

Have your say! Consultation on 20mph speed limit





As reported previously over many months, I have been working in collaboration with the Parish Council and Wiltshire Highways on a 20mph scheme for Sherston. This was triggered by contact from many residents over their concerns about speeding on the B4040 and down our narrow lanes, many having no pavements.

Wiltshire Council measured traffic speeds and volumes around the village and, based on the data collected, made this proposal. When this was last discussed at a Parish Council meeting, it was agreed that the proposal should be put to public consultation.

Residents of Easton Town may be disappointed that this has not been included in the scheme; however, the average speed there was measured at 27.2mph. The issue facing residents is that, while 30.6% of motorists were indeed exceeding the speed limit and 10% were travelling over 35mph, unfortunately current Wiltshire Highways policy states that a 20mph speed limit will be approved only where recorded average speeds are at or under 24mph. In mitigation however, I'm working with the Parish Council on a Speed Indicator Device for Easton Town; these do have a proven impact on reducing speeds.

Please take the time to respond to the consultation whether you are in support of it, or not.

Use the MyWilts App!

Sherston Parish Council would like to remind villagers to use the MyWilts app to get things done by Wiltshire Council. The app is available for Apple or android devices and is also accessible through the Wiltshire Council website (https://my.wiltshire.gov.uk/). Recently updated, MyWilts now offers improvements including upgraded mapping technology for street scene and enforcement reports, plus improved email communication, so users can receive more updates about their report. It is the quickest and easiest way to report issues from road defects to fly-tipping.

Delays to plans for the new GP surgery; an update from Cllr Martin Smith

On Wednesday 21 August, at the instigation of our new MP, Roz Savage, I attended a meeting with her and Sue Harriman, the CEO of the Integrated Care Board (ICB, which is the part of the NHS that looks after GP surgeries). This was on the back of a lack of communication since earlier in the year on progress towards getting a new building for our GPs in Sherston.

We impressed upon them the urgency of sorting things out given the potential cliff edge we are approaching as regards the lease on the Tolsey. We also mentioned the difficulties in retention and recruitment that this is causing the practice. I reiterated that no NHS capital budget is required due to the combined plan of Wiltshire Council and the developers - they understood all these points.

We asked them what the next steps are. There is still the need to further refine the data in the toolkit they use to define the future service provision and requirement for buildings across North Wiltshire; they then need to prioritise, make the decision and get approval from NHS England before we know we can build a new GP surgery.

I asked them for timelines as to when they think decisions will be made; one of the ICB Directors will be getting back to us on that in the very near future. I will share that with residents as soon as we get it.

bottles of juice! Not only is our juice local; but using our hand-driven presses means that any carbon emissions are minimal (just our hard work!)

So, if you have bags of surplus apples, please bring them along to the village hall. The huge apple bag will be in place ready for your contributions from the afternoon of Sunday 29 September. But if your apples tend to be ready earlier, please do contact us so we can estimate quantities and be ready to press on our first date (25 September)!

We look forward to seeing everyone on Apple Day at Sherston Village Hall and field!






Local hero's grave uncovered

On Saturday 10 August a group of Sherston Living Churchyard volunteers lifted the canopy of the large conifer near the path to the vicarage to reveal the hidden graves below, and nearby we discovered the grave of Lt. Col. Keith Graham Menzies, OBE, MC, who served with the Welsh Guards. He was born on 6 May 1888 and died on 7 December 1952.

He was awarded the Military Cross in 1918 for 'conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty', and the King allowed him also to wear the Croix de Guerre awarded by the President of France for distinguished service.

In 1922 he married newly widowed Mrs Violet Keppel and they lived at Easton Town Farm, Sherston. He died in Malmesbury Hospital. His brother, Major General Sir Stewart Graham Menzies, KCMG,DSO,MC (1890-1968) bought Bridges Court in Luckington in 1923 and from 1939-1952 was Head of the British Secret Service (known simply as 'C'), meeting Winston Churchill over 1,500 times during the 2,064 days of WW2, and led the Enigma codebreakers at Bletchley Park. His ashes are laid to rest in Luckington churchyard.



News from the Tolsey Surgery

The Tolsey is delighted to welcome our new GP Trainee (Registrar), Dr Sima Gurung, to the practice.

Dr Gurung has spent several years working at the Great Western Hospital in Swindon as part of her training towards becoming a GP. She has a wealth of experience; before qualifying as a doctor, she trained as a nurse.

She will be with us until at least autumn 2025. During that time she will be taking her Royal College exams alongside seeing patients at the surgery.

We know that everyone will do their very best to make her feel welcome and part of the team.

Uncollected Medication:

Following last month's article about uncollected medication, we thought it might be useful to show a photo of the uncollected medication for July (see below). Some of these items are regular medications requested by patients, whilst others are acute prescriptions including antibiotics.

