Campaign for new surgery: We need your support again!



Background

As residents and patients will know, there has been a plan for a new GP surgery in Sherston for many years. We have been involved over the last four years working with the GPs, MPs (both previous and current) and the Integrated Care Board (ICB), which is the part of the NHS that covers GPs and primary care.

You may remember, we led a campaign 18 months ago - strongly backed by Sherston Parish Council and the community - to oppose a proposal to merge the Tolsey with Malmesbury Primary Care Centre. After the community pulled together and showed their concern at these proposals, the ICB withdrew its plan. Since then, we have had numerous meetings with the ICB, GPs and Roz Savage MP.

Despite warm words from the ICB directors, we are no closer to a decision on a new building for the Sherston surgery. The last update recognised again that Sherston cannot just be shoehorned into Malmesbury, but there were still no timescales for any decision! We're acutely aware that there is not much time left on the lease on the Tolsey building; we need new surgery space in Sherston very soon!

With continuing housing development in Malmesbury, the demand on the Primary Care Centre will become intense; the thought of Sherston patients having to go there as well is a completely mad idea, with the prolonged journey times, increased traffic congestion through Malmesbury's narrow streets and the likelihood of not finding a parking space.

How can you help?

To enable Roz Savage MP to raise this matter in Parliament and voice the huge concern of the community with ministers, it's very important that we all sign her online petition. Dog poo... yes, in a line of the subject again!

Attention ALL dog owners: Despite numerous polite attempts recently to highlight the reasons why you should pick up your dog's poo, there seem to be some owners who think this does not apply to them.

Not only has the situation on the public right of way behind The Tarters worsened (with upwards of 20 poo bags being dumped on the side of the path), certain owners also seem to think that the public area outside The Rattlebone is a 'dog toilet' - yes, you have been spotted on CCTV!

The parish council maintenance man is not employed to clear up your dog poo bags; he has many other (more pleasant) jobs to be getting on with. There are plenty of bins around the village to dispose of your dog poo bags or, failing that, take them home to dispose of.

We would like to remind dog owners that it is the law for dog owners to clean up after their dog in public places. A few points to bear in mind:

- Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be issued with a fixed penalty notice of up to £100. If taken to court, this could result in a fine of up to £1,000 and a criminal record.
- Not having any bags is not an acceptable excuse, so make sure you have some with you when you leave your home.
- You must not leave bags of dog waste on the ground or in a hedge.
- It is not enough to bury or cover up dog waste; it must be removed.

We hope that 'offenders' will take heed of these notifications. However, rest assured, if you do not, we will seek to name and shame (where we have evidence) and to issue fines/prosecute identified repeat offenders. Sherston Parish Council

Sherston clangers: the bells, the bells ...

You hear us every Wednesday evening, and most Sunday mornings, and probably have a vague idea of what we do, but would you like to know more?

We have six church bells in Sherston (Holy Cross Church) and they have been rung regularly since first hung several centuries ago. Church bell-ringing started as a method to summon the community to services and weddings, whilst also marking important occasions — you might have heard us ringing for the VE Day celebrations last month.

Bell-ringing in Britain is different to anywhere else as the bells are hung beneath a large wheel which enable the bells to move in an arc over 360 degrees, importantly this enables the bell's movement to be halted at the top of that arc which then enables the sequence of the bells to be changed - change ringing. Bell-ringers are not campanologists (they study bell-ringing, whilst ringers ring the bells) but bell-ringing does involve some homework and it takes some time to master how to 'handle' the bell well enough to become confident in the more complicated sequences (changes) of the bells in what is known as 'method ringing'. It is good exercise, the heaviest bell weighing just over eight hundred weight (425kg), but also tests your mental and listening skills whilst working in a team. And it's also very social – most evening rings are followed by a visit to the 'bone.

If you would like to know more, why not come and have a look at the bells, give them a 'ding' and have a visit to the top of the tower - it will be open on the Saturday of Open Gardens Weekend for ticketed timed visits (see below).

Climb Sherston's church tower!

Have you ever wondered what it feels like to chime a church bell? Or, have you ever wondered what the view is like from the church tower in Sherston? Well, now is your chance to do both!

For one day only - Saturday 7 June - we are offering an insight into the wonders of church bell-ringing and a view from the top in a single ticket! Each entry will be timed. First entry 1.00pm, last entry 4.00pm, £10 per adult, £5 per accompanied child. (No unaccompanied children under 16.) Booking essential - tickets will be on sale outside the post office, 10.00am-12.00noon. All monies raised will go towards new ropes for the bells.

