

Sustainable Sherston is hosting its fourth Apple Day, celebrating local produce, on Sunday 6 October (10.00am-3.00pm, Sherston Village Hall) celebrating local produce.

The Friends of Sherston School will be in the big hall, with apple-themed games and face-painting for children. Meanwhile, in the field (or under cover in rainy weather) will be our local food producers, who are all helping towards our net-zero carbon journey, whether by farming regeneratively, producing locally or offering organic, unprocessed foods. Each of them helps to reduce our carbon footprint. As well as offering food for sale, they will all be happy to talk about their businesses and explain how they are run. There will be fruit and veg, honey, meat from Luckington Farm, cheese - and even olive oil tastings.


Bring your apples

Apple Day is a celebration of our local apple harvest. Please bring your local surplus apples and add them to the apple bag (between the village hall and the wooden shed on the left) any time from now up until Apple Day. The best apple juice is made from an even mix of eaters and cooking apples. So bring whichever apples you have (in good condition please) and we will mix them up for pressing.

On the day, we will be apple pressing, using our large 'cheese press' and our smaller 'demo' press - with free juice tastings. There will be bottles of filtered, pasteurised local juice on sale which will last more than a year unopened!

This year - for Apple Day only - we have a special offer on the juice: : four bottles for just £10. Or: one bottle for £3.50, two for £6.

This autumn, as part of its commitment to be environmentally friendly, local condiment-maker, Tracklements, is calling for the community to donate their unwanted medlar fruit. Tracklements turns this peculiar fruit into its delightful Aromatic Medlar Jelly, with 50p from the sale of each jar going towards helping the bees: 25p goes towards purchasing bee-friendly medlar trees, which blossom later in the year after other blossoms have faded, providing an invaluable source of pollen; and 25p is donated to the British Beekeepers' Association, a charity committed to promoting the importance of and protecting the British honeybee.

Now in its 14th year, the project has helped plant



almost 200 beautiful bee-friendly medlar trees across Britain and has contributed to Tracklements donating thousands of pounds to the British Beekeepers' Association, £3,000 last year alone!

Sherston Living Churchyard

As we are in the process of cutting back grass that has been allowed to grow long to help wildlife – as well as the areas we have not had the resources to mow more often this summer - it's a good time to think about a possible unintended side effect. Hedgehogs love these untended areas but, unlike other animals, they don't run away at the sound of an approaching mower. They are well known for curling up into a defensive ball when threatened and sadly this means that they can hide unseen in long grass and be killed. Many of you may have left wild areas in your gardens in support of wildlife so, when you clear them for the winter, do check carefully first that there isn't a hedgehog in there. In the churchyard, we also find slow-worms in the grass, although they will make off with enough noise to alert them to approaching danger. Both these creatures are under threat from loss of habitat; our gardens and countryside have become hostile to them. We can all help them to make a comeback and the information from our friends at Greening Tetbury gives you some ideas about how you can help (see below).





Recycling Facilities

Kerbside Collection - check the Wiltshire Council website for up-to-date information of what they do and do not take.

The Household Recycling Centre at Stanton St

Quinton - take a look at their website to see what they take, you no longer need to to book in advance! Soft plastics

Tesco Tetbury and Tesco Yate -

collection points available in the stores.

Please make sure all the plastics are clean.

Batteries

Batteries are collected by Wiltshire Council with its kerbside recycling, placed in a sandwich bag on top of the blue-lidded bin. Batteries are no long collected by Sustainable Sherston in the village.

Low-energy light bulbs

Sherston High Street telephone box. Please no candescent or halogen light bulbs.

Medicine blister packs

Small quantities only can be taken to Superdrug in Bath or Stroud.

Clothes and Shoes Collection Point
