A Broadcast on behalf of Your General Practice Party!

As we all prepare to go to the polls once again, the Tolsey team want to make you all aware of the current crisis facing GP services in the UK.

For The Tolsey Surgery to stay afloat, we generate income, like many rural dispensing practices, from two major sources: core NHS Funding and our dispensary. This income goes back into the business and helps pay for patient services, staff salaries and our running costs.

You will have all heard us talk previously about the vital importance of our patients using our dispensary to help generate some of this income. Sadly, recent months have seen a further decline in its use and the loss of more of our patients to online delivery services.

Now our core funding is also being eroded.

Here are a few simple facts to help explain why Primary Care is in crisis:

- 90% of all NHS consultations take place in Primary Care but Primary Care only receives 10% of the total NHS funding.
- GPs are now responsible for 18% more patients than in 2015.
- Every day in the UK GPs are seeing more than 1 million patients.
- The profession has lost 1,790 full-time GPs since 2015.
- 106 GP practices have closed in the past year.
- Hospital waiting lists are increasing, meaning patients come back to their GP for more support whilst waiting.

Like our patients, our business is facing rising costs (electricity, water, medical supplies, staff wages) and yet we have received no additional funding to compensate

GPs have been offered an annual uplift of only 1.9% for next year's contract which falls well below inflation. As a result, all practices are struggling to stay afloat, and the profession is currently in dispute with NHS England. If this continues, then your local practice may disappear; you would have to get your medications from elsewhere, and you would need to move to a neighbouring practice.

At The Tolsey Surgery, we are feeling the pressure and are working as hard as we can to provide the best care for our patients. Sometimes this might mean that our team re-direct you to another service (e.g. a Minor Injuries Unit or a pharmacy) to best help you with your problem.

We are concerned and distressed about the current situation too and wish we could do more. We are currently unable to recruit more clinical staff and struggle to fund replacements for retiring staff. All of these factors contribute to longer waiting times for appointments and delays with other services.

If, like us, you feel strongly about these issues then, whichever party you give your support to this July, we urge you to ask them about this before casting your vote. In the meantime, we will continue to do our best to support our patients and provide the personalised care that we take great pride in delivering to our community.

We appreciate your support and consideration during these difficult times for General Practice in the UK.

Sherston Velo Summer Time Trial Series – Round 2



The second round of the Sherston Velo Summer Time Trial Series on Thursday 23 May saw a field of 19 riders from across North Wiltshire, Gloucestershire and Bristol contest the 10-mile course, with a strong tailwind on the opening 6km sector seeing the course records tumble.

In the Open category, Matt Lelliot (Severn Road Club) set a new course record of 24:01, with Simon Cox (Chippenham Wheelers, 25:10) in second place and Simon Vannerley (Sherston Velo, 25:35), the first home club rider to cross the line, in third place. In the female category, Emma Angove (Chippenham Wheelers) was first with a female course record of 28:53, with Kate Potter (Sherston Velo, 31:37) second.

In the Club Handicap TT Championship, Simon Clarke moves into 1st position ahead of Simon Vannerley, with Mark Walsh dropping to third overall. In the female championship, Kate Potter remains in first place. Thanks to the favourable conditions on the night, every club rider improved their best time for the course, with an average improvement of 50 seconds across the field.

Our time trials are held monthly through the summer (see www.cyclingtimetrials.org.uk/club-events for details). Non-members are welcome: any type of bike

may be ridden, but it must have working front and rear lights fitted and approved helmets are mandatory. Entry is £5 (club members £3): registration is in the village hall car park, 6.15-6.45pm. First Team

Sherston Living Churchyard



To start with, an important update about the grass areas in the churchyard.

As many of you will know, we rely heavily on regular visits from a Community Payback team to mow and strim our grass. On 31 May, they were scheduled to work in the churchyard for the whole day, but their visit was cancelled. Previously, on 17 May, they came for half a day but with only two people available to work. The result of this is that, at the time of writing, we have not had much grass cut by them for seven weeks. We realise that some parts of the churchyard currently look uncared for. That is not part of the Living Churchyard plan but due to circumstances outside our control. We would like to thank the volunteers who have stepped in to try and keep some of the active burial areas tidy. More Community Payback visits are scheduled but we do not know in advance if they will go ahead. In the meantime, those volunteers we do have are doing their best but it is an enormous task. Most of these volunteers are not young! We would welcome any younger people who could spare an hour or two to help with grass cutting to get in touch.

Sherston Living Churchyard took part in the Open Gardens weekend with a display of our plans for the churchyard. The new churchyard I-spy trail leaflet was handed out to visitors, along with their map of the village gardens which were open, and visitors can pick up a copy of the trail leaflet in church from now on. Results from the church's 'Count on Nature' were on display: 38 varieties of plant, many of them flowering and so of great importance to insects, have been recorded on the iNaturalist app and the information will feed into national databases and help to build up a picture of how wildlife is faring nationwide. We hope to extend this recording to include butterflies and other insects, and the observations of birds which are already being made each month.





Quite a few people were interested to learn more about what we are doing and were very supportive of the work. One or two expressed definite views that wildlife had no place in the churchyard. It was noticeable that opinions were divided by age, with younger people seeing a connection between the urgent need to support the natural world and the work of the Living Churchyard. In February, the General Synod of the Church of England passed a motion to move biodiversity up the agenda of its Environment Programme. Here is the motion:

'Unprecedented changes in climate and biodiversity, driven by human activities, have combined and increasingly threaten nature, human lives, livelihoods and well-being around the world. Biodiversity loss and climate change are both driven by human economic activities and mutually reinforce each other. Neither will be successfully resolved unless both are tackled together.'

Sherston Living Churchyard is part of this national movement in the Church of England and other churches. As the paper supporting the Land and Nature motion says: 'Caring for nature is central to Christian faith and mission.' We think it is also part of a fight for the long-term existence of our world as we know it.

Please join us in the churchyard on Saturday 6 July from 10.00am to see what is happening and to join the monthly working party if you would like to. Be prepared for mud and any kind of weather as we will still go ahead except in the worst conditions. If you can bring your own gardening tools that would be very helpful. Refreshments will be provided. In July, we will be supporting the plant stall for Boules weekend so bring along anything spare from your garden to be sold in the High Street that weekend. Between downpours on Friday 14 June, a group from the village joined the theatre company 'Uninvited Guests' in walking the river, and imagining the future of the river and of Sherston. Our words were then spoken back to us, integrated into a musical soundscape.

The event at Sherston paralleled events at Avonmouth and Shirehampton. The project is a University of Bristol initiative, looking at original ways of understanding what riverside communities want and need from their rivers. The output will be made available as a resource to policymakers and bodies such as Wessex Water. If the project is successful, the method will be used for other community inputs for the local environment. We will hear more later in the year, possibly meeting other groups.

We thoroughly enjoyed the activity, stepping outside our usual practical concerns to imagine what could be. Focusing from the usual general environmental concerns onto the specifics of the future of the river really focused the mind.

Of course – never work with children or animals, the heifers in the field were very taken with our group and had to be discouraged by Richard Skeffington!
