Events will start on Monday 7 July leading up to the big day on Saturday 12 July, with the fun continuing until Sunday 13 July.

Entries for the Boules competition are now closed but, even if you're not playing, there's lots happening on the day: the High Street will be buzzing with food tents, live music and a host of stalls, and there will be children's activities at the village hall and field.

If you have spare time early on the Saturday or at the end of the day, we'd really appreciate some help setting up the High Street, as well as with the clean-up once the matches wind down - even if you're stuffed full of crêpes and Pimm's!

#### Raffle and ducks

Raffle board squares will be available to buy from The Rattlebone and will also be for sale outside Sherston Co-op on Saturday 5 July and Saturday 12 July. Ducks for the duck race (to be held on Sunday 13 July - see below) will be on sale outside the Co-op from 9.00am-12noon on Sunday 29 June, Saturday 5 July and Sunday 6 July, and all day on the High Street on Boules Day.

#### The Big Day: Saturday 12 July

The 2025 Boules Tournament starts at 8.30am, with all matches being played on the High Street. The Plate competition will be open to all first-round losers and will have its own Plate Control to supervise games.

Located at the village hall and field, this year's Family Zone is set to be bigger and brighter than ever. New for 2025, the Friends of Sherston School will be hosting a professional children's entertainer and a programme of magic shows and fun science sessions. If you're after something a bit different, there will also be a mix of giant garden games to choose from. See centre-spread programme for full details.

Sherston Guides will be running a clay modelling table until mid-afternoon.

In addition, Sherston's very own hair and beauty



salon, Shear Class, will be adding a touch of glamour and sparkle to the day, offering hair braiding, face painting and nail art.

For another fabulous new addition this year, head over to The Rattlebone to the Flash Fox Photo Booth. This charming, vintage-style booth offers a fun way to capture the day's memories - whether posing with boules-themed props or simply enjoying a spontaneous snap, it's a great opportunity to take home a personal memento of the festivities!

Back by popular demand, there will be live music in the afternoon on the High Street from singersongwriter O'rael, with classic soul and Motown tunes.

#### Boules Day for the foodies

What would Boules Day be without great food and drink? Set yourself up with breakfast baps and wraps at the pub before filling up on further delicious offerings : head to the French café for bacon sandwiches, filled baguettes, tea, coffee and pastries, grab a wood-fired pizza at The Rattlebone, or hit the High Street BBQ for good old burgers and sausages, not forgetting the crêperie with a range of sweet and savoury crêpes.

## Calling all patients of the Tolsey Surgery - we need your support!





Following on from last month's front-page article and campaigning by myself and Cllr Martin Smith, the petition to 'save our surgery' now has 500 signatures. But we need more - a lot more.

There are over 3,000 patients registered at the surgery. If you are one of the 2,500+ who haven't

yet signed the petition, now is the time to act! The petition is available online at www.rozsavage.uk/ campaigns/sherston-surgery, with hard copies in the Co-op and in The Tolsey Surgery itself.



If you have already signed the petition, please encourage everyone you know in the area to do so too.

Without significant pressure from patients and residents, both in Sherston and in the surrounding area, there is now a very real possibility that Sherston (and its patients) will be left without a surgery within the next two years.

We all need to take ownership of this. It's far too risky to sit back and just assume everyone else will sign - all it takes is two minutes of your time. We need our voices to be heard.

Our local MP, Roz Savage, will be leading the drive on Boules Day (Saturday 12 July) to increase the number of signatures on the petition.

Come on ... if we all pull together, we can do this and make a lasting difference to our local community.

# Don't miss the deadline! Lime Down Solar Park targeted consultation ends soon

Friday 11 July is the deadline for the targeted consultation by Island Green Green Power, the company behind the proposed Lime Down Solar Park development, which started on Tuesday 3 June.

It specifically focuses on amendments to the development boundary outlined during the previous consultation (Jan-March 2025), and on a preferred cable route search corridor.