Very well done to the Grove Wood working group!

I invited Ann Skinner to cast her expert eye over Grove Wood late in April. She spent many years with the Environment Agency as a Senior Naturalist and now looks after the Corston Quarry and Pond Local Nature Reserve. As you may know, Grove Wood is a relatively small, isolated fragment of ancient woodland, which means the land has been continuously wooded since at least 1600 AD. Such woodlands are considered irreplaceable habitats because of their high biodiversity and the unique ecosystems they support.

Ann was very complimentary about the health and biodiversity on display in Grove Wood. She praised the working group of volunteers (ably led by Cllr Nigel Freeth) for their 'excellent hazel coppicing in rotation', which has encouraged the growth of 29 species of plant and 20 types of tree. Five species of bird were also heard during the one-hour visit.

Ann picked up on a couple of things to work on in the future but, overall, she commended how it was being looked after. If you are interested in joining this working group, we will be improving the top path on Saturday 26 July. Please email the Parish Council clerk to get involved: clerk@sherston.org.uk.

In the meantime, when you visit the wood, please stick to the paths, pick-up after your dogs and help us to help the wildlife in the wood to continue for the next 400 years! *Cllr Martin Smith*

VE Day: News headlines





The VE Day newspaper above was purchased by my father Harold F. Turner on 8 May 1945. He was born in 1903 and raised in Chipping Sodbury. Being too old for the armed services in 1938, he joined the ARP (Air Raid Precautions). He served as full-time Rescue Deputy Superintendent and Chief Training Officer. His war was not without trauma as part of his role was finding and reporting UXBs (unexploded bombs) after German bombing raids, meaning he was also one of the first to deal with casualties.

The VE newspaper is one of many documents in a tin trunk that I inherited from him which have given me a fascinating insight into what was happening nationally and especially his part in it.

VE Day celebrated at Northend Gardens



To mark VE Day, Howard Harding of Northend Gardens set up a marquee in his garden full of English, French, German, American and Japanese military memorabilia.

The main display told the epic story of World War II heroine Violette Szabo, the Anglo-French spy. She was recruited after her husband, Étienne, a French Foreign Legion (FFL) officer, was killed at El Alamein. Violette accomplished two missions behind enemy lines but was captured, tortured and taken to Ravensbrück concentration camp, where she was executed three days before the war ended. She was posthumously awarded the George Cross for bravery.

Ex Royal Observer Corps and a well-known reenactor, Howard wore a genuine World War II FFL uniform for the event, and showed not only his vast range of artefacts but also his extensive knowledge of military history. Sherston Living Churchyard: Creating a haven for wildlife







Saturday 3 May was yet another beautiful, sunny day for the volunteers who gathered to work in the churchyard. The area continues to look particularly attractive this year, with the meadow wildflowers starting to appear. Dry weather and a good turnout from the Community Payback team mean that the grass has been mowed and strimmed regularly, and we have been able to maintain the grass areas following our Management Plan.

Following the visit by Mary Hinton of Hogwards in Tetbury, part of the local Help a Hedgehog Hospital group, to assess the suitability of the churchyard as a place to release rescued hedgehogs, our churchyard was judged to be an ideal place for them to live. Two were indeed introduced to their new home one evening last month. On 10 May – today as I write this - Malmesbury and District Natural History Society are carrying out a Bioblitz in the churchyard. This will attempt to record as much of the wildlife there as possible. Hedgehog tunnels with cameras were put in place last weekend in preparation for this event so we may be able to see how the hedgehogs are faring. Generally, they are secretive and not always easy to see - except, sadly, when flattened on our roads.

Slow worms have also been seen in the churchyard over the last month. Commonly mistaken for snakes, they are actually a species of legless lizard. They are a beautiful golden-bronze colour, females with a dark stripe down their backs and males sometimes with blue spots. If you are lucky, you may see one basking in your garden, especially if you have a traditional open compost heap. The move to plastic bins for compost has reduced one of their favourite places to live. They are also preyed on by cats so, if you have one, you're unlikely to see a slow worm around your garden. Like so much wildlife, slow worms need our help to survive in a world we are making difficult for them to live in





Improved acoustics at the Scout Hut




After many years of talking about it, we're pleased to share that a new acoustic ceiling has recently been installed in Sherston Scout Hut!




