Speeding update Sherston Parish Council

When I was elected, a priority - based on feedback from residents - was to address speeding in the village. As you will no doubt have seen, working with the Parish Council, we have installed 'village gates' on Easton Town, Tetbury Road, Knockdown Road and Brook Hill.

Some months ago, Wiltshire Council consulted on a proposed 20mph limit for the centre of the village; I'm hopeful that soon we will get a recommendation from council officers for that project to go ahead. Wiltshire Council will pay 70% of the cost, with the Parish picking up the rest.

Again, working with the Parish Council, we have permission from Wiltshire Highways for Speed Indicating Devices (SIDs) on Easton Town and Tetbury Road. These are devices that display the speed of an oncoming motorist. The one on Easton Town should be in place shortly. The one at Tetbury Road will follow later in the year.

With all these things combined, I believe we will see a positive impact on speeding in the village, and all road users - motorists, pedestrians, cyclists and horseriders - will feel safer.

2025 with Sustainable Sherston



Think global, act local! It's not just about the recycling!

Sustainable Sherston (SuS) works on a wide range of local sustainability activities and promotes information and resources about the global issues that affect us all.

In 2024, SuS tested river water quality, planted trees at The Tarters, Grove Wood and Commonwood Lane, hosted a talk about oceans by Roz Savage (now our local MP), hosted FarmEd for a talk on food, farming and nature recovery, helped publicise local sustainability groups at the Malmesbury Area Board, hosted Future River Soundings with the University of Bristol, maintained the community orchard (with its new bench to enjoy the orchard), recycled printer cartridges, donated towards a solar panel system at Sherston Magna Cricket Club, supported Boules Day and, of course, held Apple Day in conjunction with the Friends of Sherston School (FSS).

Our 2025 programme builds on last year's work, continuing close links with Sherston School, the FSS, Sherston Living Churchyard and local sustainability groups. A Sherston favourite, the Village Garage Sale, will make its return this year.

In March 2024, an ex-military friend, Dan, and I took on The Great Tommy Sleep Out challenge in Sherston and raised around £1,200 for The Royal British Legion. We crept into the woods in Pinkney (don't worry, we had permission!) slung up our 'bashas' and cooked up some dinner - I had steak, broccoli and a beer, while Dan, for some inexplicable reason, cooked the world's most disgusting boil-in-the-bag fish!

The Great Tommy Sleep Out is a national awardwinning fundraising challenge designed to support veterans who are experiencing homelessness in the UK right now. During the month of March, volunteers sleep out beneath the stars and fundraise for veterans across the UK. While the challenge doesn't replicate rough sleeping, it does give an idea of the situation that far too many of the nation's heroes find themselves in.

Dan and I are going to do it again this year but realised we'll be asking the same friends for sponsorship, so the only way to truly raise funds would be to invite more people to join us.

So who's up for it?

Here's our plan, a plan that can involve the whole village. We are going to invite over-18s to join us for one night from 8.00pm to 8.00am for a simple sleep out under the stars - in and out in 12 hours and leaving not a trace behind us.

Sherston Scout Group leaders are on board and will be organising something for Beavers, Cubs and Scouts.

Families, mums, dads, kids and pets, please have your own back garden sleep out!

And finally, a no less important group who we will call 'The Stay At Home Guard'. If you are in any way unable to sleep out, simply sleep in, 'basha out' on the floor or the sofa and stay involved too.

I'm talking with Lisa Cooksley-White, the CEO of Royal British Legion Industries and she loves the idea, we will be the first community to attempt this!

Sherston After-School Gardening Club

Sherston After-School Gardening Club will be starting this month. We are registered with the RHS Campaign for School Gardening and will be working towards School Gardening Award Level 1 this spring.

Our work this term - depending on the weather - will include building a 'dead hedge' and raised 'keyhole garden' for growing vegetables, cutting back and replanting the existing autumn raspberries and planting bare-root fruit trees, renovating the bug hotel and creating wildlife habitats, and learning about compost, ecosystems and biodiversity - and tool safety.

Local Author Talk: Saturday 25 January



Many of you will have known or heard of Hilary Peters. She called herself a part-time hermit and lived for the last 15 years of her life in Worcester Lodge, Didmarton, the gatehouse for the Badminton Estate visible to us from many different places in our beautiful countryside around here.

As caretaker and gatekeeper, no one could have asked for more. Hilary would share her home with any stranger who wished to drop in, and impart her extensive knowledge of the Lodge and estate along with provision of her home-made refreshments. For those of us who knew her, she was the warmest and most truly sincere person we have probably met. The late Duke wished her to live in Worcester Lodge as 'she was the right person'.

Unbeknown to almost everyone, Hilary had been on a 'church crawl' - her words - around the churches of the North Wiltshire deanery, with a few of her close friends. She had mentioned to Catherine Price, who works for Malmesbury Abbey, about creating some sort of pilgrim way or passport, between these churches.

And then Hilary suddenly died. And by chance, I met Catherine.

My book, 'Past, Present, Presence' is an account of Hilary; her life, her achievements, and how she is the inspiration for the newly created Athelstan Pilgrim Way, linking over 30 churches that she visited and wrote brief notes about. My book is a companion guide to the Athelstan Pilgrim Way, and I talk about each of the churches, taking Hilary's thoughts, and discovering for myself the history, people, villages, communities and, of course, the churches, involved.

I am telling the story of what I discovered about Hilary and how the Athelstan Pilgrim Way came about from a conversation between two friends. Whether you knew Hilary, or would like to find out who she was, she is remembered for 'an extraordinary life well lived'.

Launched earlier this year in Malmesbury Abbey, the Athelstan Pilgrim Way includes Sherston, Alderton, Luckington and all the other churches in the Gauzebrook Group. Our patron is author and historian Tom Holland.

My talk is at Holy Cross church, Sherston, on Saturday 25 January, from 3.00pm. All are welcome, and refreshments will be available. I will also be signing copies of 'Past, Present, Presence'. For more information, please email sherston@gauzebrook.org


