Sherston is about 5 miles from both Malmesbury and Tetbury and is very close to Westonbirt National Arboretum and the Badminton Estate. The City of Bath is 19 miles away.

Free talk! Building the Future Together: Sustainability Initiatives by your Co-op



Supermarkets in the UK get criticised over lots of issues, including unfair buying practices, targeting farmers and other suppliers, excessive use of single-use plastics, wasting food, failing to meet sustainability or climate targets, and maintaining high food prices.

In Sherston, we have our own supermarket, part of the Midcounties Co-op, a business wholly owned by its members. Have you ever wondered how your Co-op deals with issues like these? Behind the scenes, a lot of thought goes into how to run a sustainable business while keeping costs to customers down.

Sustainable Sherston is delighted to announce that Mike Pickering, Head of Sustainability at Midcounties Co-op, will give a talk on this on Thursday 5 March; 7.00pm for a 7.30pm start in the British School Room. Mike will address the Co-op's wide range of sustainability-related initiatives, such as tackling plastic and food waste, renewable energy, lowering emissions, and how they engage with their suppliers, including farmers. He will also describe some of the Co-op's work on wider issues, including nature stewardship, rain gardens and flood prevention, and discuss nature partnership opportunities. There will be a chance to ask Mike questions and to find out how you can support your Co-op in its initiatives. Mike is an engaging speaker, so do come to what promises to be an informative and interesting talk. Free entry and free refreshments, plus a raffle to win a hamper.

The surgery, Sherston Parish Council and Wiltshire Council continue to work alongside each other and will keep everyone informed of progress.

Sherston Living Churchyard



ECO CHURCH
AN A ROCHA UK PROJECT

The weather hasn't been too kind to the Living Churchyard working party so far in 2026. After a biting cold Saturday in January, we had a wet one in February. Nevertheless, seven volunteers came along to carry out work, including more ivy clearance from trees and tombstones. The most up-to-date opinion advises that ivy should not be pulled off memorial stones as it tends to remove a layer of the stone to which it has been clinging. In turn, this can pull away inscriptions and carved decoration. The idea is to cut through the stems of the ivy at ground level, remove a section of the plant and leave behind the rest of it to die in situ. These remains can then protect the stonework and, at the same time, offer refuge to overwintering insects and even small birds.

Despite the extraordinarily wet weather, spring flowers are beginning to open in the churchyard. There were a few primroses in January and they have now been joined by snowdrops, violets and daffodils. Some of these are native daffodils which were planted last year. These are still found growing wild in a few parts of England. An area in Gloucestershire called the Golden Triangle between Newent, Dymock and Kempley near the Forest of Dean is renowned for its wild daffodils which are well worth going to visit in March. In the 19th and early 20th century, people flocked to this area by train from the cities - Birmingham and London - to pick armfuls of flowers and take them home to sell. For local farm workers, the daffodils provided an income at a time of year when work was scarce. Local children had time off school to help with the picking. Of course, picking native wild flowers is no longer permitted to help conserve them for future generations, but seeing the vast number of daffodils



that were available to people in Gloucestershire up to the Second World War is a salutary lesson in how our natural world has changed.

Our next working party is on Saturday 7 March from 9.30am and volunteers are very welcome. Our first plant sale of 2026 will also take place then. If you have any plants, bulbs or seedlings to donate, please bring them to the church porch from Thursday 5 March. Funds raised go to help further work in the Living Churchyard. Thank you for all your support

Holy Cross News



A big thank you to Sherston Parish Council for organising the Community Coffee Morning at the end of January. It was lovely to see so many people from the village who enjoyed the complimentary coffee and some delicious cakes, made by our volunteer bakers.

You may have noticed that this month there are no floral displays in church. This is because it is customary not to have flowers during Lent, as we prepare for Easter. Our team of flower arrangers will be back and ready for Easter Day when the church will be looking glorious, decked out with Easter Lilies and other spring flowers.

Many people like to purchase an Easter Lily as part of the displays in church, to remember someone dear to them and as a reminder of the new life promised to all of us at Easter. If you would like to do this, just complete the list inside the church. The lilies cost £6 each and need to be ordered by Sunday 22 March so that they can be looking their best for Easter Day, which this year falls on Sunday 5 April. Our Easter Day service will be at 9.30am, when the Reverend Steve Wilkinson will be celebrating Holy Communion at our all-age service.

As well as our team of flower arrangers, we have a group of volunteers who take it in turns to clean the church, and help make sure it can be opened every day. Our thanks to all who give their time and effort to care for the building. We supplement this with an annual springclean, which this year will be on Saturday 28 March, starting at 9.00am. We would love to have some more volunteers, both for the annual spring clean, and also to join the cleaning rota. If we have a good number volunteering, you'll only be needed once or twice a year.

We have other special services during Lent. Mothering Sunday is on Sunday 15 March, and the Gauzebrook Group Palm Sunday service will be on Sunday 29 March at 10.00am. On Good Friday, the quiet service of prayer and music is at 2.00pm, after which we depart at 3.00pm for our traditional walk to Luckington. There will be an open-air service at Luckington at 3.30pm with hot cross buns to enjoy afterwards.

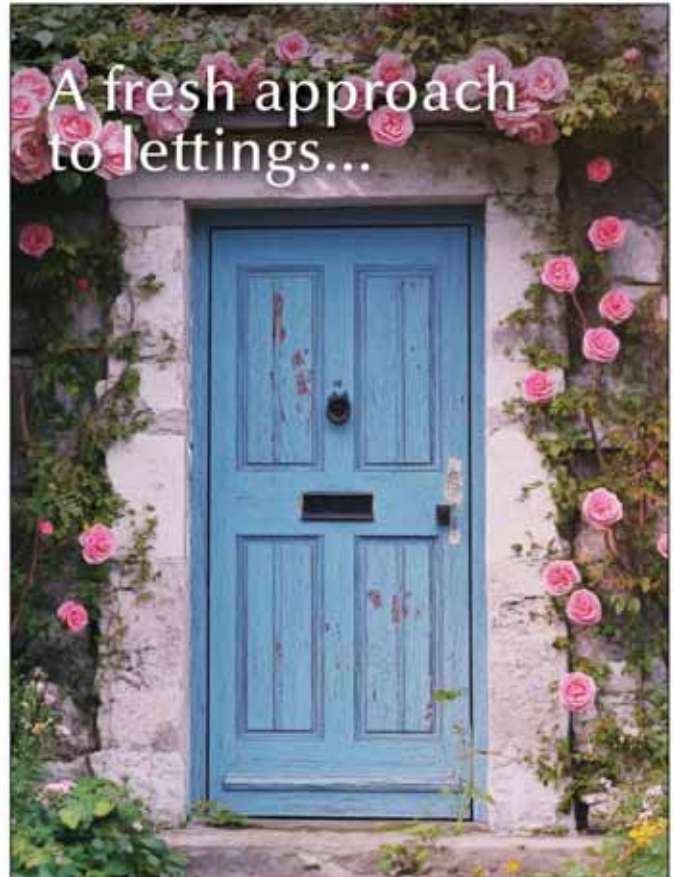

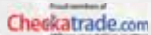
