## Tetbury Road Community Speed Watch update

Community Speed Watch (CSW) is an education and prevention scheme, not enforcement, and it is considered as the first response to address speeding issues. However, where problems persist, Community Policing Teams (CPTs) work in partnership with CSW volunteers, meaning that enforcement can

CSW volunteers, meaning that enforcement can - and will - be undertaken.

Every two weeks, CPTs review nationwide data that CSW teams have submitted to identify which locations need to be prioritised. Priority is given to locations with the highest recorded individual speed and the most recorded number of speedsters and, lo and behold, the data from our inaugural speed watch sessions resulted in the inclusion of Tetbury Road on this list.

A Speed Enforcement Officer report is subsequently provided to the CSW team leader highlighting the recorded activity by police and the inevitable outcome. The following report relates to a police officer's surveillance:

'I carried out a session on 26/3/2025 on Tetbury Road and 12 vehicles have been issued with notices of intended prosecution for excessive speeding. The fastest vehicle was captured at 45mph in a 30mph zone. Depending on previous convictions and history, 10 drivers will be offered a Speed Awareness Course, two drivers will face £100 fine and get three points.'

Proceedings will now be undertaken to ensure the most appropriate outcome for the offenders takes place, which includes checking for MOT, insurance and point totters. Captured footage can and will be

analysed for other offences like unfastened seat belts and mobile phone use whilst driving!

In addition to all of the aforementioned, I would like to draw readers' attention to another significant contributing factor, namely: the intelligence gathered by CSW teams is also used by the police to identify hotspots and to target individual persistent speeding motorists. Our CSW peak time vehicle counts confirm beyond a shadow of a doubt that Tetbury Road is a 'rat run' for commuters and therefore a likely

hotspot for further speed enforcement.

Sherston Parish Council has approved a soon-to-beinstalled Speed Indicator Device on Tetbury Road so my team and I remain hopeful that we can continue to play a productive role alongside this technology and slow down motorists.

With a young family with two preschoolers having recently moved in on Tetbury Road, we are more determined than ever to help make it safe.

As residents will be aware, there is going to be a 20mph speed limit covering the following streets within Sherston village: Church Street, Woods Close, High Street, Grove Road, Cliff Road, Silver Street, Court Street, Knockdown Road, Northend Gardens, Anthony Close, Sandpits Lane, Green Lane, Strongs Close, Manor Close, Butlers Close, Saxon Close, Brook Hill, Noble Street, Tanners Hill, Bustlers Hill and Thompsons Hill.

The latest update from Wiltshire Highways is that the signs will start being installed around mid-July. Once the signs are in place, the speed limit takes effect.

Peter lived in the village for most of his life and was always keen to ensure that he did his best for the community. When SOSCIC was formed in 2010 'for the purpose of renovating and converting the Old School to provide increased employment opportunities and additional services for the community and help preserve the character of the High Street', he played an important role in fundraising and indeed drawing up the plans for the conversion of the Old School to commercial use.

In recognition of this great service and as a permanent reminder of the important role Peter played in ensuring the success of this project, we have made arrangements to place a plaque in the foyer leading into the Co-op premises.

#### **SOSCIC Annual Donation**

I am pleased to report that the SOSCIC Board has found itself in the happy position to make a donation of £10,000 this year to the Parish Council which is to be put towards 'village good causes'. Hugh described how Brown became the UK's most famous landscape designer of the 18th century, his nickname coming from his fondness for describing country estates as having great 'capabilities' for improvement. He designed vast landscapes as a setting for mansions such as Bowood, Stowe and Blenheim which were surrounded by woodland, parkland dotted with trees, serpentine-shaped lakes, temples and bridges. Hugh is a former member of the Kent Gardens Trust and has delivered talks and contributed to books on Capability Brown. We were delighted to give him the opportunity to do it again!



The first plant stall of the season in March was very successful in raising funds to carry forward work in the churchyard. As I write, the April plant sale got underway this morning and there will be another one from 2 to 5 May, and in June, the Living Churchyard will be supporting the Church Open Gardens weekend by holding the Plant Stall on 8 and 9 June. All funds raised that weekend will go towards maintenance of the church fabric.

We now have two large compost bins in the churchyard which are helping to retain our green waste on site rather than sending it all away for disposal. On the east side of the churchyard, under the trees near Anthony Close, is a newly constructed dead hedge. This is formed from two rows of heavy stakes; tree prunings and other large pieces of green waste are held in between them and slowly rot down. In the process, they form a valuable habitat for small mammals and insects.