Not only is this a waste of medication but also a waste of practice money. The value of the medication in the picture is several thousand pounds. If medication isn't collected then we are unable to claim for the cost of the items that we have had to buy in. Many cannot be reused once issued to a patient and so this results in a financial loss to the practice.

We all have a duty to try to prevent the harmful environmental effects of medicine wastage in the UK, as well as helping our village practice stay financially viable. We therefore strongly urge patients to collect their medication to help with this situation.



Grab a Crabapple for a Jelly Good Cause!



This September, Tracklements, the award-winning condiment maker based in Easton Grey, is encouraging the local community to don their wellies, take a walk in the countryside and start collecting crabapples for a terrific cause!

Tracklements is partnering with Sherston Primary School to collect crabapples to make English Crabapple Jelly: 50p for every kilogram of crabapples donated is given to the school, as well as a further 25p from every jar sold nationwide. Running for over 20 years, the project has raised over £13,500!

Not only does the project raise money for the school, it is also a great way to teach Sherston's young people about the provenance of their food by showing them the process from tree to jar, as well as using fruit which may otherwise go to waste.

A forager's delight, crabapples are small, 'wild'apples which, whilst hard and inedible raw, make an exquisite, jewel-coloured jelly. Associated with love and marriage, crabapple trees can often be found in British hedgerows, nestled amongst other trees.

If you would like to support the children of Sherston and you are planning a country walk this September, why not take a bag along and see if you pass any wild crabapple windfalls? Tracklements would love them.

Our Living Churchyard – tackling the greenery after a summer of growth!



Much work has taken place in the churchyard at the Holy Cross since the beginning of August. Our usual monthly volunteer session was held on Saturday 3 August and saw four people at work with strimmers, and others mowing and raking up grass.

As I write this, the Community Payback team has just spent a full day in the churchyard with five people mowing and strimming. There is still a backlog of work to bring the state of the churchyard to that envisaged in the Living Churchyard Management Plan, but we are heading in the right direction. For the future a lot depends on the weather and the availability of Community Payback. Let's hope we have good fortune with both!

Once again we repeat our plea for volunteers; if you would like to help, and particularly if you have strong feelings about the need to keep certain areas of the churchyard more closely managed, why not help to make it happen? Come along at 10am on the first Saturday of the month and you will be very welcome.

Please remember that your village church is solely run by volunteers and everything is paid for by voluntary contributions and fund-raising. We have no financial input from the central Church of England to maintain the churchyard or the building, so local support is vital.

The Coffee Shop will have an eco theme on Thursday 5 September. Local Author Talk: 'Past, Present, Presence', a companion guide to the Athelstan Pilgrim Way



Many of you will have known or heard of Hilary Peters. She called herself a part-time hermit and lived for the last 15 years of her life in Worcester Lodge, Didmarton, the gatehouse for the Badminton Estate which is visible to us from many different places in our beautiful countryside around here.

As caretaker and gatekeeper, no one could have asked for more. Hilary would share her home with any stranger who wished to drop in, and impart her extensive knowledge of the Lodge and estate along with provision of her home-made refreshments. For us who knew her, she was the warmest and most truly sincere person we have probably met. The late Duke wished her to live in Worcester Lodge as 'she was the right person'.

Unbeknown to almost everyone, Hilary had been on a 'church crawl' (her words) around the churches of the North Wiltshire deanery, with a few of her close friends. She had mentioned to Catherine Price, who works for Malmesbury Abbey, about creating some sort of pilgrim way or passport, between these churches.

And then Hilary suddenly died. And by chance, I met Catherine. My book, 'Past, Present, Presence' is an account of Hilary, her life, achievements, and how she is the inspiration for the newly created Athelstan Pilgrim Way, linking over 30 churches that she visited and wrote brief notes about. My book is the companion guide to the Athelstan Pilgrim Way, and I talk about each of the churches, taking Hilary's thoughts, and discovering for myself

the history, people, villages, communities, and of course, the churches, involved.

I am telling the story of what I discovered about Hilary and how the Athelstan Pilgrim Way came about from a conversation between two friends. Whether you knew Hilary, or would like to find out who she was, she is remembered for 'an extraordinary life well lived'.

Ian was born and raised on Merseyside spending many an hour watching the arrivals and departures at Liverpool's busy Pier Head in the 1950s and 60s. Ian's enthusiasm for his subject is clearly evidenced in his illustrated talk. This tells the ship's remarkable story, from her original design through the different phases of her working life. It describes life on board and her incredible salvage and return to Bristol in 1970, her restoration, preservation, and re-launch as a multi award winning museum of international renown. Ian has delivered his talk at the National Maritime Museum as well as Probus, Rotary, Inner wheel, WI, National Trust, Arts societies as well as U3a groups. 


