on the boom and guide the other operator in swinging right or left or booming up or down to clear the obstacle. Picture Irv Kozola or Russ Dockstader sitting out on the end of the stick directing Ray Tyrrell or Bob Stech around a tight 'S' turn.

As equipment operators we marvelled at the expertise and ability of the men who drove the huge armored tank retrievers, commonly called 'Dragon



As a training assignment and as a gesture of thanks from the 'Yanks,' to the people of Sherston we used a variety of our equipment to level Pennymead field for soccer and cricket.

Our Post Exchange was located above Ye Old Rattlebone Inn, named in honour of the village's hero, John of Sherston whose surname was Rattlebone. He was the Captain of the local militia and was known for his prowess with a sword. He was a great fighter and a leader of men. In 1016 King Canute came with a great army with the intent of conquering the area surrounding Sherston. It was the centre of England and was called Mercia. Dreff Wenn was the ancient name of Sherston, but in the 9th century was called Scorrandstone.

John of Sherston mustered his militia and joined the Saxon King, Edmund Ironside. After two fierce days of fighting, King Canute retreated and returned to London. John of Sherston suffering from a gaping abdominal wound fought on to the end using a stone tile to hold his intestines in.

Church of the Holy Cross was erected in the 11th century in the Norman style architecture. On the east wall is a weathered effigy of John Rattlebone clutching a tile against his abdomen. Sherston is a city of historical interest having been invaded by the Romans, Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings. Evidence of Roman ramparts, earthworks ditches and what appeared to be a Roman villa have been found in and around Pennymead field.

The Rattlebone Inn built in the 17th century was a popular meeting place for the local populace. Our PX on the upper floor was just as popular with the children of the village when we received our weekly ration of tobacco, toiletries, candy and gum. The by-word of the local children and evacuees from London was, 'any gum chum?'



Grow Greener@Holy Cross Sherston Living Churchyard



Our churchyard working party at the beginning of March had to be cancelled due to snow. What a surprise that was! When we started work in January, a visitor from the St Mary's Church, Tetbury EcoChurch project remarked on how optimistic we were to be planning outdoor work so early in the year. Well our sessions in January and February were very successful but not so in March! All is not lost however, because volunteers have being working regularly in the churchyard whenever they have time to spare. A gradual evolution is taking place.

As well as looking at the primroses that are flourishing all over the churchyard and have been spread to new areas, this year look out for the wood anemones flowering in the wooded area near the small gate into Church Street. These flowers are an indicator of ancient woodland where you see them in the wild and do not like disturbance. The ones in the churchyard were planted more than 10 years ago and this is the first year they have flowered, so success does not always come quickly. Perhaps they have enjoyed all the rain.

The snow did not stop the plant stall from starting up in March. Nearly all the plants people had donated were sold and the money will go to funding work in the churchyard. There will be further plant sales on 4-7 April and 2-5 May.

Please join us in the churchyard on Saturday 7 April and Saturday 4 May from 10.00am to see what is happening and join the working party. Be prepared for mud and any kind of weather, but not snow! If you can bring your own gardening tools, particularly grass rakes and wheelbarrows, that would be very helpful. Refreshments will be provided

Silver EcoChurch Award for Sherston Church of the Holy Cross





After more than five years of work by the congregation at the Church of the Holy Cross, we have finally achieved a Silver EcoChurch Award. This has involved taking all sorts of measures to make our church more environmentally friendly, from recycling more to installing LED lighting. Most recently, as you will already have seen reported in the Cliffhanger, we have set up a churchyard management plan with the aim of making the churchyard a better place for people and wildlife. Have you already noticed some of the changes taking place? This is the time to admire the new plantings of spring flowers, all native British species. On the west side of the churchyard are two new compost bins which will help to keep things tidier as green waste is put into them rather than left in various places around the churchyard. They also mean that less of our waste is being sent away for disposal by Wiltshire Council, saving resources. These are ideas that you may be able to use in your own gardens, if you don't already. The small actions of many people can make a big difference.

We intend to keep up our efforts to change the way we do things in the church building and churchyard. A big challenge ahead is cutting emissions from our church heating. A recent environmental audit organised by the Diocese of Bristol told us that our electricity supply is not adequate to support a heating system at present so we will have to face some difficult and expensive decisions when our current aged oil boiler needs replacing

We are also getting our congregation to think about their own lifestyles. At a recent service, people completed a questionnaire designed to make them think about changes they could make. The EcoCafé on the first Thursday morning of each month, has lots of information about what people can do to make a difference

We're celebrating our Silver Award but there is still much to do. Please think of how you can join us on this journey of change by making changes in your life.

Back in 2018, Paul started a project to make paintings of all the piers in the south of England. The project grew to include most UK piers, then a few in Europe, which were often influenced by British design. The project expanded into collections of old litho prints, postcards, and newspaper reports from when the piers were first built. After five years, all this is now published as a large-format book, '100 Piers, Painting at the Water's Edge'.