Love Your Burial Ground Week, organised by the charity Caring for God's Acre (see caringforgodsacre.org. uk) takes place 8-16 June. This coincides with Great Big Green Week, which you can read about on page 5. Look out for information coming about what will be happening in the churchyard. We hope to be taking part in Churches Count for Nature so that we can let you have



some information about exactly what wildlife there is in the churchyard. The information will also be fed into national databases to help better understand the environmental role of churchyards.

Please join us in the churchyard on Saturday 3 May from 10.00am to see what is happening and join the working party if you would like to. Be prepared for mud and any kind of weather as we will still go ahead except in the worst conditions. If you can bring your own gardening tools, particularly grass rakes and wheelbarrows, that would be very helpful. Refreshments will be provided

#### Tea, chocolate and connection

I run Wild Roses - a weekly women's yoga circle in Sherston. We gather in the village hall for yoga, meditation and to sit in a circle with cups of herbal tea and chocolate. I started this 'yoga class with a difference' because I was craving community and connection myself.

I had run circles in London since 2018 and found them to be a beautiful practice. Whilst it's not therapy, the experience can be incredibly cathartic. It can be profound sharing your voice with no agenda, knowing that all emotions are welcome! Most importantly, there's no advice, interruptions or feedback, and nothing that is shared goes beyond the walls of the village hall. Wild Roses takes place each Wednesday, 7.30pm-9.00pm in Sherston Village Hall.

Women's circles are ancient practices that have been around for thousands of years. At their simplest forms, they are where women of all ages come together to sit in a circle, often around a centre piece which can be as simple as a candle, and talk and listen to one another.

I have now created 'Gather', a monthly two-hour circle where we incorporate an activity - often a craft or a collaboration. So far, we've had sound baths, tarot reading, block printing, journaling, crystal workshops, and, last month, we went into the woods to make nature terrariums, and sit around a fire amongst the bluebells and the blackbirds for World Earth Day! The next Gather, 'Blossom', is on Tuesday 13 May 7.00pm-9.00pm at the Red Pepper Project, near Tetbury (GL8 8PH). We'll








gather either outside or in the cosy polytunnel for tea, sweet treats, meditation and sharing before we create our own flower moons from willow wreaths and stunning locally sourced dried flowers. We will then sit around the fire to close our circle under the magic of the full moon, lanterns and festoon lights.

These circles are open to women of all ages and I encourage you to come along if you are curious. There is never any pressure to share, just being with like-minded folk and listening is a beautiful way to spend an evening.

I also run private circles or ceremonies for special occasions, such as hen dos, baby showers and birthdays. These can be a wonderful alternative way to honour milestones; I can incorporate yoga, meditations, rituals and sound healing into the event. I also offer wellness events for businesses which can be a great way to boost employee health and wellbeing.



# Sherston entertained by Rumours SHERSTO | DRAMA GROUP

Last month, Sherston Drama Group performed Neil Simon's fast-paced comedy, Rumours, co-directed by Katie Skeffington and Tahiti Van Rooyen. The story follows four couples getting together to celebrate the 10th wedding anniversary of Charles and Vivian Brooks. However, when the guests arrive, they find Charles has been shot, and Vivian is nowhere to be seen! The play follows the guests as they attempt to make sense of what's happened and work out how to save their hosts (and themselves) from scandal.

Simon's script contains many twists and hidden links (which left the cast and crew still debating the finer points of the plot even after three months of rehearsals) as well as an abundance of witty one-liners. The first couple to arrive were Ken (Clive Renton) and Chris (Nicola Pearce–Smith). Audiences enjoyed Ken's strained attempts to keep everything under control and Chris' handling of every bizarre situation that was thrown at her.



Meanwhile, Graeme Strachan played Leonard, a sarcastic and irritable accountant who had just had his BMW t-boned. The play came to a climax with Len's monologue near the end of the second half – a comic masterpiece that somehow simultaneously made no sense at all but also explained everything. Leonard's wife, Claire was played by Joanna Maddams, who delivered her lines with dry wit, providing a refreshing contrast to the hysteria found elsewhere.





Clive Whitehouse perfectly portrayed Glenn, a politician preoccupied with his own image and coping with his jealous wife, Cassie (played by Sheelagh Hudleston who relished acting out crystal loving Cassie's eccentric tendencies). Another big character, Cookie, was played by Andrea Porter with great timing and physical comedy. Meanwhile Caroline (Sue Ormiston) tried to use her professional skills as a therapist to remedy the situation but may have needed therapy herself by the end. Rounding up the cast, Richard Skeffington played Sergeant Cusack with verbose authority.