The company expects to submit its application to the Planning Inspectorate later this year. A decision as to whether it goes ahead will subsequently be made by the secretary of state.

## Author and campaigner, Jonathan Bryan, dies aged 19

As many of you may have heard, Jonathan Bryan died last month on 5 June. Jonathan lived in Stanton St Quintin, and was the son of Sherston's previous vicar, Christopher Bryan. He regularly attended the parish church in the village.

Jonathan was born following a road traffic accident and lived with significant disabilities throughout his life. Unable to speak, he learnt to communicate by looking at letters on a spelling board and at the age of 12 published his memoir, *Eye Can Write*. His royalties went towards the charity he founded, Teach Us Too.

Jonathan campaigned throughout his life for all children to be taught to read and write regardless of their educational label or disability. He was a member of the Department for Education's youth SEND advisory board and spoke at a number of ministerial roundtables. Teach Us Too provides training to equip teachers to teach literacy to students with complex needs. It's Jonathan's legacy.

During his lifetime, Jonathan received various awards including a Diana Legacy Award, a Prime Minister's Point of Light, and the Archbishop of Canterbury's Alphege Award for Evangelism and Witness. A committed Christian, Jonathan often



#### Building work and updates

You may have noticed that there has been scaffolding in the church since the beginning of the year. This is so that we could repair the damage from Storm Darragh in November 2024. The old ceiling in part of the nave was removed, new lathes installed and the ceiling replastered. Our thanks to the team from Wheatley Plasterwork, Silkwood Decorating Services, and J W Walker & Sons. We'll soon be removing the scaffolding and re-tuning the organ, which has been covered to protect it from the dust.

Despite the ongoing work, we have been very much open over the past few months. Sherston School visited us during their recent activity week, which was based on world religions. The children explored many parts of the church and discovered some of the history of this ancient building.

The scaffolding has not stopped us having a full range of services, including baptisms and our joint services with the other churches in the Gauzebrook Group.

Chris Gough kindly repainted the front doors to spruce up the church in time for VE Day, which we marked with a well-attended memorial service. Our Thursday café had a patriotic theme complete with a special VE Day cake. In the evening, the bells rang out

to commemorate the 80th anniversary of VE Day, and the church tower was lit up by the beacon at sunset. Thank you to Kevin Noble and his team who lit the beacon to mark this important occasion, and to those who consistently help to support the church and community throughout the year.



#### A farewell ... and a warm welcome!

As we say goodbye and thank you to Reverend Sharon Gleed, our wonderful curate for the past three years, we are delighted to welcome Reverend Steve Wilkinson, who has been appointed interim priest in charge of the Gauzebrook Group to support us for the next year. Steve joins us from the Woodbridge Group, just the other side of Malmesbury, and his recent work to establish the Athelstan Pilgrim Trail has already brought many visitors into our church, including the children who come looking for Bones, our resident dog.

## Sherston Living Churchyard: BioBlitz results

On Saturday 10 May, Malmesbury & District Natural History Society (MDNHS) held its annual BioBlitz in Sherston Churchyard. Trail cameras, hedgehog footprint tunnels and reptile mats were set up in advance; hedgehogs were found to be present in wild areas near both the east and west walls, and a fox cub was caught on camera. The team identified 21 different birds, 34 different wildflowers, plus nine different grasses, and three lichens on graves and trees. Our slow-worm hotel mat had two slow worms resident on the day, but no other reptiles were found. Just two butterfly species were seen - a holly blue and three speckled woods - and very few insects were found, possibly due to six very dry weeks leading up to the BioBlitz. MDNHS has made a few helpful suggestions as to how we can enhance the wildlife further.

Our next Working Party will be on Saturday 5 July from 9.30am to 12.00noon, when we will be clearing the Estcourt Cresswell Enclosure again, which is on a National Heritage List, to mark 200 years since his death on 5 July 1825. Please note there will be no plant stall in July or August.
